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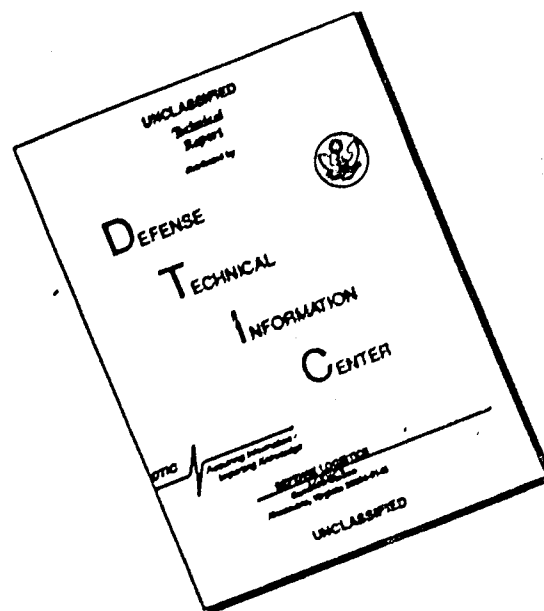
20. ABSTRACT (Continue on reverse side if necessary and identify by block number)

Research was performed to develop tank gunnery sustainment training materials for M60A3 armor crewmembers. This research product consists of 6 booklets for use by tank commanders in maintaining their knowledge and skill in issuing basic fire commands. The first booklet (RP 83-01A) provides an overview of fire command knowledges and contains training notes. The remaining five booklets provide practice in: classifying threats (RP 83-01B); selecting ammo/weapons (RP 83-01C); sequencing fire command elements (RP 83-01D); issuing fire commands for single engagements (RP 83-01E); and issuing fire commands for multiple and (continued)

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simultaneous engagements (RP 83-01F).

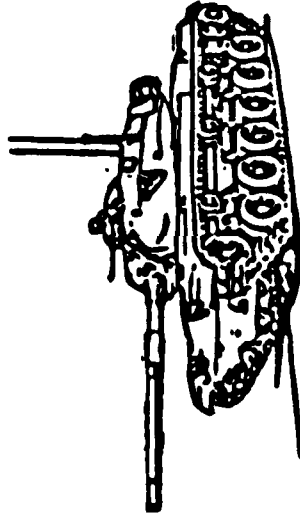

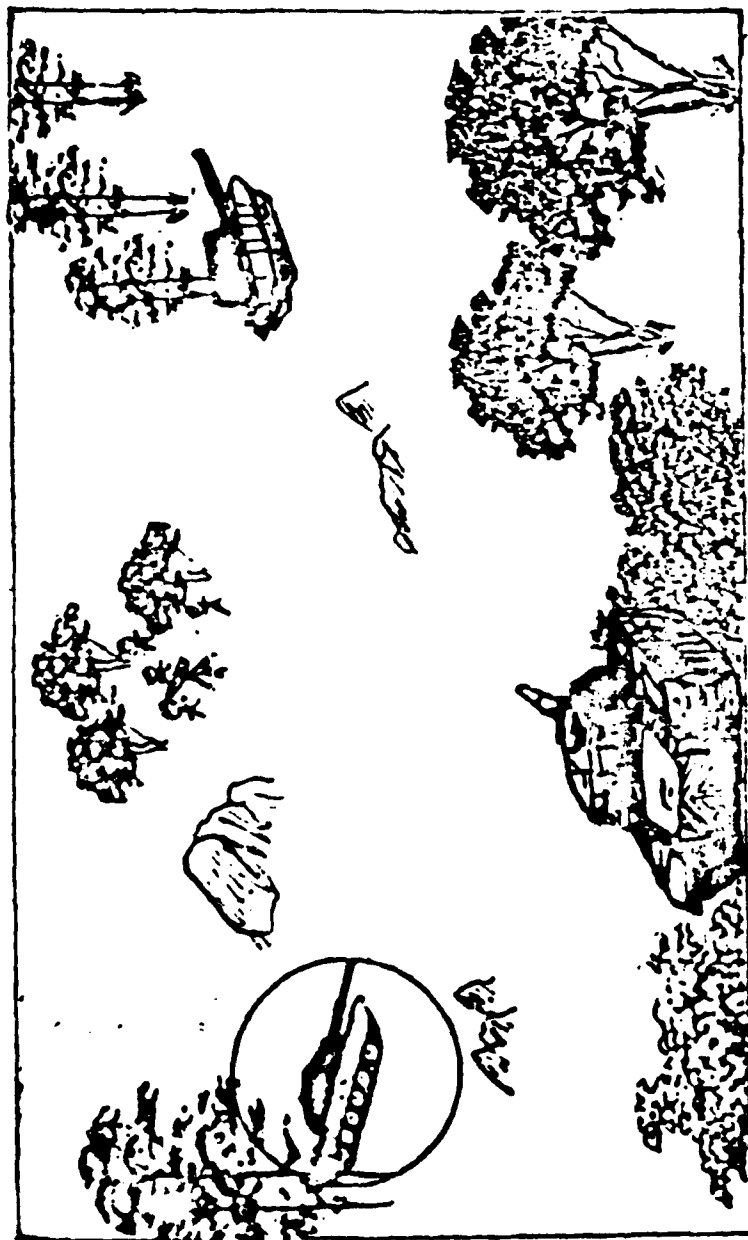

SCENARIO 1



THE SITUATION

- Almost direct front is a T-12A antitank gun, range more than 3000 meters.

How should the T-72 be classified?

SCENARIO 1 ANSWER

The correct answer is A: MOST DANGEROUS threat.

The T-72 is a MOST DANGEROUS threat because:

- It can kill you
- It sees you
- It is preparing to engage you

WRONG ANSWERS

B. T-72 has seen you.

C. T-72 can kill you.

SCENARIO 2



THE SITUATION (same as before)

- You are in a bounding overwatch, halted.
- M60A3 is fully operational.
- Round loaded is SABOT.
- A T-72 is off to your left, range 1700 meters.
- A 122mm self propelled howitzer is to your right, range 2500 meters.
- Almost direct front is a T-12A antitank gun, range more than 3000 meters.
- The T-72 has seen you.
- The howitzer and antitank gun have not seen you.

How should the 122m howitzer be classified?

The correct answer is B: DANGEROUS THREAT

C. It can kill you.

How should the T-12A be classified?

SCENARIO 3 ANSWER

You should have selected B: DANGEROUS THREAT

The antitank gun is a DANGEROUS THREAT because it:

- Can kill you
- Has not seen you, or
- Is not preparing to engage you

WRONG ANSWERS

- A. It has not seen you.
- B. It can kill you.

SCENARIO 4



THE SITUATION (same as before)

- You are in a bounding overwatch, halted.
- M60A3 is fully operational.
- Round loaded is SABOT.
- A T-72 is off to your left, range 1700 meters.
- A 122mm self propelled howitzer is to your right, range 2500 meters.
- Almost direct front is a T-12A antitank gun, range more than 3000 meters.
- The T-72 has seen you.
- The howitzer and antitank gun have not seen you.

What is this kind of engagement called?

SCENARIO 4 ANSWERS

You should have selected A: Multiple target

This is a multiple target engagement because the main gun will be used against more than one target.

WRONG ANSWERS

- B. TC will not be engaging a target with the CAL. 50 because they are out of range while gunner fires main gun.
- C. There is more than one target.
- D. This describes the target, not the engagement.

SCENARIO 5



THE SITUATION (same as before)

- You are in a bounding overwatch, halted.
- M60A3 is fully operational.
- Round loaded is SABOT.
- A T-72 is off to your left, range 1700 meters.
- A 122mm self propelled howitzer is to your right, range 2500 meters.
- Almost direct front is a T-12A antitank gun, range more than 3000 meters.
- The T-72 has seen you.
- The howitzer and antitank gun have not seen you.

Which threat must you engage first?

(No choices this time. You have to figure out this one.)

SCENARIO 5 ANSWER

The correct answer is: The MOST DANGEROUS threat

The MOST DANGEROUS threat is always engaged first. In this situation, the MOST DANGEROUS threat is the T-72.

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SCENARIO 6



THE SITUATION (same as before)

- You are in a bounding overwatch, halted.
- M60A3 is fully operational.
- Round loaded is SABOT.
- A T-72 is off to your left, range 1700 meters.
- A 122mm self propelled howitzer is to your right, range 2500 meters.
- Almost direct front is a T-12A antitank gun, range more than 3000 meters.
- The T-72 has seen you.
- The howitzer and antitank gun have not seen you.

What is your fire command against the MOST DANGEROUS threat?

(Assume a first round hit.)

