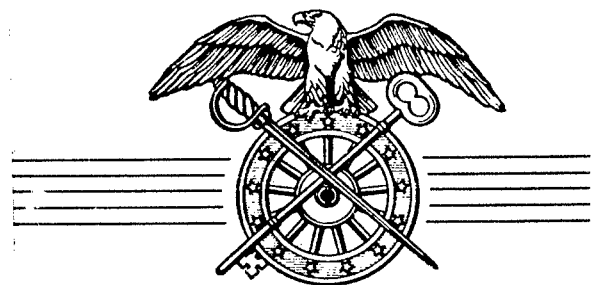

INTRODUCTION

1. PURPOSE. Clothing Almanacs show monthly requirements for items of military clothing to be used in a particular region. They are intended to aid logistic planners by indicating not only the most suitable military clothing for each month, but also the climatic and geographic conditions which make such clothing suitable. The tables can be used in planning clothing issue and seasonal clothing renovation, in scheduling warehouse operations to make maximum use of critical space, in estimating the probable amounts of use and wear of various items and consequent requirements for their replacement.

a. Distribution. The Almanacs are distributed for guidance to theater, Army, and other commanders responsible for authorizing the issue of discretionary items, and for information to commanders of posts, camps, stations, and divisions or equivalent organizations.

2. DESCRIPTION. Clothing Almanacs supplement T/A 21, which specifies total yearly clothing allowances for each of seven world-wide zones. Each T/A 21 Clothing Allowance Zone is based on the average temperatures of the coldest and warmest months, as shown in Table 1.

For each zone, T/A 21 lists the items that are required or mandatory. It also lists for each zone the items that are discretionary. (Discretionary items are not required by all personnel within the respective zones, but they are essential to the operating efficiency of certain personnel because of duty assignments which may involve greater exposure to environmental conditions.) Within the framework of T/A 21, Clothing Almanacs show monthly clothing requirements in specific regions, indicating essential items in these regions.

a. Basis. Clothing Almanacs are based on a detailed study of local environmental conditions. Each Almanac specifies the clothing most likely to be needed by troops for adequate protection against these conditions during round-the-clock operations. Of primary concern in preparing an Almanac is the amount and kind of clothing needed by a soldier in the field while his activity is relatively light. During strenuous activity, troops need less clothing; when completely at rest, they require more to remain comfortable. Clothing Almanacs show the items that will give troops adequate protection for at least 90 percent of the time, and in an average year any particular item can be expected to be used at least 30 percent of the time during the months specified.

b. Regions. Clothing Almanacs are issued for particular regions (e.g., Alaska, Japan, Northeast Africa, etc.) which include parts of two or more T/A 21 Clothing Allowance Zones. Each Clothing Almanac Region is further subdivided into a number of Clothing Requirement Areas, according to differences in monthly clothing requirements. Although all Clothing Requirement Areas within any one of the T/A 21 Clothing Allowance Zones have the same basic annual clothing allowances, they differ in monthly clothing needs.

(1) Clothing Requirement Areas are of two types, nonmountainous and mountainous. The latter are given a special designation to indicate that field conditions and, consequently, clothing requirements may change rapidly within a relatively short horizontal distance. The mountainous Areas are divided into elevation intervals, each of which has different clothing needs. Thus, in effect, each interval represents a Clothing Requirement Area and clothing needs of troops operating within mountains can be determined for any elevation.

(2) Each Clothing Requirement Area is assigned an identifying symbol. Nonmountainous Areas are designated by Roman numerals of the Clothing Zones in which they occur, together with an identifying letter (e.g., VI-A). Mountainous Areas are designated by the Roman numerals of the Clothing Allowance Zones of their lowest elevations, together with an identifying number (e.g., VI-2). Although Clothing Requirement Areas in different Clothing Almanacs may have identical designations, they do not necessarily have the same environmental conditions or monthly clothing requirements. For example, monthly clothing requirements in Alaska VII-C are not the same as those in Greenland VII-C.

c. Map. Clothing Requirement Areas of the Region are shown on a map in the back of the Almanac. Distinctive boundaries separate Clothing Allowance Zones; single-line boundaries separate the individual Clothing Requirement Areas. Areas are numbered according to the system outlined above.

d. Tables For each Clothing Requirement Area or mountain elevation interval there is a table in the Clothing Almanac. Months are shown along the top, and the clothing items are listed on the left-hand side of the page. Need for an item is shown by a solid bar drawn opposite the item and in the proper month-column. The absence of such a bar means that the item is not needed in that month. For each mountain interval, elevations in feet above sea level are given at the top of the page.

e. New Items. All items listed in the clothing tables are authorized in T/A 21, Mobilization, 27 Jan 50, for the respective zones. As improvements are made and new items are standardized, they automatically replace the older ones in the tables as well as in requisitions. Upon standardization of completely new items, which are not simply improvements but are so different as not to be comparable to older items, special instructions for their use will be furnished in official Quartermaster publications.

f. Items Listed. In the tables, the clothing items have been grouped and arranged alphabetically under the headings of Body Clothing, Footgear, Handgear, Headgear, and Sleeping Equipment. For many items, model numbers, shade numbers, etc., have been eliminated to conserve space.

(1) Both discretionary and mandatory items are included in the tables. Discretionary items are indicated by an asterisk (*).

