REPORT ON THE CONFERENCE

Purposes of the Conference

The purpose of the Conference was to provide a forum in which leading cognitive psychologists would debate questions that are both fundamental to experimental psychology and also directly related to practical concerns. Such questions are: How do people learn to read? What happens during the process of speech perception? How do people acquire problem-solving skills? How do cognitive and motor skills develop?

A great deal of research has been conducted on these important topics in the last two decades, during which cognitive psychology has existed as a recognized speciality area. However, there is a considerable diversity among the research methods that have been used, and among the answers that the research has provided. There is also a divergence of opinion concerning fundamental theoretical issues (Fodor, 1984; Jenkins, 1980; Neisser, 1984). Concurrent with this "ferment" in the field of cognitive psychology has been an increasing interest in important applied topics, such as the nature of cognitive processes in instructional settings, the problem-solving skills of experts, and memory in real-world contexts (e.g., Bransford, 1979; Jenkins, 1983; Neisser, 1982).

The Conference involved both prominent senior scientists and innovative young researchers in discussions of research that lies at the "cutting edge." The conference was organized into Symposia and Discussion Sessions whose topics were suggested directly by the goals of the conference (i.e., reading, skill acquisition, learning, problem-solving, etc.). The presentations involved summaries of available knowledge, aimed at integration. There were also debates about fundamental theoretical issues, including the question of the goals of cognitive psychology.

In order to facilitate discussion among the participants, all conference events were held, through special arrangement, in meeting rooms at the hotel where the participants were lodged. Overall, the conference events ran very smoothly.