SCENARIO 6 ANSWER

The correct fire command is:

TC: GUNNER
SABOT
TANK

Loader: UP

Gunner: IDENTIFIED
LASING

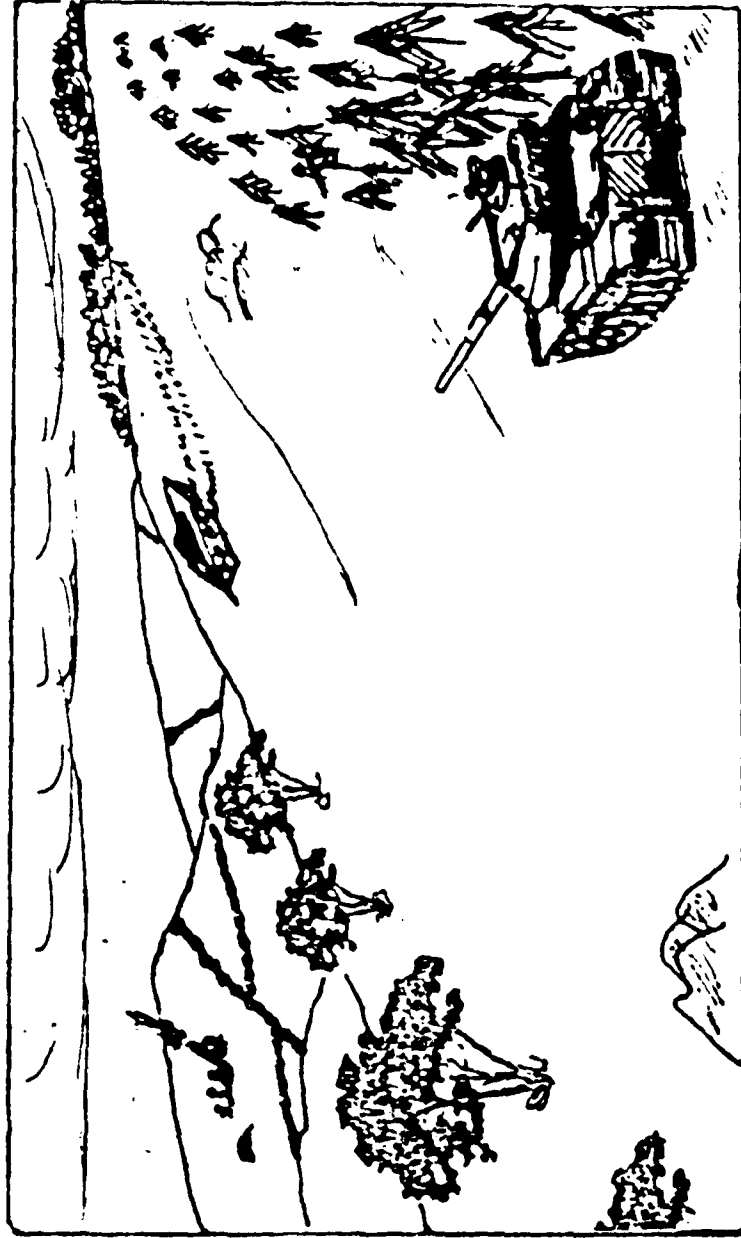
TC: FIRE

Gunner: ON THE WAY
TARGET

TC: TARGET, CEASE FIRE

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SCENARIO 7



THE SITUATION

- You are in a deliberate attack, moving.
- Your mission is to destroy enemy armor.
- Round loaded is SABOT.
- You are advancing slowly, 5-8 mph.
- Your M60A3 is fully operational.
- You see a dismounted SAGGER off to your right, range 750 meters. It is ready for launch. The crew has seen you.
- There is a T-62 directly in front of you, range 1400 meters. His tube swings toward you.
- A T-12 antitank unit is providing area fire. The unit is located more than 3000 meters from you.

What target(s) is (are) classified as MOST DANGEROUS?

SCENARIO 7 ANSWERS

The correct answer is: The T-62 and the SAGGER

The T-62 and the SAGGER are both MOST DANGEROUS threats because:

- They can kill you
- They have seen you
- They are preparing to engage you

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SCENARIO 8



THE SITUATION (same as before)

- You are in a deliberate attack, moving.
- Your mission is to destroy enemy armor.
- Round loaded is SABOT
- You are advancing slowly, 5-8 mph.
- Your M60A3 is fully operational.
- You see a dismounted SAGGER off to your right, range 750 meters. It is ready for launch. The crew has seen you.
- There is a T-62 directly in front of you, range 1400 meters. His tube swings toward you.
- A T-12 antitank unit is providing area fire. The unit is located more than 3000 meters from you.

Which target(s) is(are) classified as DANGEROUS threats?

SCENARIO 8 ANSWER

The DANGEROUS threat in this scenario is the T-12 antitank gun.

The T-12 is a DANGEROUS threat because it:

- Can kill you
- Has not seen you, or
- Is not preparing to engage you

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SCENARIO 9



THE SITUATION (same as before)

- You are in a deliberate attack, moving.
- Your mission is to destroy enemy armor.
- Round loaded is SABOT.
- You are advancing slowly, 5-8 mph.
- Your M60A3 is fully operational.
- You see a dismounted SAGGER off to your right, range 750 meters. It is ready for launch. The crew has seen you.
- There is a T-62 directly in front of you, range 1400 meters. His tube swings toward you.
- A T-12 antitank unit is providing area fire. The unit is located more than 3000 meters from you.

What targets, if any, are classified as LEAST DANGEROUS threats?

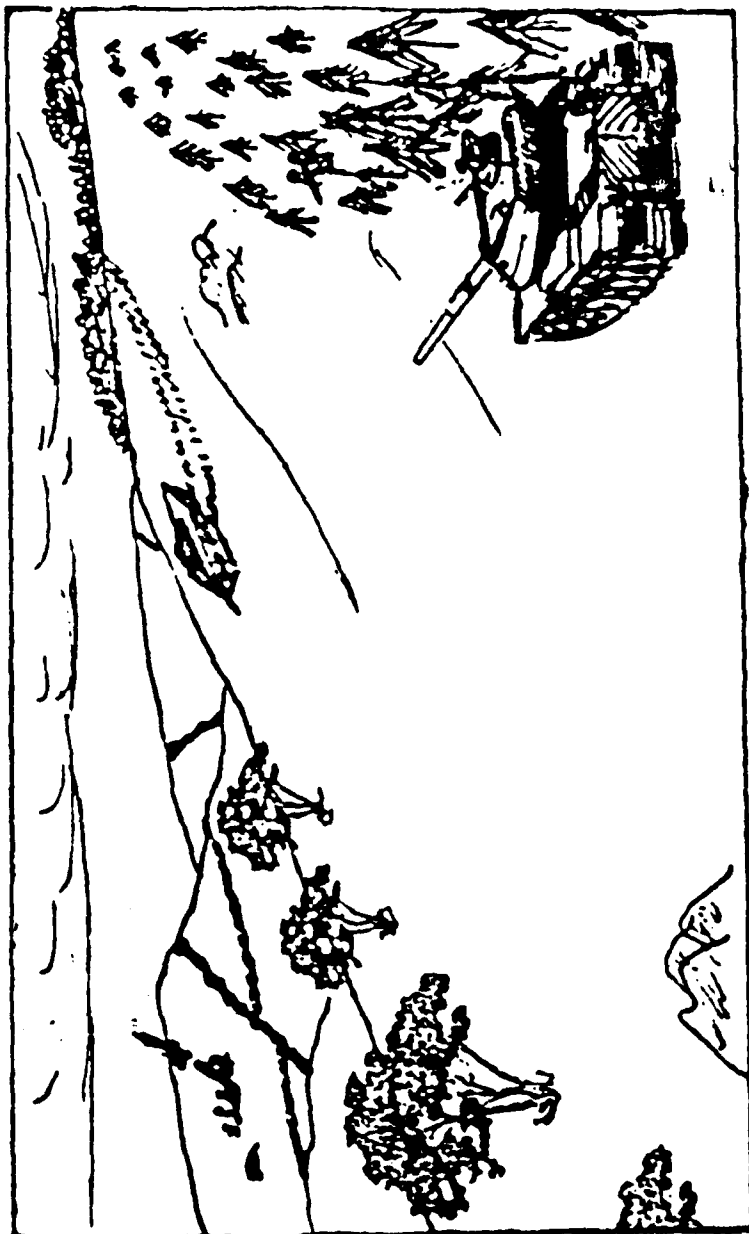
SCENARIO 9 ANSWER

None of the targets described in this situation can be classified as LEAST DANGEROUS.

All of the targets present can kill you.

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SCENARIO 10



THE SITUATION

- You are in a deliberate attack, moving.
- Your mission is to destroy enemy armor.
- Round loaded is SABOT.
- You are advancing slowly, 5-8 mph.
- Your M60A3 is fully operational.
- You see a dismounted SAGGER off to your right, range 750 meters. It is ready for launch. The crew has seen you.
- There is a T-62 directly in front of you, range 1400 meters. His tube swings toward you.
- A T-12 antitank unit is providing area fire. The unit is located more than 3000 meters from you.

What kind of engagement would this be?

