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This report describes the progress of the Knowledge Delivery Research project during the contract period ending 31 January 1983.

During the reporting period, the following papers were issued in project reports: [Mann 81, Matthiessen 81, Mann 82]. The first two were presented at a conference of the Association for Computational Linguistics, and the latter has been accepted for publication by the journal *Discourse Processes*.

In addition, research and writing was done which eventually led to creation of the following reports: [Mann & Matthiessen 3.a, Mann 83a].

The first of these is actually a compendium of three technical papers: [Mann 83b, Mann & Matthiessen 3.b, Matthiessen 3.]. All three of these have been accepted for publication in a forthcoming book. For details see the references section below.

The second of these appeared in the proceedings of the 1983 AAAI conference.
