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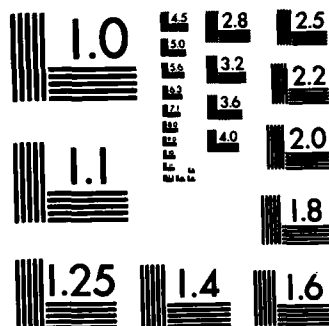

The materials consist of books, reports, and serial items. Selection is from the holdings of the Morris Swett library, USAFAS.			

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FOREWORD

This entry in the Morris Swett Library Special Bibliography Series presents materials written by or about the activities of the 5 U.S. Army 4-Star General Officers who attained 5-Star General of the Army rank during WWII. This was made possible by an Act of Congress on December 14, 1944.

The 5-Star designation was first conferred on LTG Ulysses S. Grant by a 1866 Act of Congress. LTG William T. Sherman was second to be appointed to the grade when the LTG designation was discontinued in 1869. The rank was retired at the time of his death in 1891 and reinstated in 1944. The designation is not the same as General of Armies of U.S. This rank was created in 1799, discontinued in 1802, and reestablished on September 3, 1919 in honor of General John J. Pershing. No other officer has been accorded this honor although only the 4-Star rank insignia was authorized, not 6 as had been suggested.

This number is arranged alphabetically and covers Generals of the Army: Arnold, Army Air Force Branch; Bradley; Eisenhower, MacArthur, and Marshall. With the exception of Bradley who attained the rank in 1950 the others were promoted with the same date of rank.

This library reserves Library of Congress classification and author numbers for them under U.S. History, as follows:

The "E" class has been selected due to their long involvement in many activities unlike the "U53" which is reserved for U.S. generals associated with mainly one-war periods.

This number is arranged alphabetically in parts as indicated by the Table of Contents. Selection has been made from the book stock and periodicals collection of the Morris Swett Library, USAFAS. Inclusion of an item, or omission - due to the many possible sources involved, especially regarding Eisenhower and MacArthur - neither implies USAFAS indorsement or sanction of the compiler's point-of-view.