(2) No requirements are shown for specialized equipment, such as that for low-mountain and alpine areas, (T/A 21, Part III, Section II) which may be authorized by the commanding general, theater of operations, or by the Department of the Army for individuals undergoing special training in continental United States. (Boots, ski-mountain are considered specialized.)

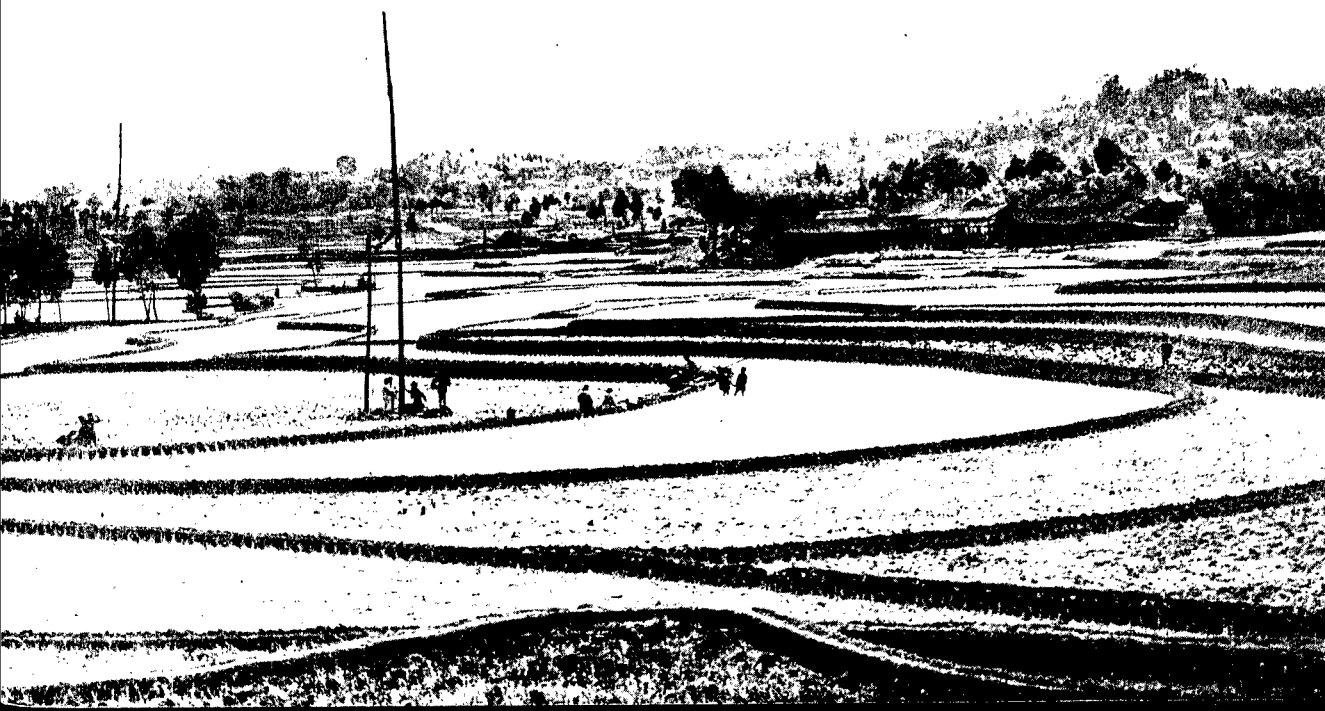
(3) Certain items which are mandatory throughout the world, such as Drawers, cotton and Belt, waist are not included in the tables.

(4) Also excluded are items in the nature of equipment rather than clothing: insignia, toilet articles, knives, snowshoes, tents, steel helmets, etc.

(5) Under the heading "Anti-Insect" need is indicated for: Gloves, mosquito; Headnet, mosquito; Bar, insect, field; and Repellent, insect.

CLOTHING ALMANAC FOR CHINA AND KOREA

1. GENERAL.

China and Korea, one and a half times as large in area as the United States, have even greater contrasts in climate, topography, and vegetation. Clothing requirements in this vast region cover the entire gamut of Army clothing, from the Warm Weather clothing needed for most of the year on the south coast to Very Cold Weather clothing required during winter in North Korea, Manchuria, North China, and Mongolia.

