ACKNOWLEDGMENT

This report involves a research project managed by National Steel and Shipbuilding Company for the National Shipbuilding Research Program (NSRP) under contract number N5-92-3 between the U.S. Department of the Navy's Carderock Division of the Naval Surface Warfare Center and National Steel and Shipbuilding Company.

The NSRP is a joint government and industry program dedicated to improving productivity of the shipbuilding and repair industry by developing and implementing new ideas, technologies and equipment in the United States shipyards, both private and public.

This research project was commissioned by Panel SP-5 (Human Resource Innovation Panel.) The members of the Panel are composed primarily of naval and commercial shipyard managers and leaders of labor unions who represent employees of several of those shipyards and, also, includes representatives of the U.S. Navy and the Maritime Administration.

The purpose of the Workers' Compensation Cost Containment research project is to reduce the rate of increase of workers' compensation costs and improve the competitiveness of the shipbuilding and repair industry. With the help of the shipyards that participated in the study, we have been able to obtain a significant amount of detailed information concerning the principle element of workers' compensation costs.

This study has identified the key components of cost containment programs. This project has provide participating yards with the base line information, so that they can make comparisons and evaluate their current policies. A number of new initiatives in cost containment have been tested in some shipyards, and with the consent of these participating yards, details of their initiatives are included in the report.

Input from selected representatives of the shipyards identified regulatory and statutory changes that could reduce cost and improve the efficiency of benefit administration under the Longshore and Harbor Workers' Act. These proposed changes are detailed in this report.

Thomas Fawcett, project manager, developed the goals of the project and its budget and obtained the approval of the NSRP Panel. He co-authored the survey with the project investigator, E. Paul Goyette and the NSRP Panel. The investigator held face-to-face discussions with the representatives from each yard and assisted in the completion of the survey. The investigator, with the project manager, compiled the results and co-authored the report.

OVERVIEW

Workers' Compensation Cost Containment Program

The project manager, the project investigator and each of the department heads in Safety, Claims and Medical at National Steel and Shipbuilding Company developed the questionnaire and made suggestions that were incorporated into the survey. This draft questionnaire was then sent to the members of the SP-5 Panel for their comments and suggestions. This procedure produced the final form of the survey which can be seen in Appendix I of this report.

NASSCO's investigator drafted a letter of introduction for the survey with the SP-5 Panel impute that was then signed by Donald Spanninga, Vice Chairman NSRP, Executive Control Board. This letter and the survey were sent to each of the shipyards. A copy of this letter can be reviewed in Appendix II. The project investigator followed up on the mailing and contacted each of the yards to schedule an on-site visit. During the visit the project investigator helped in completion of the survey and discussed some cost-saving initiatives which had been approved for sharing by other yards.

The critical factor in obtaining the cooperation of the participating yards was the issue of confidentiality. The agreements that were reached in this area are the following:

- The shipyards agreed to be identified as participants in the survey.
- The data in the report would not be identified by individual shipyards.
- The Cost Containment Program initiated by various shipyards could not be incorporated into this report without their permission.
- For a shipyard to be identified as author of a program, separate approval is required.
- Any portion of the report that identifies a shipyard will be sent to that yard with right to veto its incorporation in the report.
- Each shipyard had the right not to answer any question in the survey that they felt was proprietary in nature.

The survey did not require any of the participants to identify dollar costs associated with workers' compensation payments but, rather, used percentages to substitute for dollar figures. In this report those percentages will be used to present baseline information for comparison purposes. The report will identify high, low and average percentages, and the factors that affected the low numbers will be discussed. All shipyard representatives would like to participate in a workshop where they would draft the final recommendations of this

study. An issue that was not addressed in the survey but was discussed at each site visit was the benefit of regulatory and statutory changes that would improve the efficiency of the administration system of the Longshore and Harbor Workers' Act. This will be addressed in Section 4 of this report. The following shipyards participated in the survey:

There was only one yard that was approached that did not want to participate in the survey. The reception at each yard was warm, cordial and cooperative with the investigator.

This report is divided into five Sections and two Appendices. Three of the Sections will deal with the three parts of the questionnaire, Safety, Medical and Claims. The fourth Section will deal with the regulatory and statutory changes, while the fifth Section will be a summary of the finding of this report. In those Sections that deal with statistics, we will identify the high, low and average statistics. We will then discuss programs that reduce those statistics. The recommendations in the summary should be the product of the workshop. The Appendices will comprise a copy a copy of Donald Spanninga's letter requesting the cooperation of the shipyards in the study and a copy of the U.S. Department of Labor, Longshore and Harbor Workers' Compensation Program, LS Allocation Control Report for 1995.

