KCNA NOTES FOREIGN MEDIA REACTION TO RANGOON BOMBING

Yugoslav Paper Blames South

[Text] Belgrade, 26 Oct (KCNA)--The Yugoslav paper OSLOBODJENJE 25 October carried a commentary titled "Bomb Blast Is a Product of Crisis."

Noting that immediately after the bomb blast in Rangoon the Seoul authorities launched a wholesale smear campaign against Pyongyang with no evidence to prove it guilty, the paper says: The Seoul authorities feel their existence in danger. The bomb blast in Rangoon, therefore, may be one connected with the balance of forces in South Korea itself or a product of the habitual tactics of Seoul which is accustomed to shifting the responsibility for any incident on to others.

They have cried about the loathsome "threat of aggression from the North" for scores of years. The South Korean "regime" is, in fact, maintained by the camouflaging propaganda about "threat of communization."

Proceeding from its strategic calculation, the United States has always attached importance to South Korea and revoked the "commitment" to withdraw its forces from South Korea.

The incident may be connected with correlations in the upper strata of the South Korean "army," that is, collision between the radicalist faction and ultra radicalist faction of officers.

Hungarian, French, Finnish Reaction

[Text] Pyongyang, 1 Nov (KCNA)--The Hungarian magazine MAGYAR noted that the Chon Tu-hwan clique are groundlessly claiming that the bomb blast in Rangoon is a product of a "plot of the North." Other words are not expected from the Chon Tu-hwan clique who had all along slandered the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, it said.

Pointing out that Chon Tu-hwan is shifting the responsibility for the Rangoon explosion on to the DPRK before its truth is clarified, the French magazine AFRIQUE-ASIE in a commentary said: This is his habitual method.

Availing itself of every chance, the South Korean "regime" has attempted to shift the responsibility for all its crisis on to the DPRK, taking issue with and speaking ill of it, the magazine noted, and stressed: The South Korean "regime" describes all the incidents including the political and social protest movement growing within itself as "work of the North."

Asking what sort of man Chon Tu-hwan is, who survived the bomb blast in Rangoon, the Finnish paper RAKENTAYA cited materials about his violent usurpation of power.

[Text] Pyongyang, 1 Nov (KCNA)--Foreign papers recently published articles denouncing the Chon Tu-hwan puppet clique in connection with the bomb blast in Rangoon, Burma.

The Pakistani paper HAE DER in an article titled "Explosion in Burma Is a Work of the South Korean Ruler Himself. 'Director of the Security Planning Board' and 'Chief Guard Secretary' Are Involved in This Incident" said: Chon Tu-hwan claimed the lives of his "ministers" to realise his political ambition. He openly declared that the "director of the Security Planning Board" and the "chief guard secretary of Chongwadae" are not guilty in the least in this incident. His defense of his two underlings proves that he framed the plot together with them.

He has sent a "special enquiry team" to Burma to stage a drama for shifting the responsibility for this decimation on to the Democratic People's Republic of Korea.

Noting that the Chon Tu-hwan clique are heaping slanders on the DPRK in connection with the homicidal incident in Rangoon, true to their inveterate bad habit, the Czechoslovak paper SVOBODNE SLOVO said: The attention in this incident is drawn to the South Korean authorities who are in a hopeless plight as the defunct dictator was when he was shot by the former "director of the South Korean Central Intelligence Agency" in October 1979. The dictator Chon Tu-hwan uses the Rangoon explosion as a pretext for a harsher suppression, the paper said.

The Polish paper SZTANDAR MLODYCH stressed: Chon Tu-hwan hurriedly flew back to Seoul from Burma. He stoops to all inhumane and crafty methods for his power.

Pointing out that the bosses of the new puppet "cabinet" are pro-U.S. and pro-Japanese lackeys closely linked with Tokyo and Washington, the paper declared: There is no doubt that the formation of this Seoul "cabinet" will result in a harsher crackdown on the people and a heightened tension and an acute political situation in Asia.

POLISH PAPER WRITES ON U.S. KOREAN WAR 'ATROCITIES'

[Text] Pyongyang, 28 Oct (KCNA)--The Polish paper ZOLNIERZ WOLNOSCI 16 October carried an article exposing the criminal atrocities the U.S. imperialist aggressors committed in Korea during the last war of aggression. The paper said:

During the war in Korea the American troops shot to death and buried alive guiltless Koreans, threw gasoline over them irrespective of the sex and age and burnt them to death, bisected the abdomen or cut off the breasts of women, drove nails into foreheads and gouged out eyeballs without hesitation. The paper cited data to prove their massacres in Sinchon and other areas.