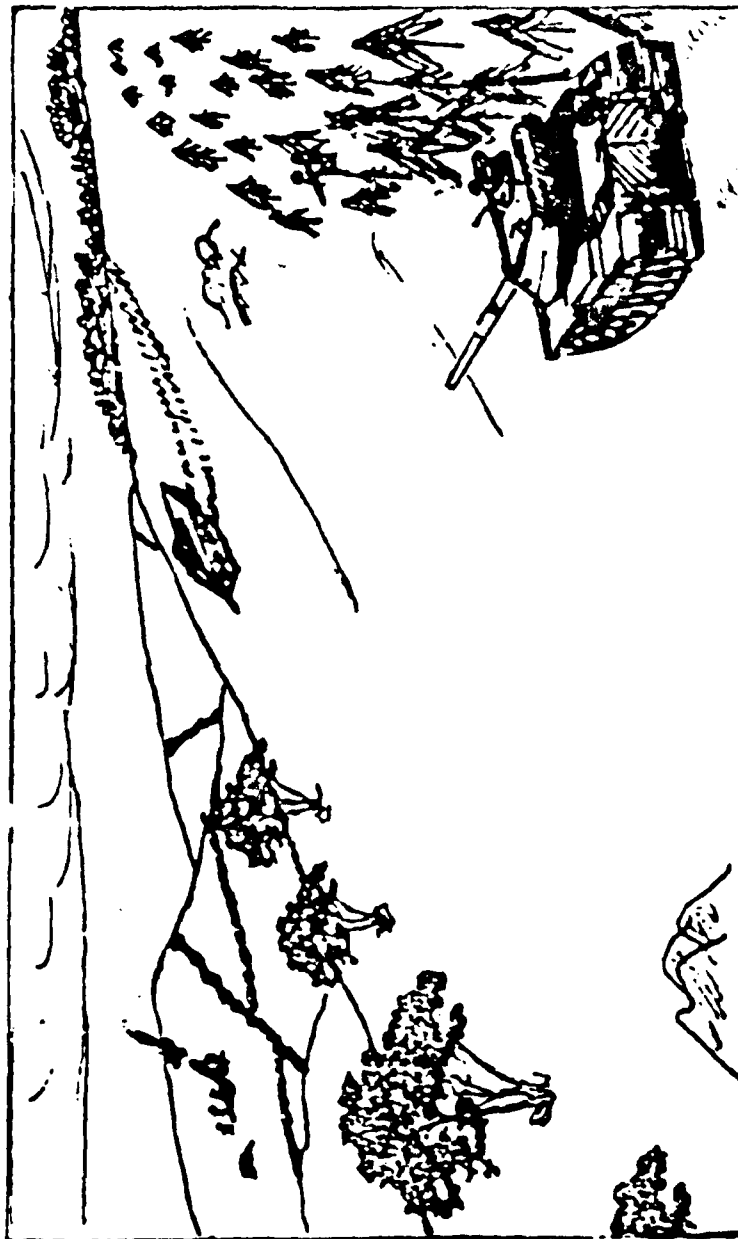
SCENARIO 10 ANSWER

This scenario would require a simultaneous engagement.

Because there are two MOST DANGEROUS threats, you must make a simultaneous engagement and destroy them both.
RIGHT AWAY!

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SCENARIO 11



THE SITUATION (same as before)

- You are in a deliberate attack, moving.
- Your mission is to destroy enemy armor.
- Round loaded is SABOT.
- You are advancing slowly, 5-8 mph.
- You see a dismounted SAGGER off to your right, range 750 meters. It is ready for launch. The crew has seen you.
- There is a T-62 directly in front of you, range 1400 meters. His tube swings toward you.
- A T-12 antitank unit is providing area fire. The unit is located more than 3000 meters from you.

What is your fire command against the MOST DANGEROUS threats?

What are the crew responses?

(Assume first round hits.)

SCENARIO 11 ANSWER

The best fire command for this simultaneous engagement is:

TC: GUNNER
SABOT
TANK

Loader: UP

Gunner: IDENTIFIED
LASING

TC: FIRE AND ADJUST, CALIBER FIFTY

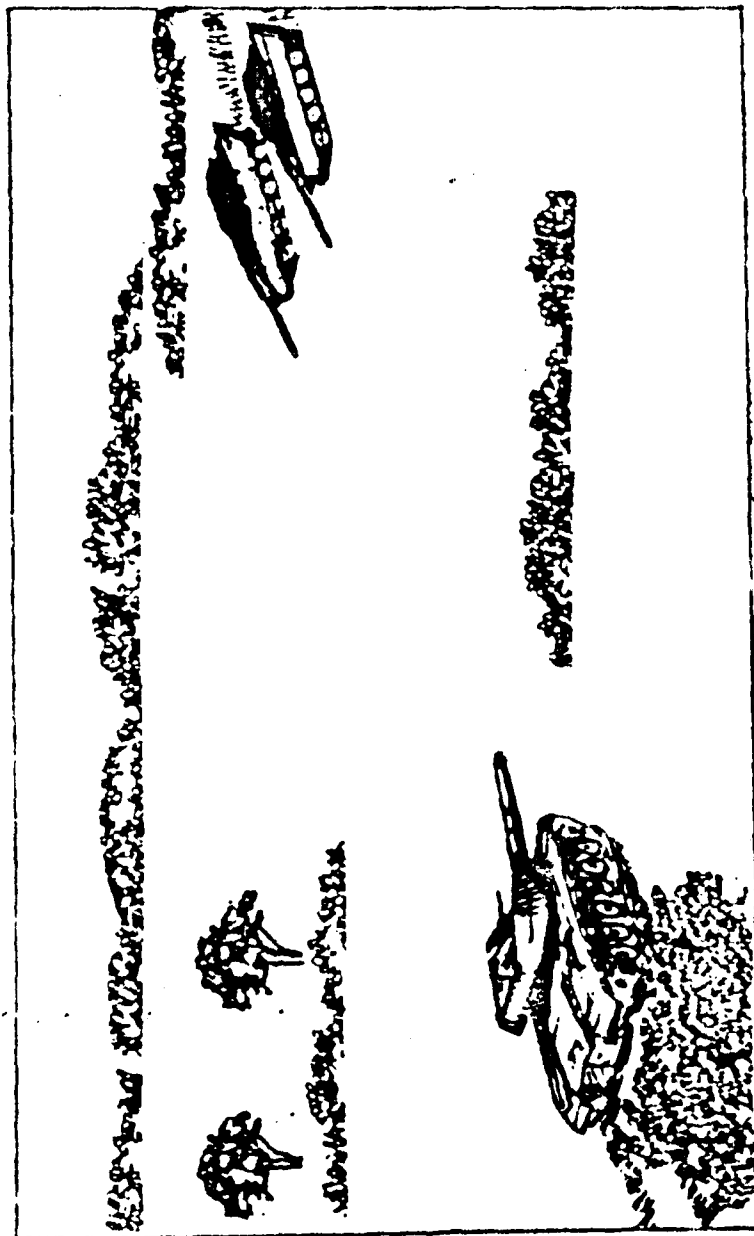
Gunner: ON THE WAY
TARGET, CEASE FIRE

Loader: UP

TC: TC COMPLETE

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SCENARIO 12



THE SITUATION

- You are in a deliberate attack, moving.
- M60A3 is fully operational.
- Round loaded is SABOT.
- You are advancing slowly, 5-8 mph.
- There are two T-72 tanks off to your right, range 1800 meters. They both see you.

What is your fire command for the entire engagement?

What are the crew responses?

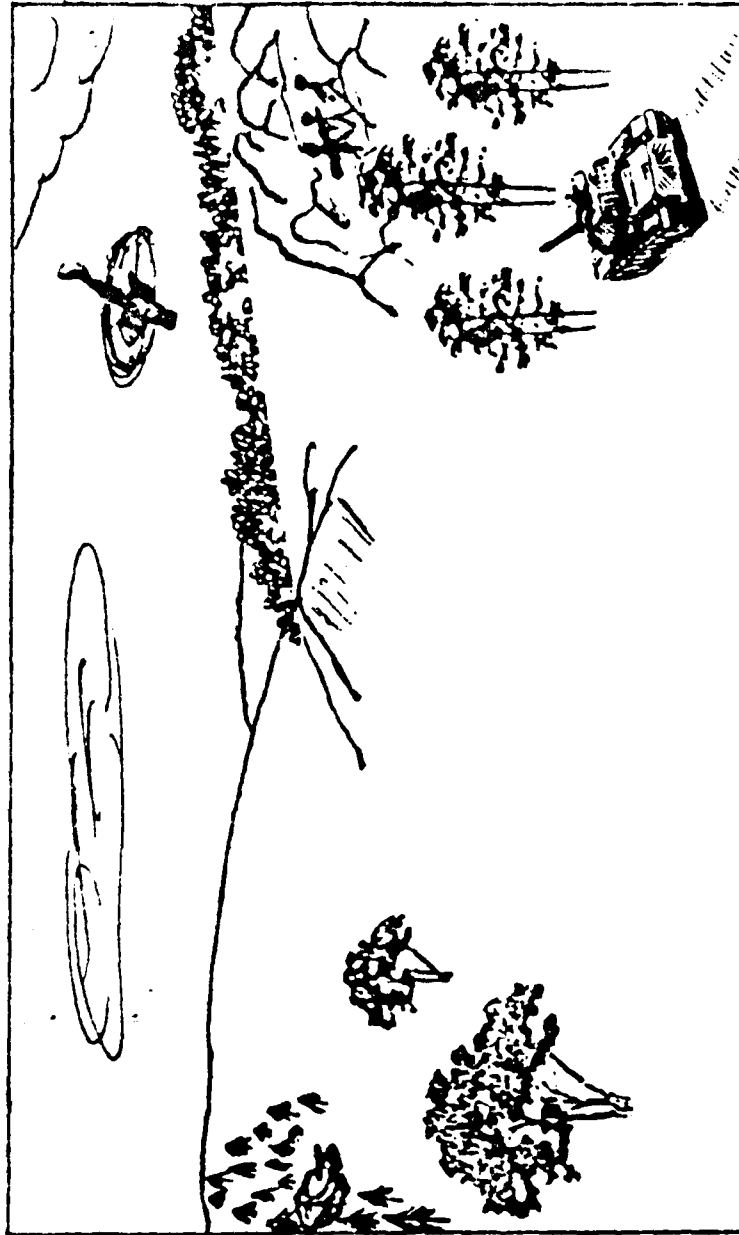
(Assume first round hits.)