In order to validate the findings of this study, we will be using the Department of Labor annual report on payments reported by self-insured employers. This report identifies the amount of indemnity payments made by a self-insured employer during a one year period. This report is attached as Appendix II. The indemnity payments can be divided by the number of employees of a self-insured employer to give an estimate for the cost per employee. This cost per employee can be used as a yardstick to evaluate the success of the various cost containment programs.

SECTION I

SAFETY

Q1. Does your company involve your employees in a process improvement program?

Thirteen companies reported that they did involve their employees in a process improvement program. Three companies did not have their employees involved.

Q 2. Has the improvement of your production process enhanced your safety record?

Seven companies reported that there was no effect from improved production methods on their safety record. Six companies indicated that there were substantial improvements, and three companies reported slight improvements.

Q 3. Do you have a joint union and management safety committee?

Eight companies do have joint union and management safety committees and eight companies do not.

Q3a. If you have answered the above question in the affirmative, please list the successful programs that have originated from the joint committee.

Five companies established joint inspection procedures; three established joint accident investigation procedures; one company established a joint safety awards program; one company established a joint safety shoe program and kevlar gloves and forearm protectors for electrical employees. All the yards that used a joint union and management committee praised it as an excellent communication tool. One company established a safety action team with excellent results.

Q3b. What policies have you instituted for your joint meeting that improved their effectiveness?

Companies found that goal setting sessions working with a budget improved the effectiveness of the joint meeting. Other companies have used Robert Rule of Order and established agendas prior to the meetings.

Q4. What OSHA standards do you utilize that are not cost justified?

One of the companies indicated that the Arsenic and Cadmium were not cost justified. Four companies indicated that the lead standard was not cost justified.

Q5. Should the number of physical exams for the lead screening program be driven by the results?

Ten companies agree that the number of physical exams should be driven by the results, and three companies disagreed.

Q6. What is the ratio of full time staff safety personnel to production workers?

The lowest ratio for safety personnel to production workers was one safety personnel for 50 production workers, and the highest ratio is one for every 1,250 production workers.

Q7. What is the brand name of the software you use to maintain your OSHA statistics?

Some of the companies used the following products: Safety Track, RAG Master, Claims Expert, OSHA Tree, Healthnet .Ten companies developed their own software to track their OSHA statistics.

Q8. What are the features of the software that you most prefer?

The automation of data collection for the OSHA 200 Log. The ability to sort and generate reports for any data elements and the system is user friendly.

Q9. How would you rate the quality of the accident investigation performed by production supervision?

Nine companies rated the performance of the production supervision accident investigation as average. Four companies rated it as poor.

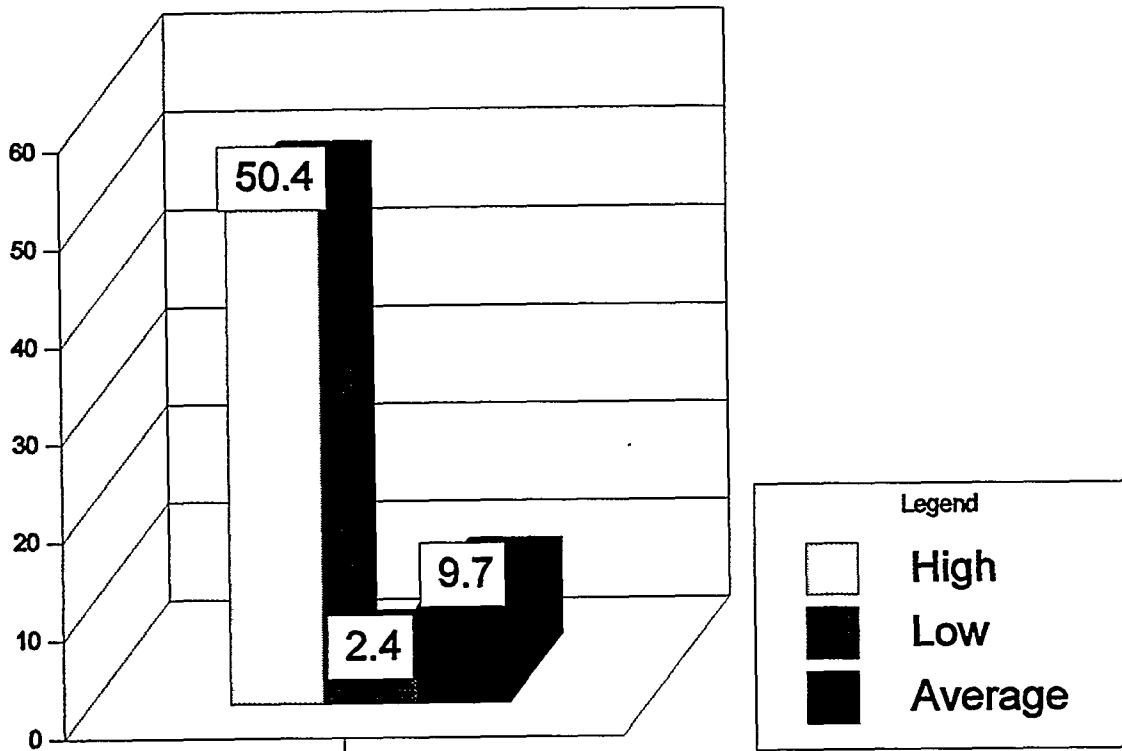
Q10. Describe the last two programs that you have implemented that have reduced your accident rate.