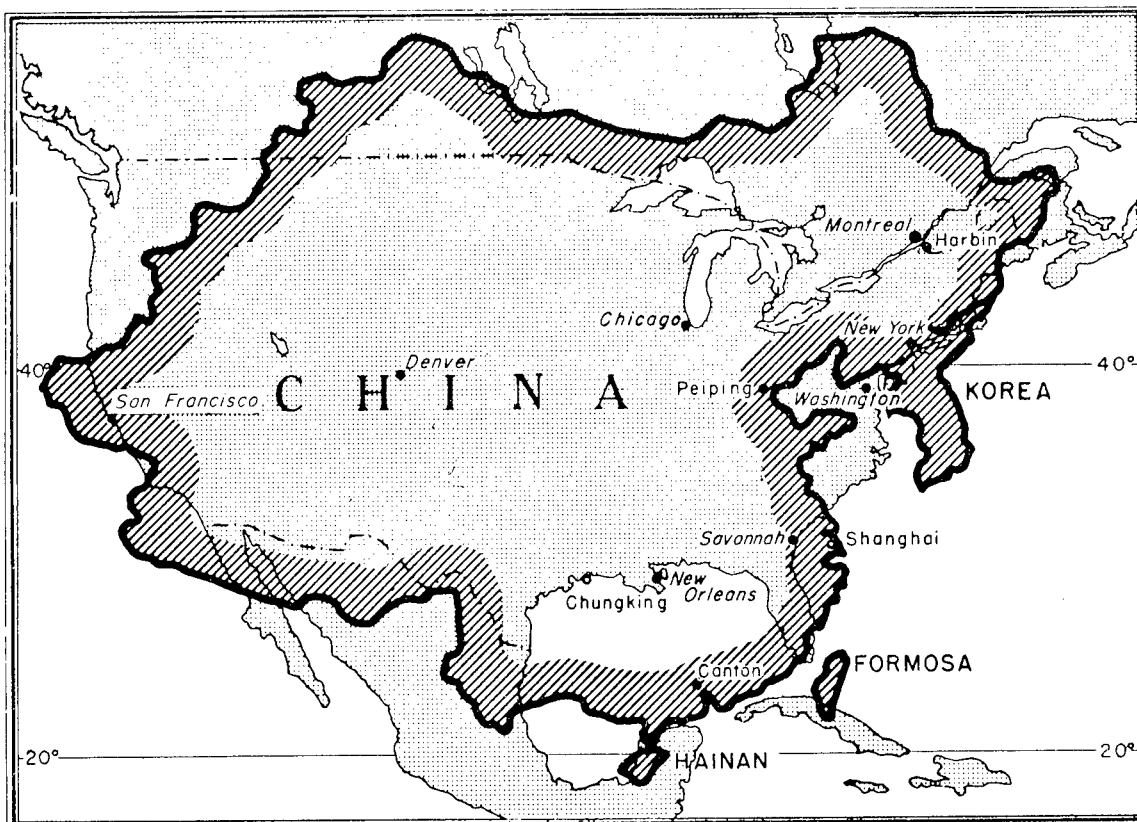


Fig. 3. China and Korea superimposed on the United States.

From east to west, Chinese territory stretches over more than 3,000 miles -- farther than from Bangor, Maine, to San Francisco (Fig. 3). The northernmost border is as far north as Hudson Bay, the southernmost tip as far south as Puerto Rico and Yucatan. (The boundaries of China as used in this Almanac are those which are established and recognized, although actual political and military control over large portions has changed in the last two decades.)

But while the United States lies between two oceans, China and Korea occupy but a small corner of a large continent; consequently, climates differ markedly between places in the same latitude in China or Korea and in the United States. Of the 22 Clothing Requirement Areas in China and Korea (folding map in back), 9 are mountainous. The terrain varies from the north slopes of the lofty Himalaya to the vast Mongolian deserts and the waterlogged coasts and river valleys.

2. TERRAIN.

The most striking feature of the relief of China and Korea is the great amount of high land. More than three-quarters of the land is above 2,000 feet, and nearly one-third higher than 10,000 feet. (Corresponding figures for the United States are less than one-half and about 1 percent.) From the Pamir mountain knot beyond the western border, several high ranges extend outward to the southeast and northeast, framing the high basins of Sinkiang, Tibet, Mongolia, and western China. The interior is separated from the lowland plains and dissected plateaus of eastern China by broken uplands and mountainous terrain.

a. Mountains. The mountains of western China (Areas V-1, V-2, V-3, and VII-1) are extremely high, ranging in average elevation from 9,000 feet in the north to over 28,000 feet in the south. They are characterized by barren slopes, and many have permanent snowcaps. The high passes are usually blocked by heavy winter snows and, even in summer, the steep rocky trails over them are difficult to cross. The eastern portion of Area V-1, bordering Assam in Northeast India, is characterized by north-south gorges and lofty precipitous ridges up to 25,000 feet in elevation (the "Hump" of World War II). The slopes below the snow line are heavily forested, but the valley floors have vegetation typical of semi-arid regions (Fig. 1).

Several east-west ranges form a high, rugged mountainous barrier (Area V-2) between north and south China. Average elevations of the mountains range from above 20,000 feet in the west to low hills only a few hundred feet above sea level in the east. Southern slopes are generally moist and forested while northern slopes are semi-arid and grass-covered. The central portion of Area V-2 is largely basin and range topography averaging 16,000 feet in elevation; vegetation is scant, and extensive areas of bare rock compose much of the land surface.

Southeastern portions of Manchuria and most of Korea (Areas V-4 and V-5) consist of forested mountains ranging in elevation from 4,000 to 9,000 feet, the highest peak on the Manchurian-Korean border. In China, the western portions of Zones II and III (Areas II-2 and III-1) are characterized by deep valleys, precipitous mountains, and dissected plateaus. The average elevation is 6,000 feet with peak elevations up to 15,000 feet.

The major part of Taiwan (Area II-1) consists of forested mountains with a north-south orientation rising to 10,000 feet. Eastern slopes are steep and western slopes, relatively gentle.

b. Interior Basins. The Takla Makan Desert (Area V-G) and adjacent minor deserts, which occupy an area roughly equal to Nevada and Utah combined, are largely areas of drifting sand dunes and interior drainage. The only inhabited areas are in oases around the periphery. Average elevations are between 2,000 and 3,000 feet, but an adjoining basin to the northeast, the Turfan Depression, is below sea level. The Gobi Desert (Area V-B, VII-A, and VII-B), a wide basin averaging 4,000 to 6,000 feet in elevation, is slightly larger than the combined areas of Colorado, Utah, Nevada, California, Arizona, and New Mexico. It is generally barren, rocky, and gravelly.