SCENARIO 12 ANSWER

Both of the T-72 tanks are MOST DANGEROUS threats. You must engage one and then the other. This is a multiple engagement. In this example, the fire command is against the right tank first, then the left. It's okay if your command was against the left tank first, then the right. Since both targets are at the same range it is not necessary that the gunner lose to the second target.

TC:	GUNNER SABOT TWO TANKS, RIGHT
Loader:	UP
Gunner:	IDENTIFIED LASING
TC:	FIRE
Gunner:	ON THE WAY TARGET
Loader:	UP
TC:	TARGET, LEFT TANK
Gunner:	IDENTIFIED
TC:	FIRE
Gunner:	ON THE WAY TARGET
Loader:	UP
TC:	TARGET, CEASE FIRE

SCENARIO 13



THE SITUATION

- You are under heavy attack. Enemy forces have overrun many friendly defensive positions.
- You are trying to re-group and establish a good defensive position. You are not there yet.
- You see a 73mm recoilless antitank gun set up in some woods off to your right. Its range is about 1000 meters. He is ready to shoot.
- A T-72 is coming through the woods off to your left, over 3000 meters away.
- A HIND helicopter with SAGGER ATGM mounted on rails comes over the tree line, sees you, and lines up for a launch.
- Round loaded is HEAT.
- M60A3 is fully operational.

What is your entire fire command?
What are the crew responses?

(Assume first round hits.)

SCENARIO 13 ANSWER

This must be a SIMULTANEOUS engagement because there are two (2) MOST DANGEROUS threats. (The HIND and 73mm recoil-less antitank gun.)

The correct fire command is:

TC: GUNNER
HEAT
CHOPPER

Loader: UP

Gunner: IDENTIFIED
LASING

TC: FIRE AND ADJUST, CALIBER FIFTY

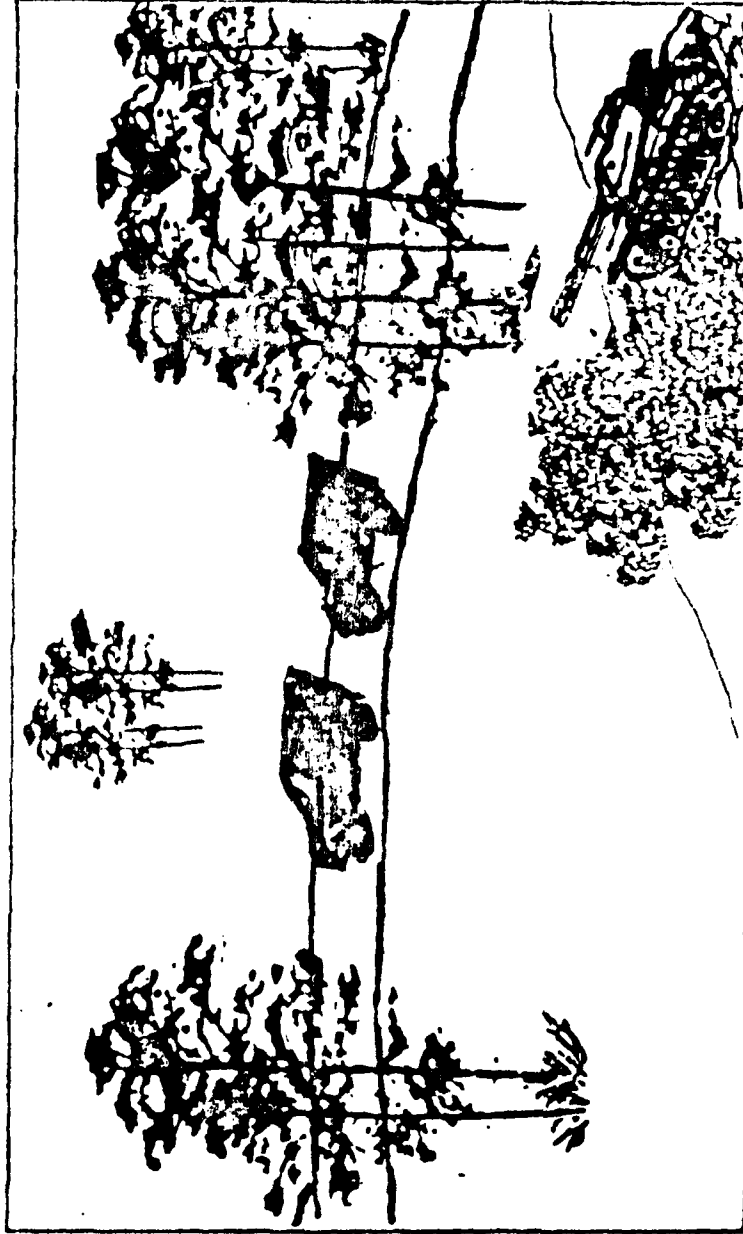
Gunner: ON THE WAY
TARGET, CEASE FIRE

Loader: UP

TC: TC COMPLETE

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SCENARIO 14



THE SITUATION

- You are in a deliberate defense.
- Your orders are to engage all hostile units.
- You are turret down, and there is a stand of trees off to your right which screens you from the road.
- M60A3 is fully operational.
- Round loaded is SABOT.
- Two trucks appear moving down the road about 800 meters away.

What are your fire commands? What are the crew responses?
(Assume first round hits.)

SCENARIO 14 ANSWER

This is a simultaneous engagement using the COAX and CAL 50. Note that the trucks are classified as LEAST DANGEROUS THREATS. However, your orders are to engage all hostile units. Your fire command should be:

TC: GUNNER
COAX

TWO MOVING TRUCKS, FIRST TRUCK

Loader: UP

Gunner: IDENTIFIED
LASING

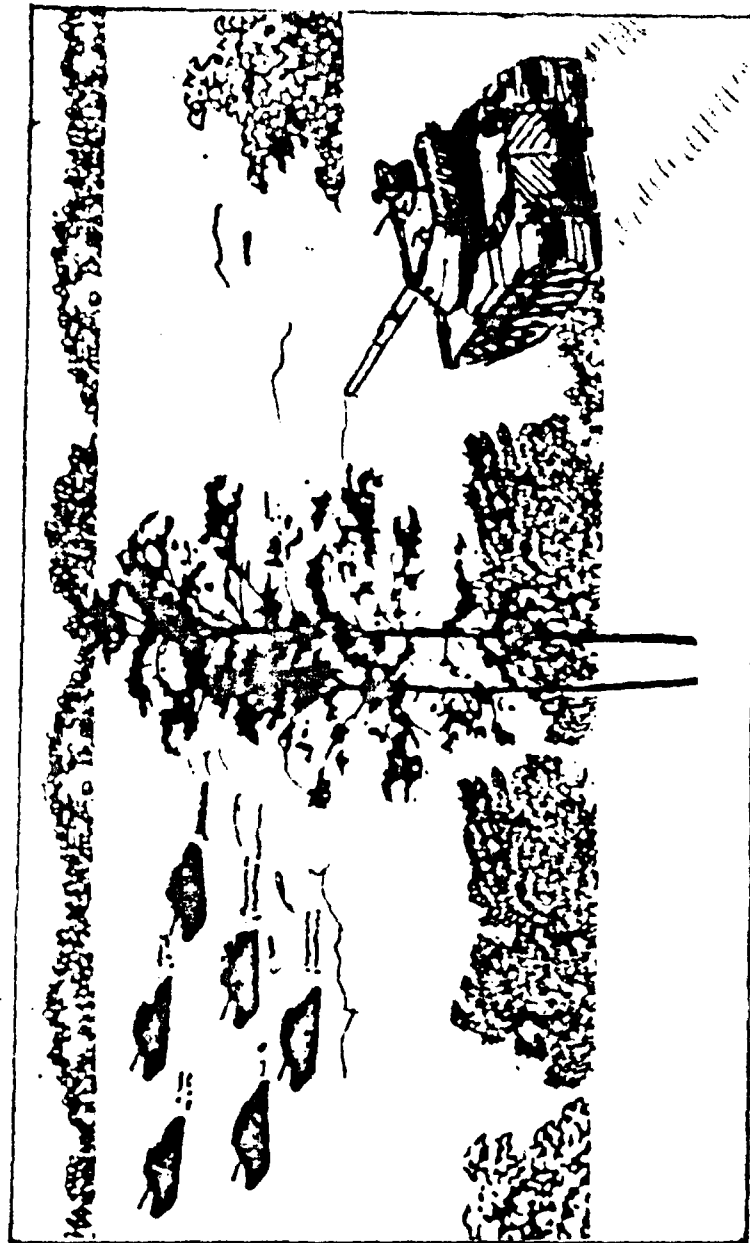
TC: FIRE AND ADJUST CALIBER FIFTY

Gunner: ON THE WAY
TARGET, CEASE FIRE

TC: TC COMPLETE

You could have made this a COAX multiple engagement if you wanted to, but there is the possibility that a truck or troops could escape.