There were five programs identified by companies who had obtained above average results. These programs will be discussed in the summary of the safety section.

Q11. What was your company's loss time incident rate in 1994?

Lost time injuries x 200,000
Divided by hours worked = Lost Time Incident Rate

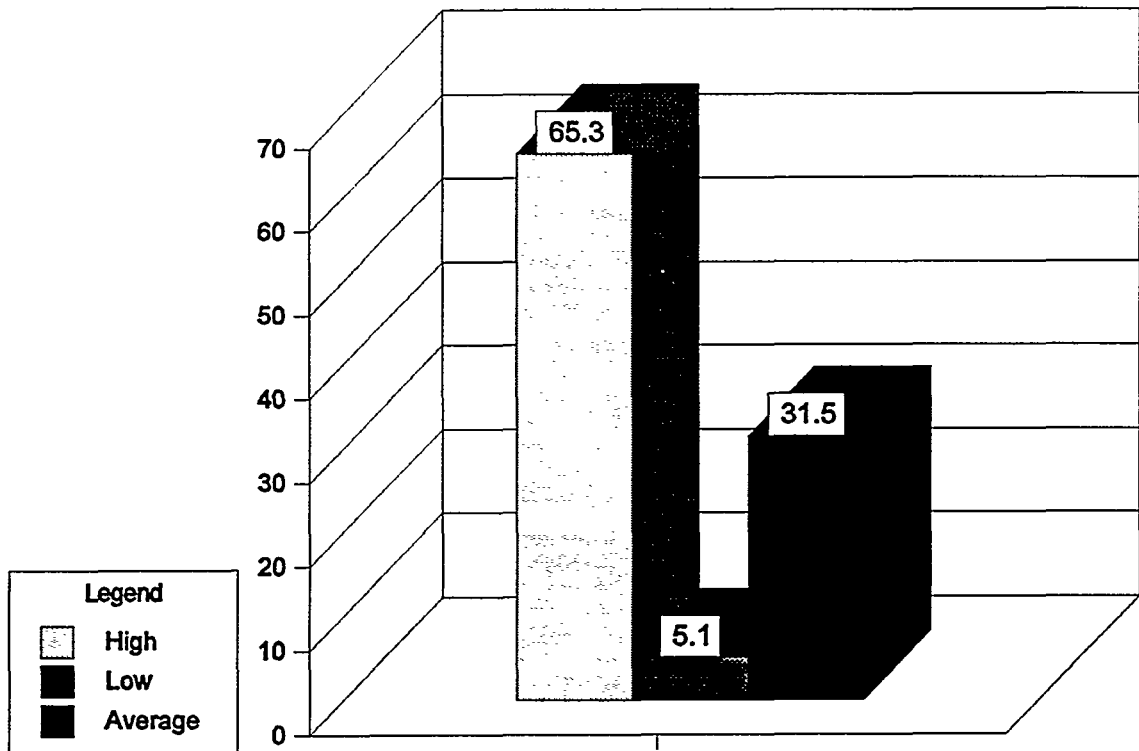
Lost Time Incident Rate

Each of the shipyards that were visited had a significant safety program which included full-time safety personnel. Some yards augmented their staff with union representatives. All yards had an extensive safety training program with particular emphasis given to new-hires. At each yard management supported the safety program, yet the recorded safety statistics indicate varying results.