Adjoining the Gobi Desert on the south is a highly dissected upland plain (Area V-C), sometimes referred to as the "Loess Plateau", which is essentially the upper drainage basin of the Yellow River. Much of the soil is wind-deposited silt (loess) in which vertical-walled canyons and gullies have been formed by wind and water erosion. The natural vegetative cover of this area is very sparse.

The Basin of Szechwan (Area V-F), rolling and hilly, is one of the most productive agricultural regions of China; most of the land is farmed and even the higher slopes have been terraced for rice cultivation (Fig. 2). The Szechwan Basin differs climatically from the other interior basins from which it is separated by a wide band of mountains which protect it from the cold winds so that winters are mild.

c. Dissected Plateaus. Southern China (Areas II-A, III-A, III-B) is an upland area of hills, low mountains and rough relief. Average elevations of this upland surface are 3,000 to 4,000 feet and higher mountains reach 6,000 feet. Western portions of Areas II-A and III-B are characterized by a rough, eroded limestone surface (karst topography). Isolated hills, extremely varied in form, rise vertically above level portions of the upland.

d. Low Plains. Lowland plains include the plain of Manchuria, the delta plains of the Yellow River and the Yangtze, and the coastal plains bordering the region. The plain of Manchuria (Area V-B), in the north, is a flat to rolling farming landscape, interrupted by grasslands. The North China Plain, about as large as Ohio, Indiana, and Illinois combined, is essentially the delta of the Yellow River. One-sixth of the population of China is crowded into this plain. The low terrain is very flat and the river flows between dikes above the level of the surrounding plain; floods

which affect vast areas of the plain are a constant danger. In the east, the general flat aspect of this plain is broken by the Shantung Hills, with an average elevation below 3,000 feet.

The eastern portion of Area V-E and the northeastern portion of Area III-B is an alluvial plain formed by the Yangtze River. It is drained by an intricate network of streams and canals and the flood hazard is not acute. Rice cultivation is the chief economy. Interrupted plains border the coasts of southern China, hilly Hainan, and mountainous Taiwan. All the southern coastal lowland is densely populated, and, here too, subsistence agriculture is the chief economy.

e. Clothing. Terrain affects the requirements for clothing primarily by its control over climate (temperature, rainfall, wind) and ground conditions; clothing needs therefore are discussed chiefly in later sections. The chief direct effect of terrain on clothing requirements is in mountains, which must be divided into elevation intervals or layers to show the change of requirements with height. Clothing Requirement Tables (at the end of the Almanac) list the items suitable, month by month, for each interval up to the height of the highest passes significant for troop movement. At still higher elevations, ground operations are essentially mountaineering, requiring troops which are specially trained, clothed, and equipped.

3. CLIMATE.

Examples of most of the various climatic conditions of the world occur in various parts of China and Korea, from the sticky heat of the subtropical southern coast to the year-round cold of the high mountains, the cool winters and warm summers of central China, and the cold windy winters and warm to hot summers of Manchuria and Mongolia. Nowhere else in the world are the temperature contrasts from winter to summer as great as in Manchuria and Mongolia.

a. Temperature. In winter, average daily temperatures generally decrease from south to north and from the sea towards the interior (Table 2). Average temperatures for January, the coldest month throughout most of the region, vary from -20° to -25° F in the northernmost portions to 66° F in the southernmost. The Parka-liner, pile, Parka-shell, cotton, od, and Boots, Arctic, felt (complete list, Table 7) are necessary for at least three months from October through April in most of Zones V and VII in China and Korea: Mongolia, Manchuria, Inner Mongolia, and portions of Shansi and Shensi provinces of China proper, and intermediate slopes of mountain ranges of Tibet, Tsinghai, Sikang and Korea. Cool weather items are advisable for at least three months during the semi-tropical winters of Southern China and Taiwan (Zone II).

Winters are much more severe north of the Tsinling Shan, Hwaiyang Shan, and other east-west ranges, where the unchecked cold air rushes in from regions farther north. Mid-winter temperatures are extremely low in the northern half of the region (including Northern Korea). South of the Tsinling and Hwaiyang Shan, winters are so mild that on most days the lowest temperatures are above freezing at stations below 5,000 feet in Szechwan and the remaining portion of southern China.

Additional items of clothing are needed in the interior plateaus and mountain areas where the variability and daily range of temperature are great. In the intermontane basins the winter temperature distribution is further complicated by temperature inversions in which the basin bottoms are hotter during the day and cooler at night than are the lower mountain slopes.

In summer the general distribution of the temperature is similar to that of winter but the rate of decrease from south to north and from the coast towards the interior is considerably less. In July, the warmest month throughout most of the region, the average temperature of valley or lowland stations varies from 50°F in the extreme northern portion of

Mongolia to 92°F in the Turfan Depression of Sinkiang and to 85°F in Taiwan and Hainan Island, the southernmost portions of the region. Thus, clothing requirements in summer vary from Cool to Hot weather clothing.

b. Precipitation. Precipitation comes largely in summer over most of China and Korea, even in the interior deserts and semi-arid areas where it is always scanty. Only along the coasts of China, Manchuria, Korea, and the islands is precipitation frequent and abundant in other seasons. Annual totals of precipitation generally decrease from south to north and inland from the coast towards the lofty ranges of the interior, beyond which precipitation is slight.

