

## A. REISSUANCE AND PURPOSE

1. This Directive reissues reference (a).
2. In accordance with the authorities contained in reference (b), I hereby delegate to Deputy Secretary of Defense John P. White full power and authority to act for the Secretary of Defense and to exercise the powers of the Secretary of Defense upon any and all matters concerning which the Secretary of Defense is authorized to act pursuant to law.
3. The all-inclusive authority delegated herein may not be redelegated in toto; however, the Deputy Secretary is authorized to make specific redelegations, as required.

## B. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Directive is effective immediately.