SCENARIO 15



THE SITUATION

- You are in a deliberate attack, moving.
- Your primary mission is to destroy enemy armor.
- Your M60A3 is fully operational. SABOT is loaded.
- You see six T-62 tanks, at a range of about 2000 meters. They are retreating.

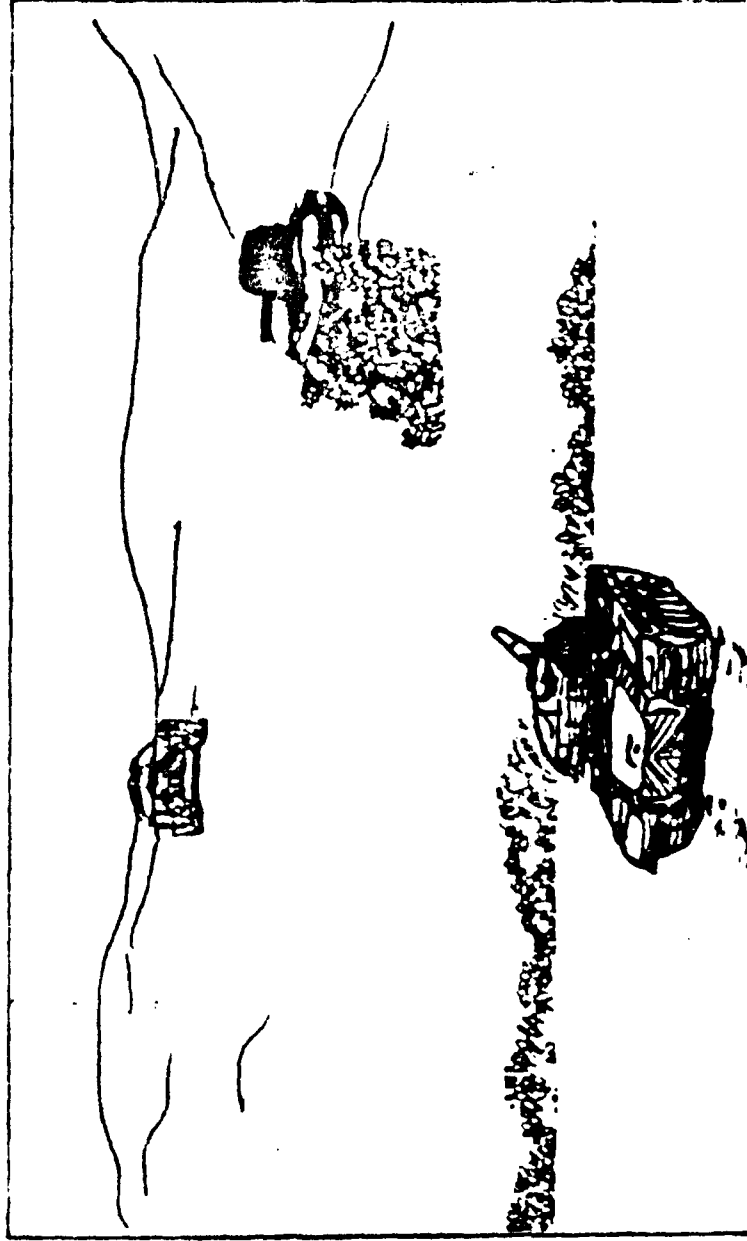
What is your fire command? What are the crew responses?
(Assume first round hits.)

SCENARIO 15 ANSWER

There are too many of the same targets to be engaged selectively. The best thing to do is to allow the gunner to select the targets and engage them as rapidly as possible. The fire command that does that is "TARGETS OF OPPORTUNITY". The gunner will then choose the target and the TC will observe target effects. The fire commands and responses are like this:

TC:	GUNNER SABOT TARGETS OF OPPORTUNITY
Loader:	UP
Gunner:	IDENTIFIED LASING FIRE
TC:	ON THE WAY
Gunner:	TARGET
Loader:	UP
Gunner:	LASING. ON THE WAY TARGET
Loader:	UP
Gunner:	LASING. ON THE WAY TARGET
Loader:	UP
Gunner:	LASING. ON THE WAY TARGET
Loader:	UP
Gunner:	LASING. ON THE WAY TARGET
Loader:	UP
Gunner:	LASING. ON THE WAY TARGET, CEASE FIRE
TC:	

SCENARIO 16



THE SITUATION

- You are attacking and have penetrated the outer ring of enemy defenses.
- Your Laser Rangefinder has failed.
- You are using the TTS, day channel.
- Off to your right, at a range of about 900 meters, you see 122mm self propelled howitzer. He does not see you.
- A T-72 approaches your direct front, range 1000 meters.
- Round loaded is SABOT.

What is your INITIAL fire command up to when the gunner says ON THE WAY? What are the crew responses? (Do not assume a first round hit.)

SCENARIO 16 ANSWER

For the INITIAL fire command, the MOST DANGEROUS threat is the T-72. The laser rangefinder has failed, so you should use TTS BATTLESIGHT. The initial fire command is:

TC: GUNNER
BATTLESIGHT
TWO MOVING TANKS

Leader: UP

Gunner: IDENTIFIED

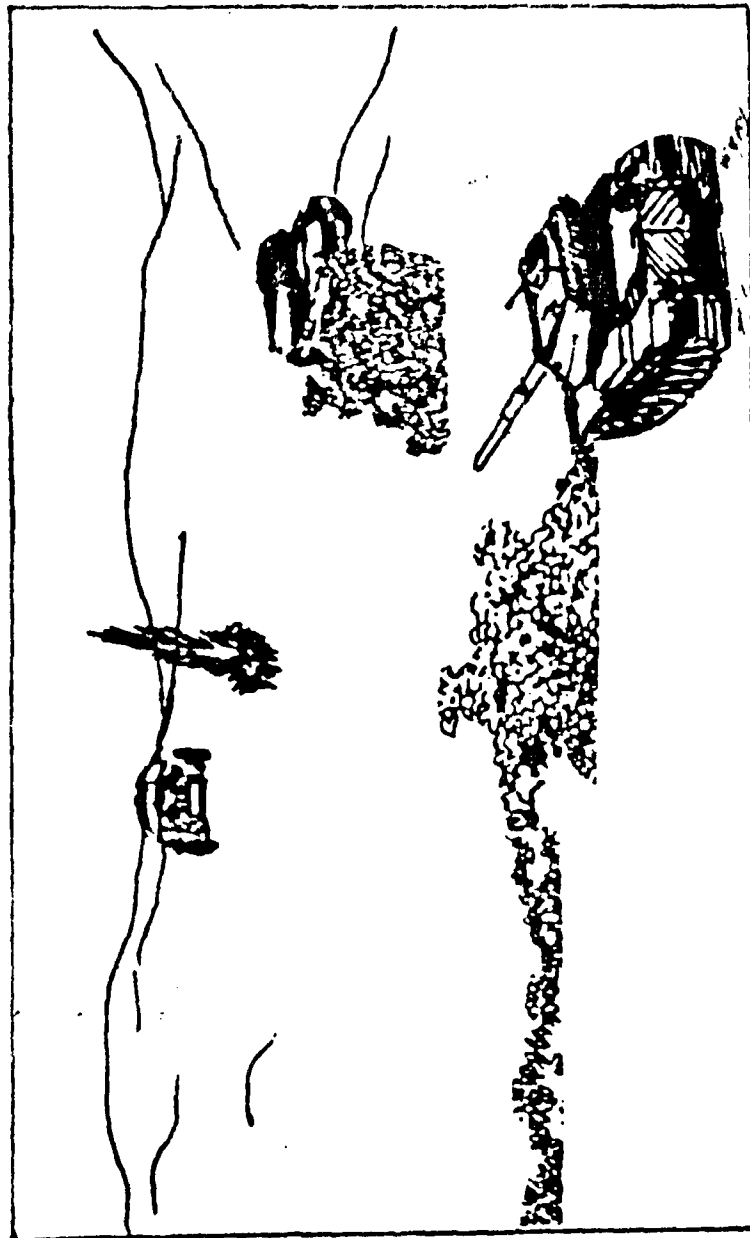
T: FIRE

Gunner: ON THE WAY

NOW TURN THE PAGE TO SEE THE RESULTS OF THIS FIRST SHOT.

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SCENARIO 17



THE SITUATION

- The picture shows where the first shot went.
- The gunner reports SHORT.
- You agree with this observation, but, you want to assist the gunner in making the proper adjustments.

What is the adjustment command you would give to the gunner?