Summer, from late spring to early autumn, is the wettest season in all portions. Heavy showers are frequent over most of Korea, the coasts of Manchuria, the entire coast of China, the southern half of China proper and all the islands. The coastal portions and islands which are exposed to the moist winds of the summer monsoon, blowing from sea to land, always have wet summers while the interior portions experience serious floods in some summers and severe droughts in others. Most of the summer is sultry and damp in central and southern China, Korea, Taiwan and other islands. Keeping clothing dry and clean in such wet, muddy, and water-logged areas is a serious problem. The high humidity, in addition to the high temperatures and frequent rain, adds to the general oppressiveness of the summer climate in south China, Korea, and the islands. The interior portions of the continent, cut off from the oceanic influence by lofty mountain ranges, are dry. Unpredictable summer showers, sometimes extremely heavy and destructive, occur infrequently in limited areas of the desert.

The Poncho, lightweight, od or Raincoat provides protection against rain and mist in all seasons. Parka and Trousers, wet weather are recommended as suitable for certain combat support troops for rainy or misty periods during winter in Szechwan. Requirements imposed by snow are discussed under Ground Conditions.

c. Winds. Winds are closely associated with precipitation over much of China and Korea. The summer monsoon brings frequent and abundant precipitation, except for areas where the current of moist air from the sea is cut off by mountains. In winter the vigorous Siberian High, centered over northern Mongolia or the Lake Bykal Region, causes a flow of cold and dry air from the continent towards the sea. Only on the windward slopes of the islands and of southern Korea, where the winter winds have crossed open seas, is precipitation significant. The winter winds over much of the region are from the northwest and west, and often are very strong and bitterly cold.

At any temperature, clothing loses some of its insulation when the wind speed increases, so that heavier clothing is required in windy areas than in calm areas at the same temperature. The Parka-liner, pile & Parka-shell, cotton, od, and Mask, cheek protector, Arctic are recommended in some mountains and basins of the interior, where winds are strong in winter.

In the high plateaus and deserts of Mongolia, Sinkiang, and adjacent areas, spring is the windiest season. At times the dry winds blow at gale force (over 40 mph), causing severe dust whirls and dust storms.

During dust storms in winter and early spring in the Loess Plateau, northern China, Mongolia, Manchuria, and Korea (Areas V-C, V-D and V-B), special face protection, possibly a head-cloth, may be required.

Locally, winds become very strong in the gorges, mountain passes and the narrows of river valleys, especially during changes of weather. Winds of gale to hurricane force (75 mph) develop when Arctic air sweeps into the narrow mountain valley in the vicinity of Ebi Nor (Lake) in Area V-3. Mountain-valley breezes are a common phenomenon in all the mountainous areas: in mid-morning the wind begins to blow upward from the valley floor to the summit; after dark the flow reverses its direction.

Typhoons occur from June to November and consistently strike Taiwan, the Ryukyus, and the southern and southeastern coasts of China, several times each season. No portion of the coastal belt of the region is outside the typhoon danger zone. The hurricane winds, high tides, and torrential rains accompanying the typhoons are very destructive. North of the typhoon area, migratory low-pressure areas cause strong winds from late spring to early autumn, especially in the northeastern portion of China and Korea.

4. GROUND CONDITIONS.

"Wet-cold" and snow-covered surfaces are important terrain features affecting proper clothing protection, particularly footgear and camouflage requirements, in China and Korea. Deserts with sharp rocks and loose sand impose other requirements.

a. Wet-cold Ground. Ground may be considered "wet-cold" when it is moist, waterlogged, or covered with wet snow, and air temperatures average between 23° and 50°F. Shoepacs, which provide the best insurance against trenchfoot or other wet-cold ailments, are recommended for use on wet-cold ground. Both Shoepacs and Boots, service, combat, russet, however, may be indicated simultaneously in the tables for use during wet-cold periods. The combat boot, designed for use on dry ground, is satisfactory for garrison wear or operations confined to highways or well-drained routes

of movement. On the other hand, for field and off-highway operations, shoepacs are essential (Fig. 4).

Wet-cold ground is found over large areas of China and Korea, varying seasonally with latitude and elevation. Zones II and III (except for mountainous terrain) are generally free of wet-cold ground, since temperatures are normally high enough throughout the year to prevent it. Farther north, in the Szechwan Basin and Yangtze Plain (Areas V-F and V-E), conditions generally may be considered wet-cold in the winter, while in the Loess Plateau, southern Korea, and the Yellow River Plain (Areas V-C, V-E, and V-D), wet-cold conditions prevail in autumn, winter, and spring.

The winter season in Manchuria and northeastern Mongolia, which have average monthly temperatures below 23°F, (Areas V-A, V-B, VII-A, and VII-B), is "dry-cold" rather than wet-cold; however, wet-cold ground is typical of spring and autumn. The interior basins are characteristically dry at all seasons, but wet-cold conditions may exist for a short time after the infrequent rains of spring to autumn. Along the upper mountain slopes in China and Korea, wet-cold conditions are generally confined to summer.

b. Snow. Although snowfall has been recorded even at Canton on the China coast, the land surface of southern China (Zones II and III) is generally snow-free. Snow can be expected not more than once or twice during a winter, to remain on the ground no longer than one or two days. Within the Gobi and Takla Makan Deserts of the interior, (Areas V-B, V-G, and VII-B), light snow storms may occur on a few days in winter, but the snow evaporates rapidly in the dry cold air. In the heavier snowfall areas of the north and northeast (Areas V-A, V-B, VII-A, and VII-B) the ground may be snow-covered on one-third to one-half of the days from November through March. In the mountainous regions, snow cover appears earlier, becomes deeper and disappears later than in adjacent nonmountainous terrain; the high peaks are snow-covered in winter and some are snow-capped all year.