One of the characteristics of the successful yard appeared to be environmental in nature in that small to medium-size yards with stable employment seem to have an advantage in maintaining good safety statistics. However, some yards had programs that produced better than average results. Five of those programs will now be discussed.

New Hire Program

A yard which was visited recognized that it was experiencing a disproportionate number of accidents from new-hires. So, it instituted a program where the new-hires' hard hat would be identified with a strip of tape indicating that he/she is a new-hire. For all tasks assigned to the new-hire, an experienced employee was required to be a partner. The experienced individual was responsible for educating the new-hire on the safety requirements of the tasks being performed. This program brought about a significant reduction in accidents for new-hires.

Journeyman/Helper

This program is similar to the new-hire program in that it makes an experienced employee, the journeyman, responsible for the education of the helpers assigned to him/her for safety procedures.

Process Improvement

In a yard by trade class, there are quarterly process improvement meetings in which the processes involved in construction for the last quarter are reviewed for potential improvement in efficiency. This is a very formal process. If the new, improved process is accepted, it is written up as a job procedure which is required to address any new safety exposures created by this procedure.

Incentive Program

A number of yards have various types of incentive programs. However, one yard had an incentive program that involved 95% of the workers in an after hours function.

Ratio of Safety Personnel to Production Workers

In reviewing the safety statistics from the fourteen yards, it would appear that there is a relationship between the number of individuals that are responsible for safety inspections and investigations and the results a yard obtains.

SUMMARY

The unifying principle apparent in all of these programs is that they increase the participation of employees in the safety program which has resulted in decrease in number of accidents and lost time days.

SECTION II

MEDICAL

Administration.

Q1. Do you contract out your medical services?

Thirteen companies contract out all or some of their medical services; three do not.

Q2. If the answer to the question above is yes, what medical services do you contract out?

Seven companies contract out pre-employment physical. Thirteen companies contract out their drug screening programs. Six contract out OSHA screening exams. Four contract out hearing exams, and three contract out vision exams.

Q3. What are the basic services provided by your Medical Department?

Nine companies perform their own pre-employment physical. Sixteen companies draw their own blood for their drug screening program. Sixteen companies provide first aid treatment. Ten companies do their own OSHA screening exams. Twelve provide their own hearing exams, and thirteen do their own eye exams.

Q4. Are your medical records computerized?

Three companies out of sixteen had their medical records computerized.

Q5. If the answer to the above question is yes, what safety system do you use?

Two of the companies created their own software. One used a software called Safety Base.

a. Are you satisfied with the system?

All three companies were satisfied with their systems.

b. What are the features you most like about your system?

All three indicated that their systems were user-friendly and helped them to maintain accurate medical records.

c. What features of your system would you like to improve?

One company would like to have the system track restricted work days. The other two had no comment.

Q6. Does your Medical Department have access to your employee group health records?

Five companies do have access to the group health records; eleven do not.

Only three companies tracked their physical therapy costs. Two of them indicated that their Medical Department handled 10% of their physical therapy costs. One indicated that it performed 70% of its physical therapy costs.

Q6. Does your Medical Department monitor the outside medical treatment of industrial injuries?

Q7. On average how long does your Medical Department treat an industrial injury before referring the employee to an outside specialist?

The range of treatment period encompasses from three days to one month for the sixteen companies.

Q8. Does your Medical Department provide prescription drugs for industrial injuries?
 Yes - 8 companies No - 8 companies

Q9. Do you provide an immunization program for employees through your Medical Department?

One company uses only blood; four use only urine. Three companies use blood, urine and breath. Three companies use urine and breath; four use only breath. One company did not respond.

Summary

On- site medical facilities are a key tool in controlling the loss of production manhours. Shipyards that maximize the use of the medical department for providing for physical therapy and on site medical treatment particularly for employee on modified work substantially reduce their workers compensation medical costs.