SCENARIO 17 ANSWER

Your adjustment command must have four (4) elements. They are:

ALERT
DEFLECTION CORRECTION
RANGE CORRECTION
EXECUTION

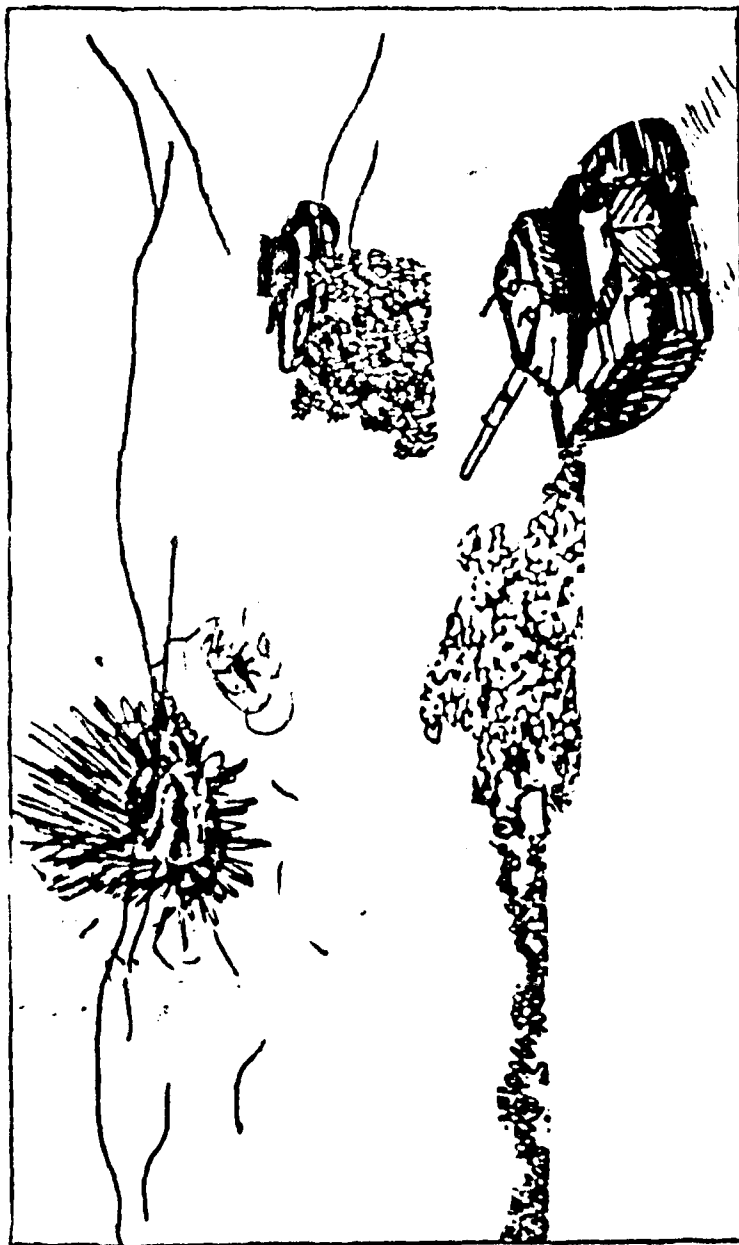
The command you give should look something like this:

SHORT	SHORT
LEFT ONE FORM	OR LEFT ONE
ADD ONE FORM	ADD ONE
FIRE	FIRE

As long as your command has the four elements in this order AND the correction is expressed using STANDARD MIL or TARGET FORM adjustment, you got it RIGHT!

NOW TURN THE PAGE TO SEE THE RESULTS OF THE SECOND SHOT.

SCENARIO 18



THE SITUATION

- ZAP!! Your second shot blasts the T-72.

What is your next fire command?
What are the crew responses?

(Do not assume a first round hit.)

SCENARIO 18 ANSWER

Your fire command should be:

TC: TARGET
RIGHT TANK

Loader: UP

Gunner: IDENTIFIED

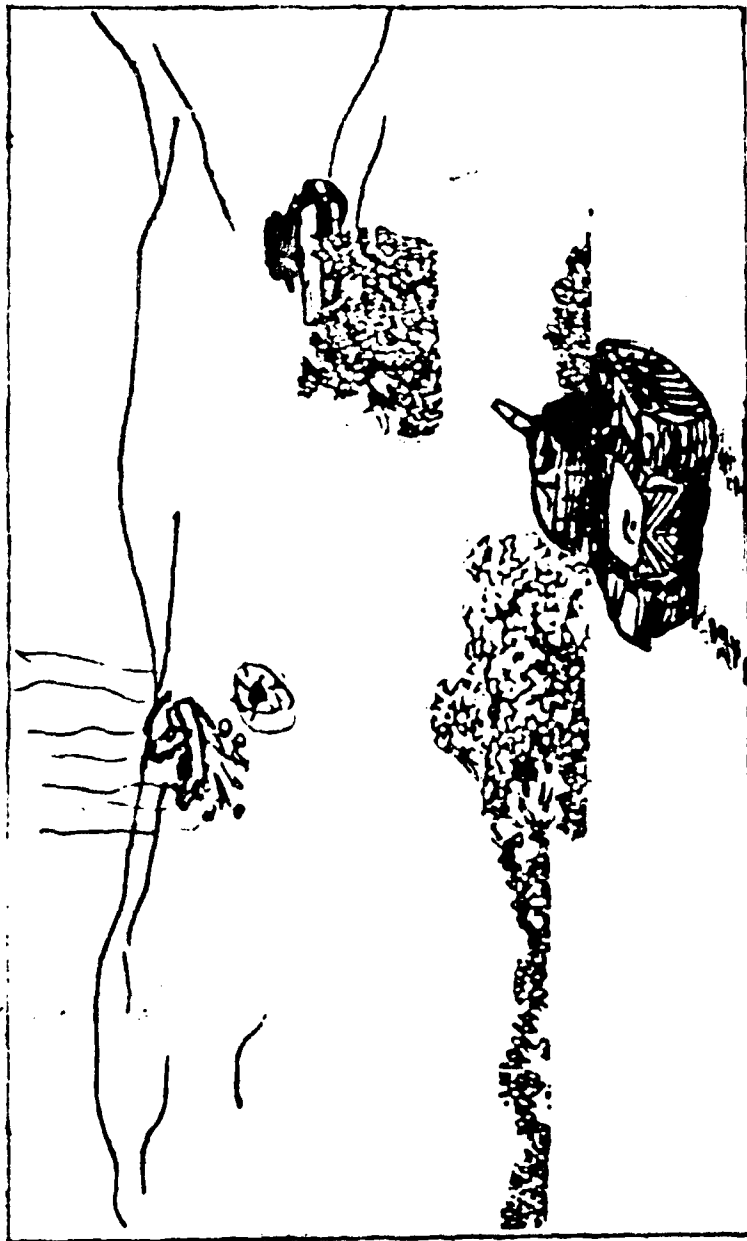
TC: FIRE

Gunner: ON THE WAY

Remember - You are still using the TTS battle-sight. The next target that had to be engaged was the 122mm self propelled howitzer, a tank-like vehicle.

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SCENARIO 19



THE SITUATION

- A round was fired at the 122mm self propelled howitzer.
- The gunner announces: LOST.
- You do not have an observation either.

What is your next fire command?

What are the crew responses?

(Do not assume a hit.)

SCENARIO 19 ANSWER

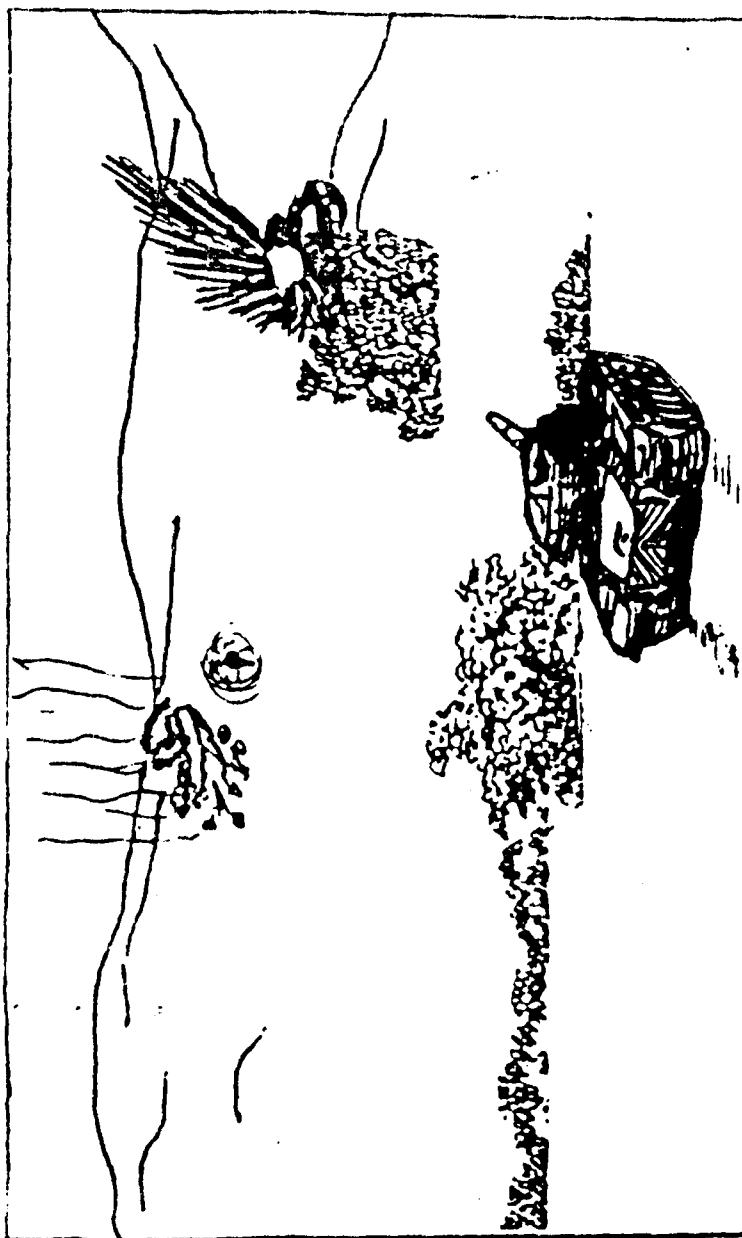
In a double-lost situation, the TC could remain silent and let the gunner apply Standard Mil Adjustment. Given the knowledge the TC has of the terrain, the TC should issue a subsequent fire command such as:

LOST	LOST
DROP ONE	OR DROP ONE
FIRE	FORM
	FIRE

NOW TURN THE PAGE TO SEE THE RESULTS OF THIS ACTION!