Noting that they employed every means to slaughter people during the Korean war, the paper recalled that the then U.S. President Truman ordered the use of any kind of weapons including atomic bombs in Korea. It said: They schemed to use even atomic bombs in an attempt to retrieve their defeat in Korea, but dared not do so. However, they used bacteriological weapons in violation of international law.

The paper pointed out that in Koje Island they committed experiments of germ weapons many times a day and used these weapons in quantities in many areas to spread various epidemic diseases.

JAPANESE MAGAZINE CITED AGAINST TRIPARTITE 'SCHEME'

[Text] Pyongyang, 1 Nov (KCNA)--A recent issue of BUNKA HYORON, a magazine published in Japan, carried an article exposing the scheme to frame up a U.S.-Japan-South Korea tripartite military alliance. Noting that the present Reagan administration attaches greatest importance to the formation of this alliance according to the Asian strategy of the U.S. imperialists, the magazine says:

It is plotting to promote military integration by uniting the strength of its allies in a global military alliance with the United States as the leader. Here it demands that a military alliance embracing South Korea and Japan undertake in Asia and the Pacific a role equivalent to that of NATO in Europe. In other words, it intends to make the U.S. forces deployed in South Korea and Japan perform the role of a "spear" and, at the same time, build a forefront in the east by combining the combat power of the South Korean Army and the Japan "Self-defence Forces."

The U.S. imperialists have already started work for the realisation of this aggressive plan, the magazine notes, and stresses: The Reagan regime is first of all, putting spurs to the reinforcement of the U.S. forces in South Korea, seeking their permanent presence there.

On the other hand, it burdened Japan with strategic "economic aid" to prop up the unstable Chon Tu-hwan fascist "regime." The decision of Japan to grant \$4,000 million "economic aid" to South Korea means Nakasone's active response to Reagan's strategy.

[Text] Pyongyang, 2 Nov (KCNA)--NODONG SINMUN 1 November carried an article analyzing the monthly international situation, which says: During the last 1 month peace and security were threatened and sovereignty of countries and nations violated in different parts of the world owing to the maneuvers of the U.S. imperialists.

The paper notes: On 25 October the U.S. imperialists occupied Grenada, an independent and sovereign state, by force of arms with the mobilization of more than 2,000 aggression troops supported by 11 warships and planes.

They also escalated armed intervention against the Nicaraguan people. They have already massed tens of warships in the coastal sea of Nicaragua under the pretext of military exercises. At the same time, they continue instigating the Somoza remnants and the Honduran reactionary army to armed attacks for murdering peaceable people of Nicaragua and destroying economic establishments.

The Bulgarian paper RABOTNICHESKO DELO said that the South Korean puppets are frantically whipping up war fever under the pretext of the explosion in Rangoon. It exposed the war exercises and military provocations of the U.S. imperialists and the South Korean puppets.

The United States, the paper noted, is scheming to hasten the militarization of South Korea and create a favourable condition for the expected South Korean trip of Reagan, taking advantage of the incident.

The Hungarian paper MAGYAR HIRLAP said that the row now being kicked up by the South Korean "regime" against the Democratic People's Republic of Korea is aimed at tiding over their political and economic crisis.

The Indian PTI News Agency pointed out: The anti-communist, anti-DPRK rackets of the South Korean puppet clique is an offspring of their crisis. SOUTH'S 'SABRE-RATTLING' CALLED 'MORE HYSTERIC'

[Text] Pyongyang, 2 Nov (KCNA)--The Chon Tu-hwan military fascist clique are getting more hysteric in their war provocation maneuvers after putting the puppet army and police in full combat posture all over South Korea by issuing an "emergency alert order" with the Rangoon explosion as an occasion.

The military fascists launched a war exercise codenamed "Ssangryong 83" claimed to be "the biggest surprise mobilisation exercise in the ground force history" in the area along the military demarcation line from the early morning of 16 October. This sabre-rattling which continued till 21 October involved the puppet army in Seoul and Kyonggi Province, more than 20,000 men of the "Homeland Defence Reserve Forces" and over 1,000 vehicles and arms of various kinds.

On 18 October, traitor Chon Tu-hwan showed up on the scene of the military exercise and gadded about with frantic outcries for "overpowering the enemy."
