FOREWORD

This bibliography concerns music in both its entertainment and military sense. Considered in either way, music has provided much support for Esprit de Corps in many important ways. Arrangement of this list is by author in three parts. First, books containing dictionary, narrative-type coverage are indicated. This background material includes all but the actual musical score. Next, come books which contain still more theoretical or historical data including words and/or music. The exact number of such items is indicated under the Library of Congress Classification Number on the left-hand side of the individual entry. Finally, periodical articles from various United States military publications are presented. Their subject usually deals with a particular song as suggested by the article title.

Throughout emphasis is on developments basic to U.S. music. If of a general nature the various items have been catalogued in the "M - Music and Books on Music," portion of the collection. If they apply to specific military branches or units the "UZ - Minor Services" part of the military science schedule is used.

Inclusion of an item or omission does not imply USAFAS indorsement or sanction of the compiler's point-of-view nor does it guarantee accuracy of content. Comment and criticism concerning this list is solicited.