The snow camouflage uniform (Parka and Trousers, field, overwhite, and Mittens, overwhite) is listed in the tables for those months when a snow cover is probable. Snow cover in any given area, however, usually varies in depth and duration from one year to the next, and the actual amount of snow on the ground determines whether overwhites are needed on any day. Where the snow cover is broken by changes in the physical details of the landscape, such as from farms to a woodland, judicious use of snow camouflage is imperative. Partial use of overwhites may be better than full use: in snow-covered forests Trousers, overwhite only may provide more effective camouflage than the full overwhite assembly, as the dark upper clothing may blend more readily with the background of dark tree trunks.

c. Deserts. The coarse loose sand and sharp angular rocks of most deserts, including the extensive Chinese deserts, cause the rapid wearing out of shoes, tires, and other equipment which come in contact with them; the useful life of Army boots is probably about half as long in such deserts as in more humid areas where the ground is softer. Shovels, tent stakes, and similar equipment wear out quickly when used on the rocky and sun-hardened desert surfaces.

5. INSECTS AND OTHER PESTS.

Anti-insect items may be needed throughout China and Korea, except in the upper levels of mountain areas where insect activity is limited by low temperatures. Nuisance pests, plentiful in lowlands and low hilly areas, include gnats, horseflies, deer flies, stable flies, wasps, bees and biting ants. Disease-carrying pests include ticks, fleas, mites, chiggers, lice, sand flies, the common fly, anopheline mosquitoes, as well as aedes and culex mosquitoes. Pests which attack food include beetles, roaches, ants and a variety of other small bugs and caterpillars. These pests are active for periods ranging from 3 summer months in Manchuria and Mongolia to nearly the entire year along the south China coasts.

Mosquitoes are a problem in all landlocked coastal lagoons, and in paddies and other irrigated districts. They are of two types: (1) the night-biting carriers of malaria and filariasis, and (2) the daytime-biting carriers of dengue. In the dry interior basins, mosquito and other insect activity is generally confined to ponds in oases and some marshes in the summer months. Lice and mites carry the germs of typhus fever. Rat fleas are the chief carrier of plague. Flies may carry the germs of dysentery and typhoid fever.

Of the anti-insect items available, the Repellent, insect is the most useful for field-combat troops in most of China and Korea. In the southern forest sections, the Headnet, mosquito will be very usefull.

6. CLOTHING SUMMARY.

Clothing requirements for China and Korea, already discussed in part, are itemized in detail in the Clothing Requirement Tables. They may be summarized in four groups, each suitable for wear at different average monthly temperatures:

WARM Weather Clothing, above 68°F
COOL Weather Clothing, 50° to 68°F
COLD Weather Clothing, 14° to 50°F
VERY COLD Weather Clothing, below 14°F

For each Clothing Requirement Area, as shown on the map in the back of the Almanac, the months during which each of these groups of clothing items

are suitable for wear are indicated in Table 3. Lists of the clothing items making up each group are given in Tables 4, 5, 6, and 7. The items listed are primarily those suitable for wear by troops of Class A, B, and C units (T/A 21 Mbl, part I, par. 2b), defined as those which habitually operate in the forward active combat zone, or in the service area of the combat zone, where housing usually is not provided; these troops must have clothing suitable for 24-hour living outdoors. In addition, these tables indicate possible deletions or substitutions of items for use by troops of Class D and E units, whose normal working and living conditions, at airfields and other permanent or semi-permanent installations where housing is provided, are not as rigorous. Thus, these tables separate the items shown in the more detailed Clothing Requirement Tables in the back of the Almanac into two categories, according to the extent of shelter which the wearers will have. In addition, these summary tables list certain items, such as suspenders, belts, and helmet, not shown in the month-by-month tables.

Warm weather clothing (Table 7) provides the basic clothing needs of the combat soldier during summer, for six to eight months in southern China (Zone II and III Areas) and for three or four months in most of Korea and central and northern China (Zone V Areas). Cool weather clothing (Table 6) is needed everywhere in China and Korea at some time during the year: in summer (three months) in the extreme north (Zone VII Areas), in spring and fall in most of central China and Korea (Zone III and V Areas), and in winter in the extreme south (Zone II). Cold weather clothing (Table 5) is suitable for wear in spring and fall in the basins and plateaus of western China (Zone V Areas) and in the extreme north (Zone VII), and in winter in central China (Zone III) and the southern mountains (Zone II). Very cold weather clothing, sometimes termed "Arctic", (Table 4) is necessary during winter in the northern interior basins, and on the Manchurian Plain and the mountains of western China, eastern Manchuria and northern Korea.

