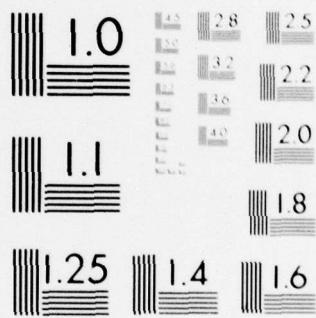

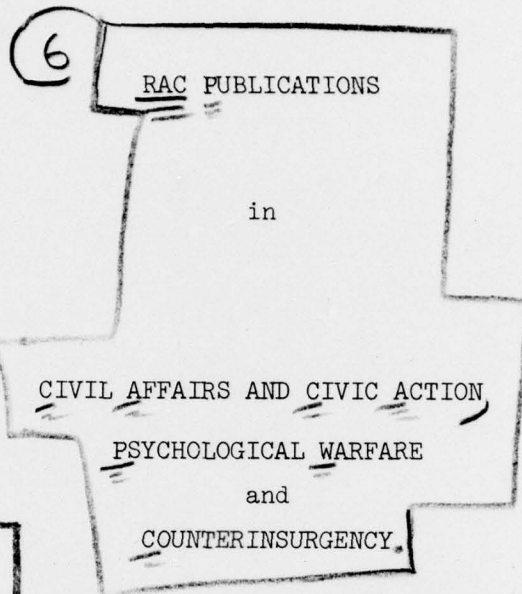

FOREWORD
