SECTION I (U) SIGNIFICANT ORGANIZATION OR UNIT ACTIVITIES

1. (C) General:

a. The organizational structure of this battalion is as follows:

b. The battalion remained under the operational control of the 3d Marine Division during the reporting period and the positioning of units as reported in previous ORLL remains unchanged. Battery G (SLT), 29th Artillery deployed five sections of searchlights out of the 3d Marine Division TAOR. They were replaced by a USMC searchlight unit. Battery G, 29th Artillery headquarters remains at Da Nang, and its searchlight sections are supporting USMC and U.S. Army units in the I Corps Tactical Zone from Da Nang south.

c. The primary mission of the battalion continues to be that of direct ground support of 3d Marine Division elements as announced in the last ORLL. The battalion maintains its capability to perform its air defense mission as a secondary role.

2. (C) Intelligence:

The battalion continued to participate in the 3d Marine Division intelligence programs. The Battalion S2 attended daily intelligence briefings conducted by the 3d Marine Division (FWD) and conducted a daily intelligence briefing for the battalion staff and batteries located at the Dong Ha Combat Base. Battery D located at Phu Bai obtained its daily intelligence summaries and briefings from the 4th Marine Regiment, while Battery C at Camp J.J. Carroll obtained its intelligence by attending 3d Marine Regiment briefings. The Battalion S2 also forwarded pertinent intelligence to Batteries C and D. Personnel of the battalion continued to perform daylight patrols outside Sector II of the Dong Ha Combat Base. Personnel manning M42's and M55's that provided security for engineer personnel working on roads in the area often established contact with the civilian populace. On several occasions they obtained reports of enemy positions and planned artillery/mortar attacks. These reports were passed to the supported Marine units for action. There was a general increase in enemy activity in the area from Dong Ha to the DMZ during the past quarter. The enemy mounted coordinated mortar, rocket, and artillery attacks against U.S. and GVN bases to divert attention from true objectives. In early May battalion-sized ground attacks were launched concurrently at Quang Tri and Con Thien. The enemy continued his H & I artillery program against Con Thien and the Provisional Artillery Battalion at Gio Linh. Dong Ha Combat Base came under heavy nighttime attacks, and in July for the first time, the base received H & I fires during daylight hours. Agent reports, observed muzzle flashes, and electronic equipment have determined the position of the enemy artillery pieces to be approximately 8-10KM northwest of the Dong Ha Combat Base. This attests to the ability of the enemy to move large artillery weapons well south of the DMZ and to keep them well concealed and camouflaged from friendly forces. Based on the above, it is conceivable that the enemy could launch ground attacks on friendly units in the area supported by artillery from both north and south of the DMZ. Aircraft supporting Marine ground forces were also fired upon by surface-to-air missiles as far south as Dong Ha. An increase of enemy sightings was reported at almost every point and sizeable engagements fought north of Con Thien indicated increased enemy infiltration through the DMZ. Enemy attempts to interdict Route 1 with artillery shells being used as mines, in addition to the standard Soviet and Chicom products, continued. In late July, a spoiled enemy ambush between Ca Lu and Khe Sanh on Route 9 indicated that the enemy still has the ability to conduct well planned and thorough ambushes of motor convoys in forces up to regimental size.

3. (C) Operations and Training Activities:

(2) During the reporting period, perimeter defense of Dong Ha Combat Base was provided by M42 weapons of Batteries A and B; perimeter defense of Camp J.J. M55 weapons of Battery G, 65th Artillery were utilized daily primarily for convoy security escorts throughout the I Corps Tactical Zone in support of USMC operations.

(3) The battalion and attached units were engaged in tactical operations daily throughout the reporting period (92 days). c. Training:

(1) Regulation Number 350-1, Headquarters, 1st Battalion (AW)(SP) 44th Artillery, was published 11 July 1967. The purpose of the regulation is to provide guidance to units of this battalion on planning, conducting, and supervising the military training of all assigned and attached personnel.

(2) The majority of the daily training program (92 days) was concentrated on OJT at the section and squad level due to the influx of new personnel under the infusion program. Although these personnel were transferred from a similar type unit, the efficiency of the units was somewhat impaired until the crews had ample opportunity to train together as a team.

(3) The requirement for squad and section level training was also necessary due to the wide dispersion of battery elements throughout the I Corp Tactical Zone. There has been no time when an entire battery has been together to allow for battery size classes.

(4) A training program has been set up at battery level to allow new personnel from CONUS to become integrated into the unit operation prior to their commitment to actual combat situation.

d. Chemicals: 3d MARDIV directed that personnel deployed to field locations would be required to have individual protective masks in their possession at all times. There have been reports of possible enemy use of chemical irritant agents in this tactical area. Proper fitting and testing of protective masks is stressed in the unit training program.

e. PSYWAR: The battalion continued its Reward Program in accordance with 3d Marine Division Order 7230.1 dated 6 February 1967. Leaflets and posters obtained through USMC channels were distributed to the civilian populace by M42 and M55 crews providing security along primary road nets in the area. In addition, battalion personnel on patrols carry leaflets and posters that are shown to Vietnamese civilians encouraging them to reveal the location of enemy mines and booby traps. During the reporting period, a total of VN\$1080 was paid to civilians for actual delivery of explosives.