7. SUPPLEMENTARY ARMY PUBLICATIONS.

Information concerning the construction, function, manner of wear, and approved methods of care of each item of clothing may be found in one or more of the following Army Publications:

a. FM 31-70: Arctic Operations (March 1949). Chapter 3, Clothing and Individual Equipment, summarizes the general principles of cold-weather clothing and describes many of the clothing and equipment items designed for use in the Arctic and Sub-Arctic.

b. TM 10-275: Principles of Cold Weather Clothing and Equipment (October 1944). The proper use, care, and maintenance of cold weather clothing and equipment are discussed for the principal items protecting the body, the feet, the hands, and the head. The principles of insulation on the layer basis, proper fitting and sizing of clothing, the importance of clean and dry clothing, and the relationships between body activity and clothing amounts are emphasized. Specifications are furnished as to the actual temperatures when certain outer protective items of clothing and equipment are to be worn.

c. TM 1-240: Arctic Manual (January 1944). Chapter 4, Clothing and Equipment, generalizes the information contained in the TM 10-275 (October 1944) with special emphasis on problems of the Arctic environment. A section on summer clothing, p. 125, indicates the problems of insects, wet ground surfaces, and the very variable climatic conditions.

d. FM 70-15: Operations in Snow and Extreme Cold (November 1944). Chapter 3, Clothing, a generalization of TM 10-275, and Chapter 9, Equipment, are of special interest.

e. FM 70-10: Mountain Operations (September 1947). Chapter 1, General Considerations; Chapter 4, Conditioning and Acclimatization; Chapter 6, Weather; and Chapter 7, Winter Characteristics, discuss the relationship between the soldier and the mountain environment.

f. FM 21-75: Individual Clothing and Equipment (April 1945). Emphasis is placed on the care of clothing and equipment and methods of assembling and packing.

g. TM 10-228: Fitting of Shoes and Socks (February 1946). The importance of proper shoe fitting methods, foot measuring equipment and procedures, sock fitting and size correlation, and size data for boots and shoes, including approved sock combinations, are the more important sections of this manual.

h. FM 72-20: Jungle Warfare (October 1944). Of special value are Chapter 1, General Characteristics of the Jungle; Chapter 2, Health and Hygiene and Sanitation; Chapter 3, Jungle Service; Chapter 4, Jungle Operations; Appendix I, Native Plants; and Appendix II, Use of Jungle Machete.

i. Films and Film Strips. Various films and strips demonstrating the proper use and care of cold weather clothing are available. Films showing the operations of task forces and exercises conducted recently in the Arctic are sources of pertinent information concerning clothing requirements.

8. CLOTHING REQUIREMENT TABLES.

The 38 clothing tables for the 20 Clothing Requirement Areas of China and Korea are arranged according to Clothing Allowance Zones, those of Zone II being followed by those of Zone III, Zone V and Zone VII. Within each Zone, the tables for nonmountainous areas come first, in alphabetical order; the mountain area tables follow in numerical order, with the tables for the lowest elevation of each area coming first, then for upper levels in ascending order.

Areas to which tables apply are shown on the folding map in the back. For most effective use of the tables, especially in the selection from them of clothing items best suited to the individual location and year, the preceding text should be consulted.