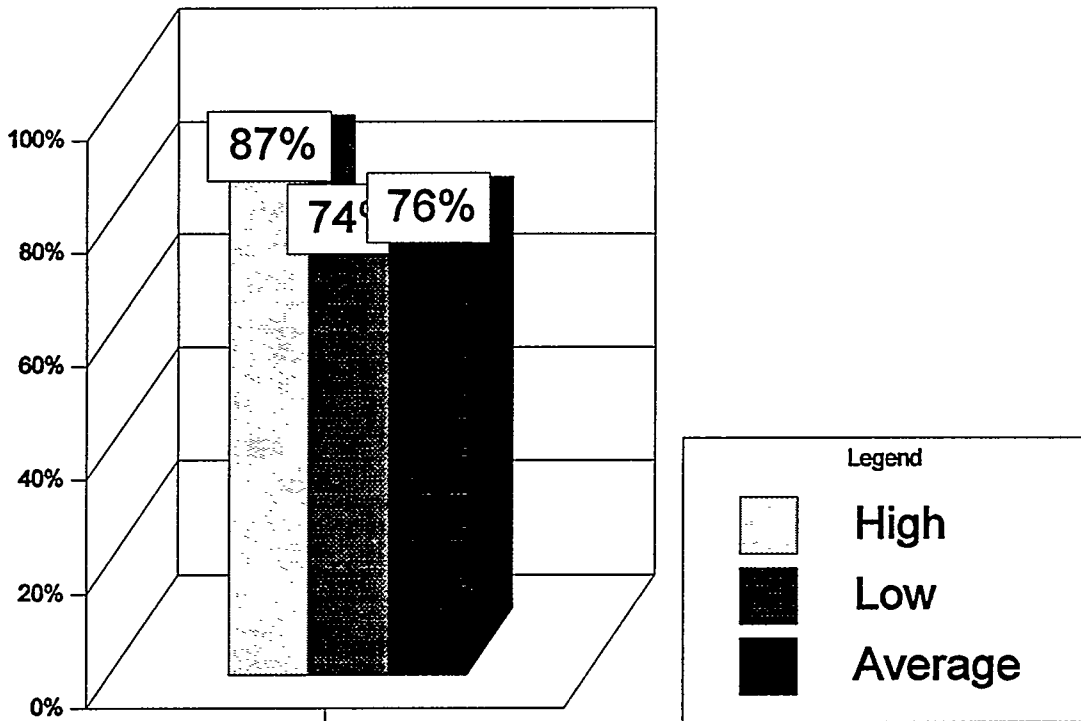

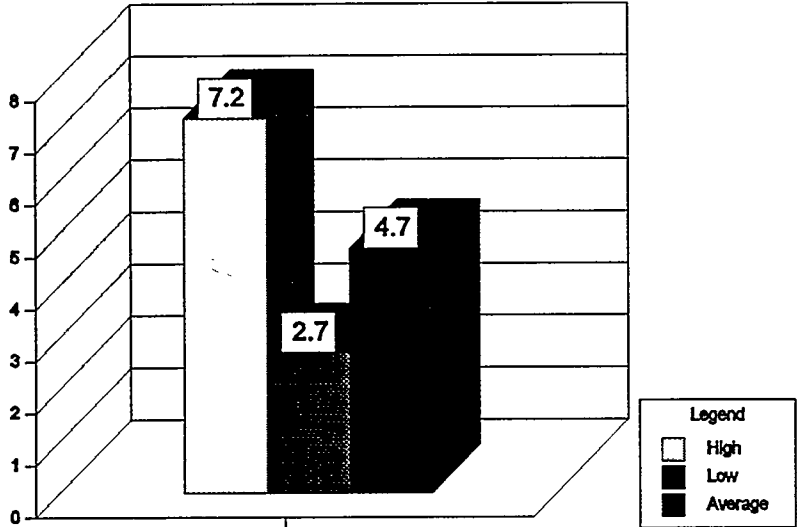

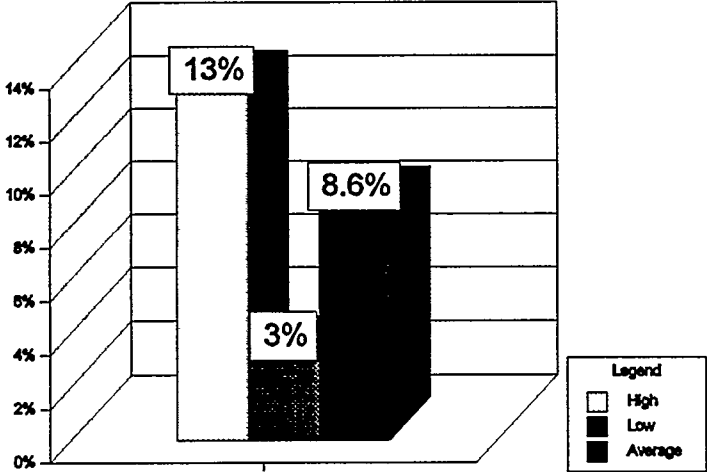