4. (C) Logistics: Logistic support and maintenance during the reporting period have greatly improved. However, some maintenance support problems continue to exist and have hampered the tactical mission of the battalion. Many pieces of signal communication equipment have been lost in support maintenance channels. Repair parts, particularly for the M42 weapons system, continue to be in short supply.

5. (C) Civil Affairs:

a. Dai An Hamlet (YD 270590)

The battalion has actively supported a pig cooperative project for the hamlet by preparing plans and supplying materials for a shelter 16 X 40 feet, capable of housing 110 pigs. Local villagers accomplished all manual labor on the construction of the shelter, and it is near completion. In addition, the battalion obtained nine (9) forty pound pigs from the 29th CA Company in Da Nang for delivery to the villagers to supplement their existing stock. The pigs are being fed from mess hall waste delivered daily by the battalion to the hamlet.

b. During the quarterly reporting period, the battalion employed 10-20 local nationals daily from Ha Thanh (YD 220699) refugee hamlet for the purpose of filling sand bags for bunkers and gun positions. These laborers were paid with USAID commodities under the supervision of the Battalion Executive Officer.

on sweeping operations can make several changes of position to prevent the enemy from getting them within accurate mortar and artillery range. The rapid fire of the M42 will generally cause the enemy to break contact.

3. (C) Training and Organization:

Items: Qualification of newly assigned personnel.

Discussion: Replacement personnel are being assigned to the unit as M42 and M55 crew members, with very little or no training on this equipment.

Observations: Individuals arriving in Vietnam from CONUS must be given transition training by the battalion prior to being assigned to a crew. However, personnel and equipment are not always available to train large groups of replacement personnel.

4. (C) Intelligence:

Items: On 22 July 1967, a NVA force ambushed an engineer work party vic XD 9743, preparing the road for movement of an artillery battery.

Discussion: Booby traps were set up about 30 meters apart on both sides of the road for a distance of 1500 meters. The only road exit from the "kill zone" was blocked by command detonated mines. Shape charges were attached to trees on both sides of the road at the same height as the turret of the M42 vehicles acting as escort. At the entrance to the area a pyramid of sticks was observed along the roadside with its apex pointed toward the ambush area.

Observations: The enemy is able to utilize his intelligence concerning movement of priority forces and the capability of our escort weapons to execute large scale ambushes. Friendly forces must remain alert to these capabilities and train personnel on the detection of possible signs of enemy activity.

5. (C) Logistics:

Items: A central issue facility should be established at the 1st Logistical Command Task Force located at the Dong Ha Combat Base.

Discussions: Two sections of M42's providing convoy security escort for Marine 105mm towed artillery on the road to Con Thien were subjected to a NVA mortar attack. The weather was extremely adverse, and the dirt road was a mire of mud. Wheeled vehicles towing four artillery pieces were disabled by the enemy activity. The howitzers were attached to the towing pintle of the M42 and towed over difficult terrain to their destination.

Observations: The M42 can maneuver in isolated and rough terrain. The eyelet of a 105mm howitzer will fit the towing pintle on the M42. If the prime mover of a towed howitzer breaks down, an M42 can be used in an emergency to tow the howitzer.

b. Item: The M42 employed as a countermortar weapon.

Discussions: Two squads of M42's were assigned perimeter defense mission of the Khe Sanh airstrip. The base was subjected to an enemy rocket and mortar attack. The enemy's 82mm mortars were emplaced within range of the M42's. When muzzle flashes were sighted at a distance of approximately 3000 meters, the M42's quickly returned a voluminous rate of fire and neutralized the mortar positions.

Observations: The M42 is an extremely effective direct support weapon when employed within its range capabilities. If the crews are diligent and observe flashes immediately, they can adjust tracer ammunition and place a devastating volume of fire on enemy positions. The M42 can effectively neutralize enemy mortar positions not in defilade within 3500 meters range.

c. Item: The M42 employed as a ground support weapon on sweep and clear operations.

Discussions: Four M42's provided close fire support for infantry and engineer elements for one month during clearing of a firebreak along the DMZ. The thick vegetation restricted visibility and caused the 40mm HE rounds to detonate before they reached the enemy positions. However, when placed on high ground with good visibility, the 40mm fire was accurate and effective in neutralizing enemy positions.

Observations: M42's, if at all possible, should keep out of dense foliage. If they must enter into these areas, infantry should screen the front and flanks of the M42 employing tank-infantry tactics. Firing sites should always have good visibility and command of the terrain. M42's

This battalion establishes liaison with each supported unit to insure there is an understanding of the proper employment of the automatic weapons system in the ground support role.

3. (C) Training and Operations: Recommend the AIT program for automatic weapons crews place special emphasis on the ground support role to include countermortar fire, perimeter defense, and infantry supported operations. This unit gives individuals arriving in Vietnam from CONUS transition training prior to their participation in combat operations.

4. (C) Intelligence: Recommend intelligence training on enemy capabilities and employment be integrated into each unit training schedule.