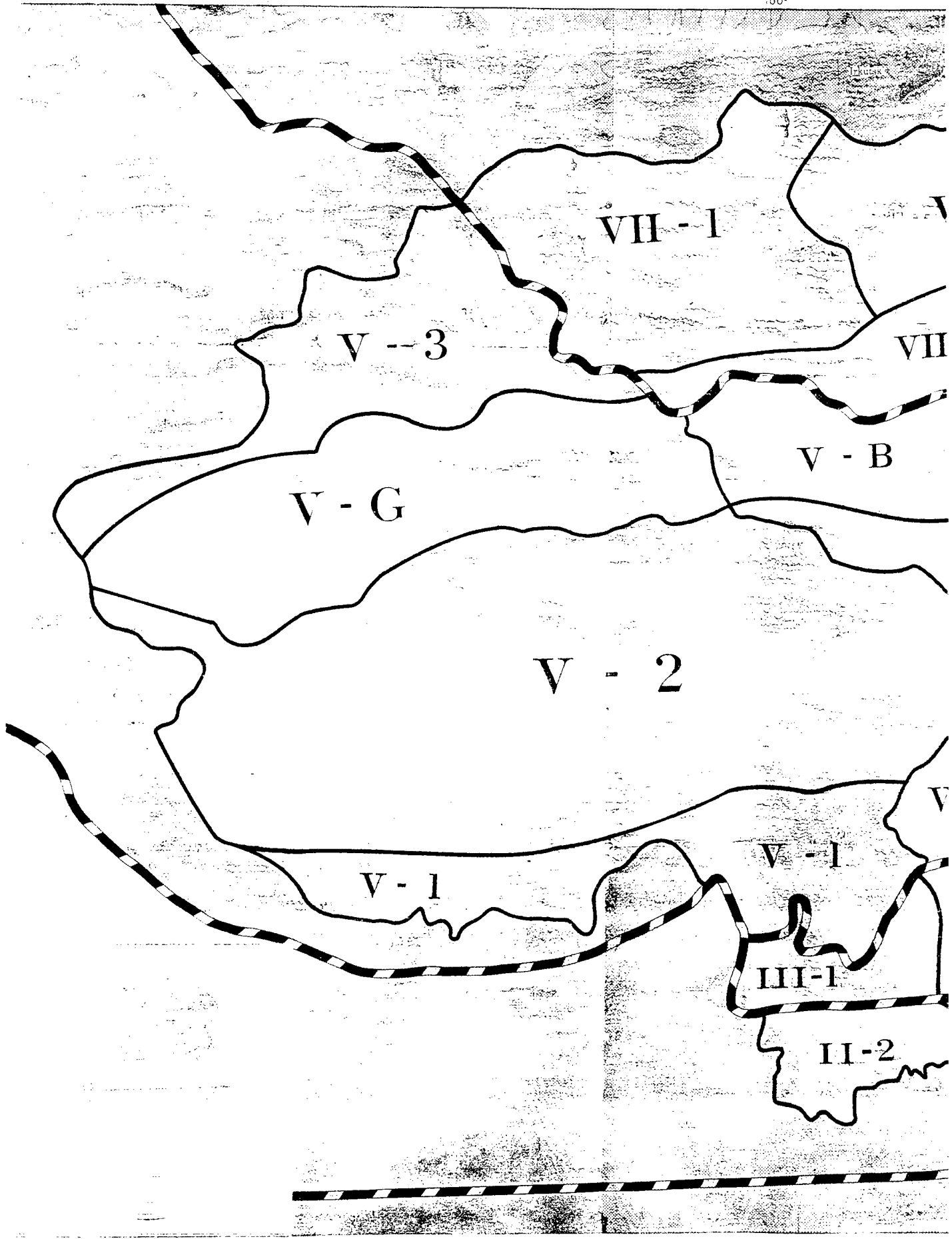

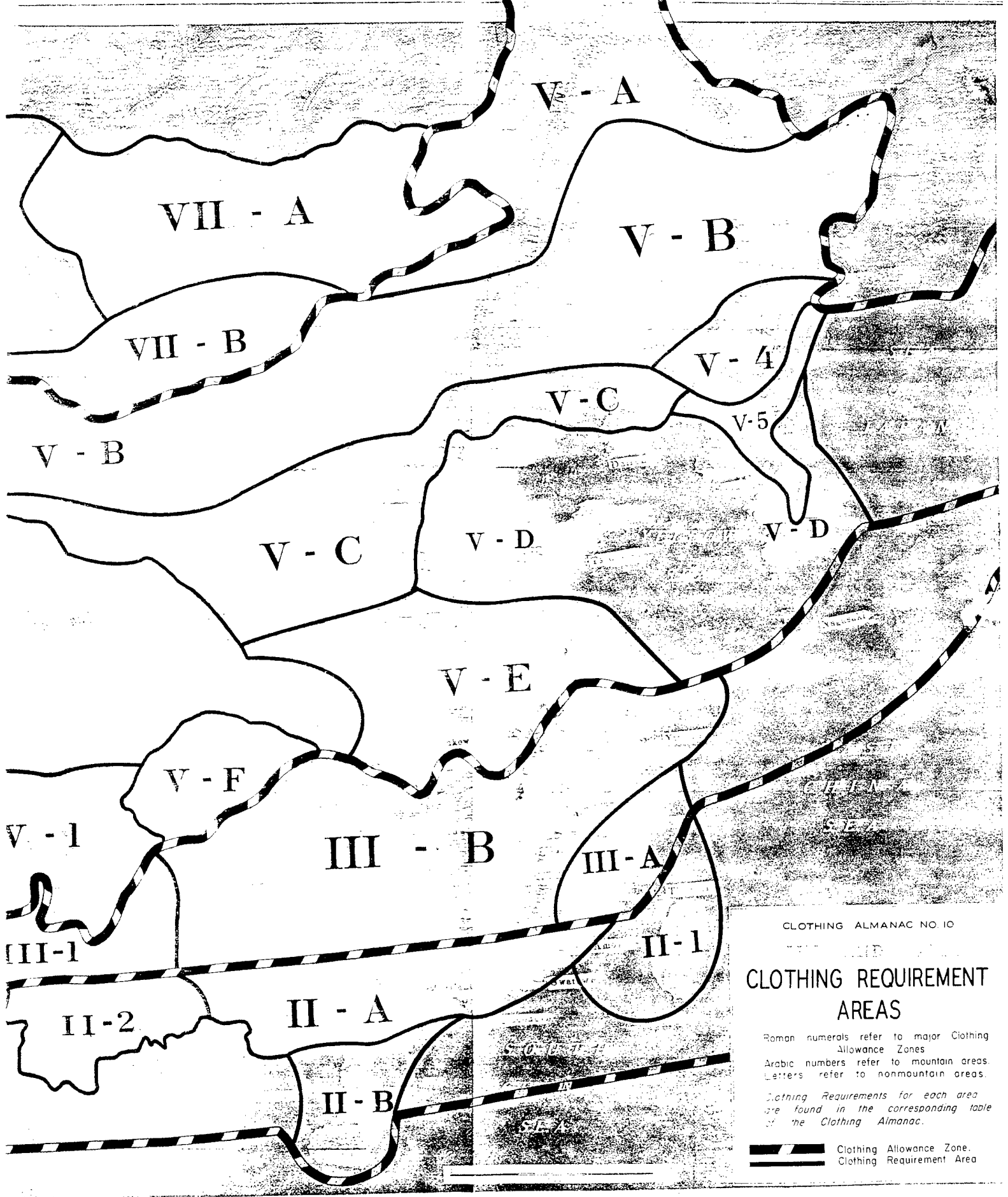