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SCENARIO 20



THE SITUATION

- The situation looks great!
- Good shooting!
- You scored a direct hit!
- The gunner reports: TARGET
- You announce "TARGET - CEASE FIRE"
- Your engagement is over.

You are in luck: No questions this time.

SCENARIO 21



THE SITUATION

- You are the lead element in a traveling overwatch.
- Your M60A3 is fully operational, moving 5-8 mph.
- Round loaded is SABOT.
- Suddenly you come upon enemy troops.
- There is a RPG team off to your left at 500 meters.
- An SPG-9 73mm recoilless rifle is spotted on the left front, 750 meters.
- Direct front there is a manpack SAGGER ATCM ready for launch, range 1500 meters.
- All these threats see you and are preparing to engage you.

What are your fire commands?

What are the crew responses?

(Assume first round hits.)

SCENARIO 21 ANSWER

You are faced with three (3) MOST DANGEROUS threats. You must engage these targets right away. There's nowhere to seek defilade. Your fire commands should be:

TC: GUNNER
COAX
RPG

Loader: UP

Gunner: IDENTIFIED
LASING

TC: FIRE AND ADJUST, CALIBER FIFTY

Gunner: ON THE WAY
TARGET, CEASE FIRE

TC: TC COMPLETE

NOTE: The TC would engage both the SPC-9
73mm recoilless rifle and the manpack
SAGGER ATGM. Once the gunner announces
TARGET, CEASE FIRE he should assist the
TC.

This engagement will be extremely difficult to
accomplish. If a defilade position is avail-
able, the TC should announce it before issuing
the initial fire command. For example:

TC: DRIVER, SEEK DEFILADE

SCENARIO 22



THE SITUATION

- You are the lead element in a bounding overwatch.
- The LRF has failed.
- Round loaded is SABOT.
- M60A3 is fully operational, moving at 5-8 mph.
- You see a T-72 direct front at 1000 meters.
- There is a T-12A antitank gun, right front, at 1000 meters.
- They both see you.

What are your fire commands?

What are the crew responses?

(Assume first round hits.)

SCENARIO 22 ANSWER

You must make a simultaneous engagement because BOTH of these targets are MOST DANGEROUS threats. You also must use BATTLESIGHT because your laser rangefinder has failed. The correct fire command is:

TC: GUNNER
BATTLESIGHT
TANK

Loader: UP

Gunner: IDENTIFIED

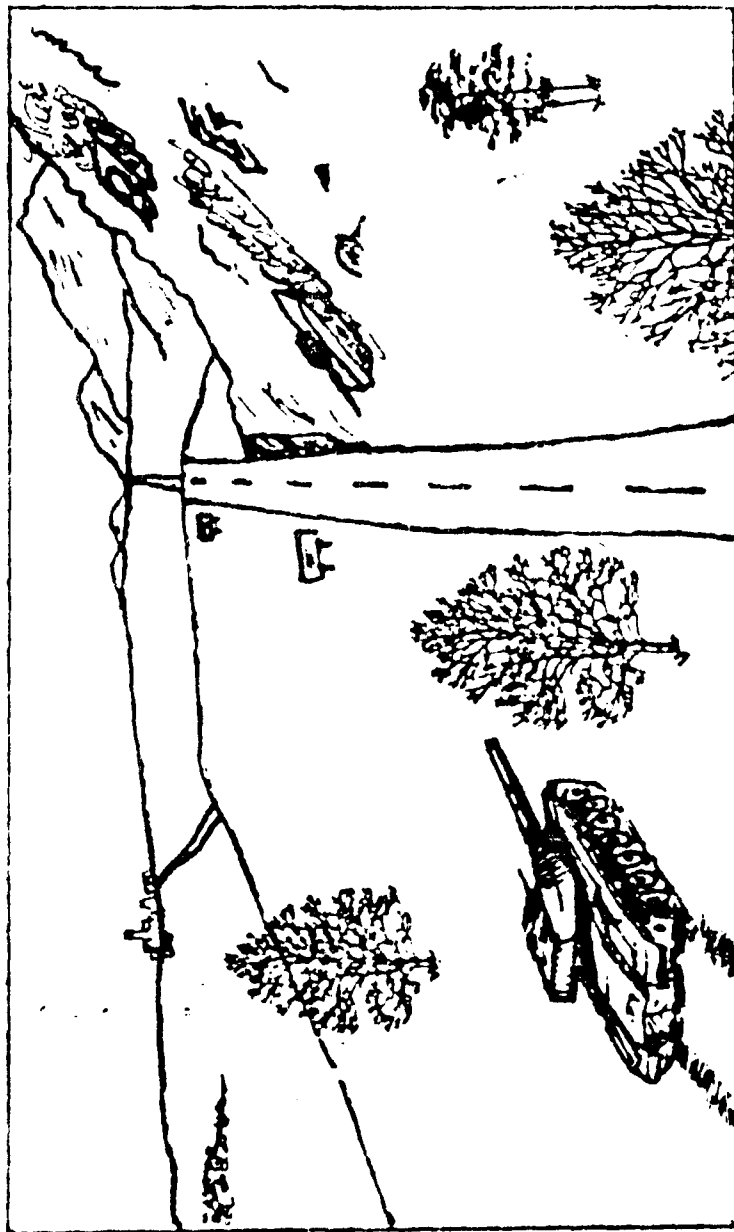
TC: FIRE AND ADJUST, CALIBER FIFTY

Gunner: ON THE WAY
TARGET, CEASE FIRE

TC: TC COMPLETE 90

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SCENARIO 23



THE SITUATION

- You have penetrated enemy's security zone.
- M60A3 is fully operational, moving at 5-8 mph.
- Round loaded is SABOT.
- Two T-72s are coming from your right, at 1500 meters.
- They see you.
- You issue this fire command:

TC: GUNNER
SABOT
TWO MOVING TANKS, FIRST TANK

Loader: UP

Gunner: CANNOT IDENTIFY

What should your next fire commands be?
What are the crew responses?

(Assume first round hits.) 93

MC WARIO 23 ANSWER

You must take over the engagement yourself
IMMEDIATELY! You announce:

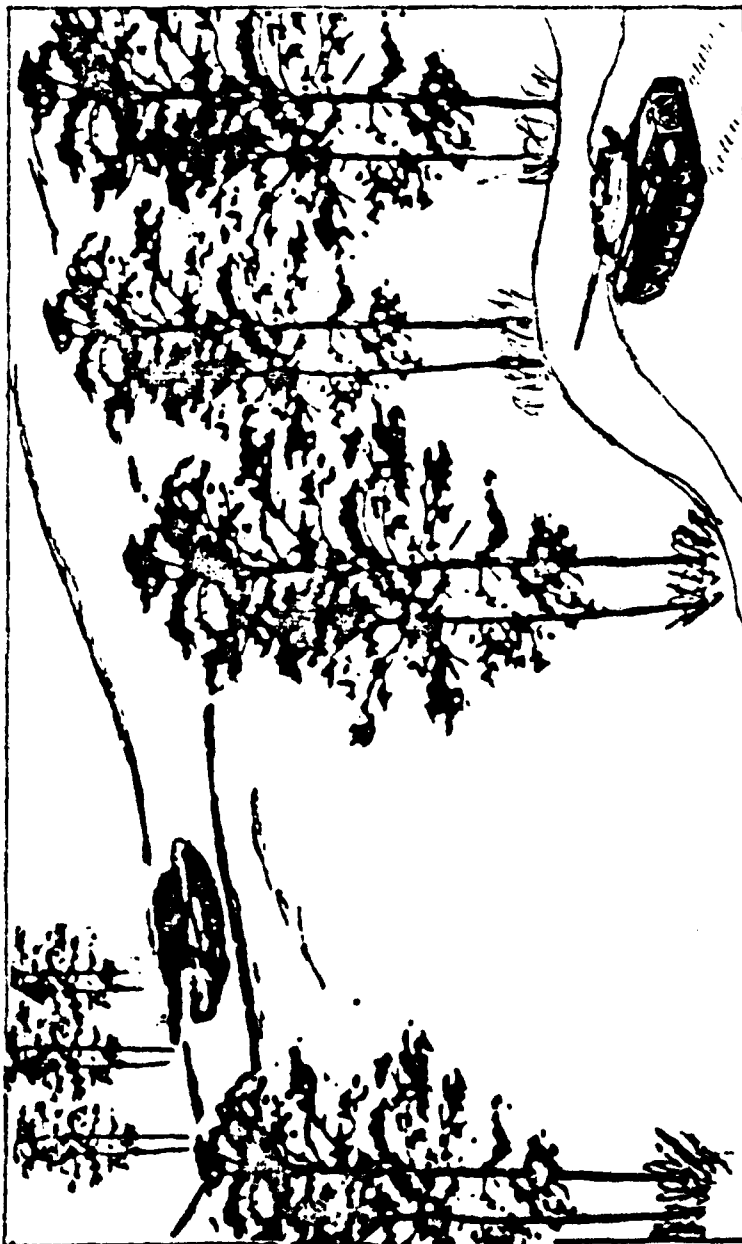
TC: FROM MY POSITION
LASING
ON THE WAY
TARGET

Loader: UP

TC: SECOND TANK
FROM MY POSITION
LASING
ON THE WAY
TARGET, CEASE FIRE

NOTE: If the gunner can identify the target(s) after the TC has engaged from his position, the gunner should announce IDENTIFIED. The TC should then return control to the gunner immediately. This is done by announcing "FIRE".

SCENARIO 24



THE SITUATION

- You are in a defensive position.
- Round loaded is SABOT.
- The LRF has failed.
- There is a T-72 at 1000 meters.
- You issue the following fire command:

GUNNER
SABOT
TANK

What should you do next?
What is the next series of commands and
crew responses?

SCENARIO 24 ANSWER

The fire command: GUNNER
SABOT
TANK

was incorrect! It is a fire command for
TTS precision gunnery. You know the
laser rangefinder has failed. That means
you must use BATTLESIGHT gunnery. Once
you realize that, you must CORRECT the
error by announcing:
"CORRECTION"

Then:

TC: BATTLESIGHT
TANK

Loader: UP

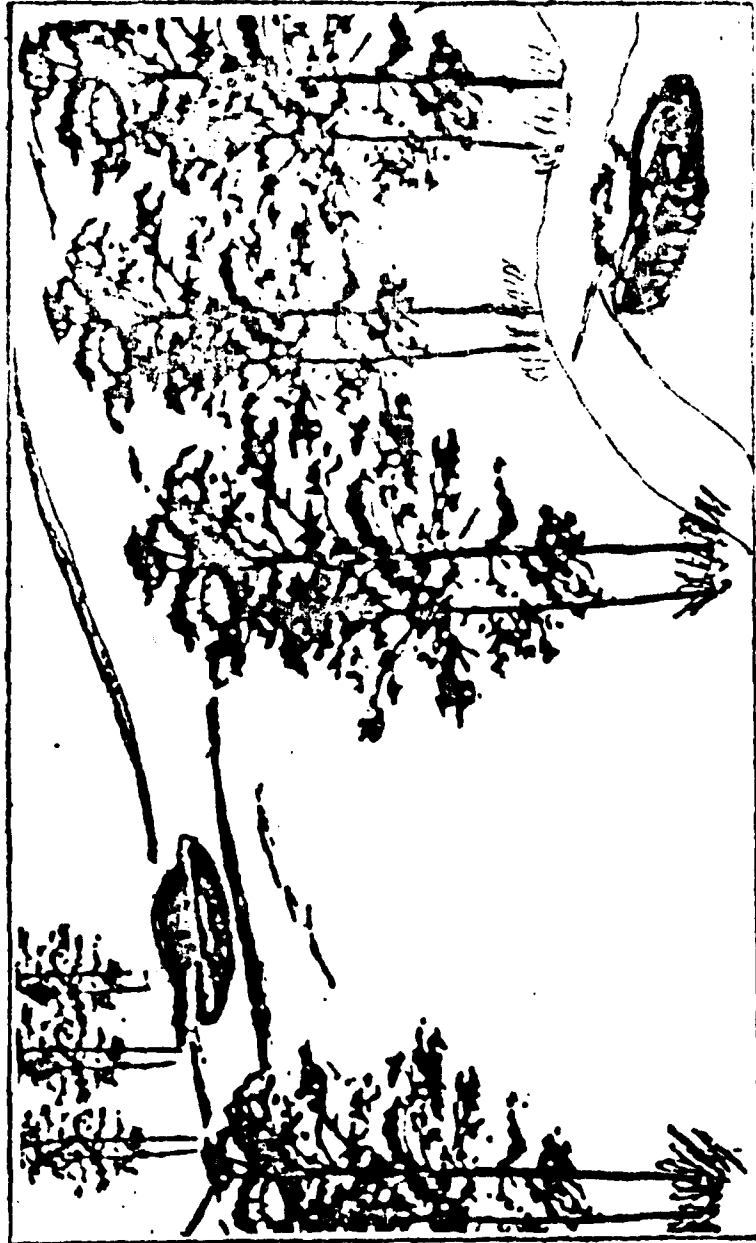
Gunner: IDENTIFIED
LASING

TC: FIRE

Gunner: ON THE WAY
TARGET

TC: TARGET, CEASE FIRE

SCENARIO 25



THE SITUATION (same as before)

- You are in a bounding overwatch.
- Round loaded is SABOT.
- The LRF has failed.
- There is a T-72 at 1000 meters.
- You announce the following fire command:

GUNNER
BATTLESIGHT
TANK

Loader: UP

Gunner: TARGET?

What should you do next?

What is the next series of commands and crew responses?

SCENARIO 25 ANSWER

The Gunner either did not understand or hear the TARGET DESCRIPTION element of your fire command. All you have to do is repeat that element. You announce:

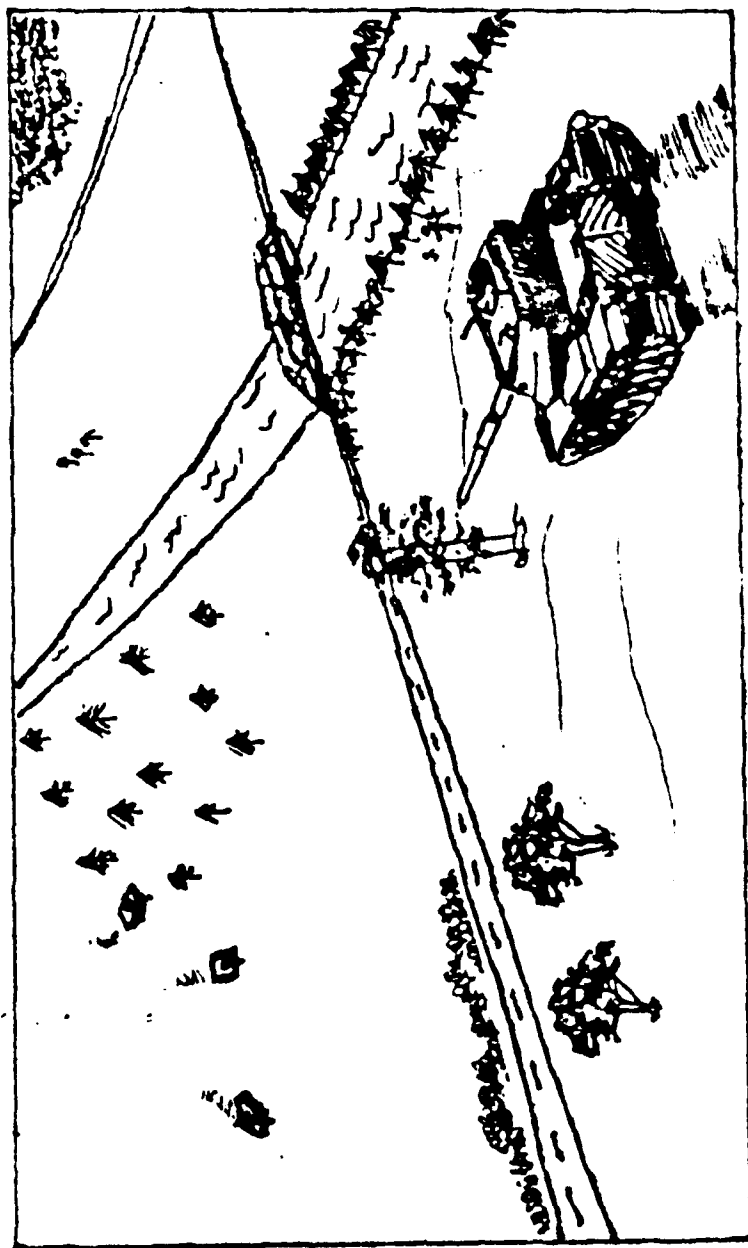
TC: TANK

Gunner: IDENTIFIED

Now the fire command and crew responses can proceed as normal.

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SCENARIO 26



THE SITUATION

- You are in a bounding overwatch, moving 5-8 mph.
- Round loaded is SABOT.
- M60A3 is fully operational.
- You see three T-72 tanks, direct front at 2000 meters.
- They see you.
- You also see a manpack SAGGER ATCM being set up for a launch at you, range 1000 meters.

What are your fire commands and crew responses?
(Assume first round hits.)

SCENARIO 26 ANSWER

In order to destroy the T-72s and SAGGER ATGM,
you must make a MULTIPLE - SIMULTANEOUS engagement.
Your fire command should be:

TC: GUNNER
SABOT
THREE MOVING TANKS, LEFT TANK

Loader: UP

Gunner: IDENTIFIED
L/SING