Administration Costs

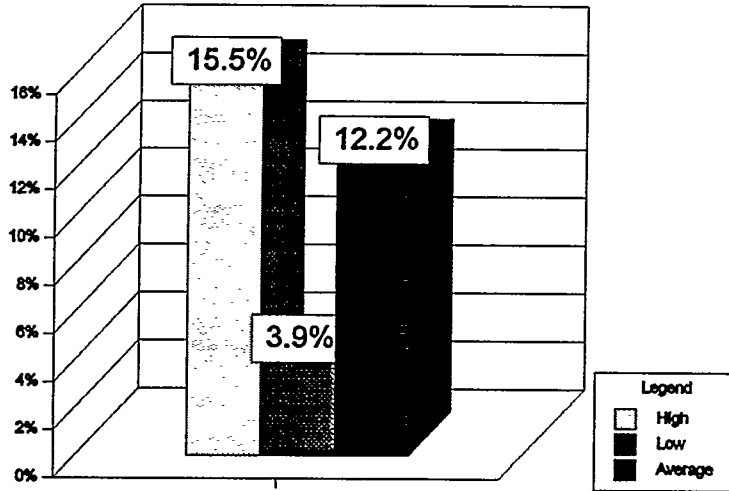

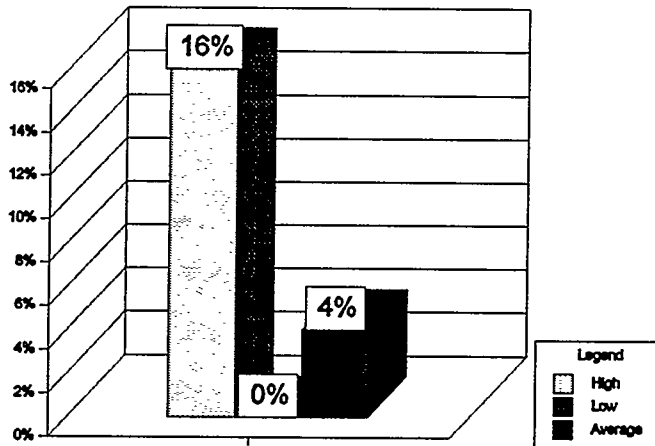

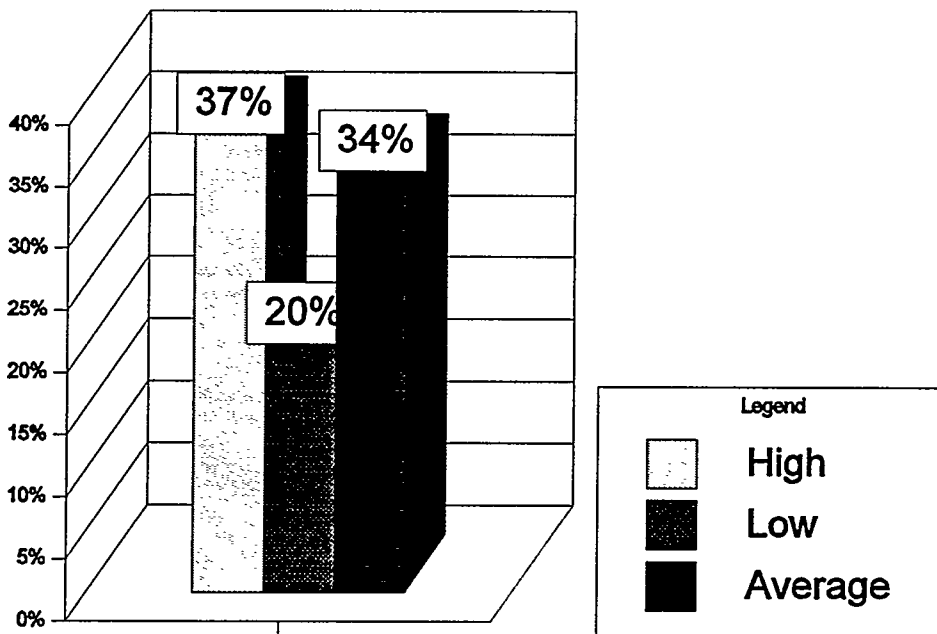

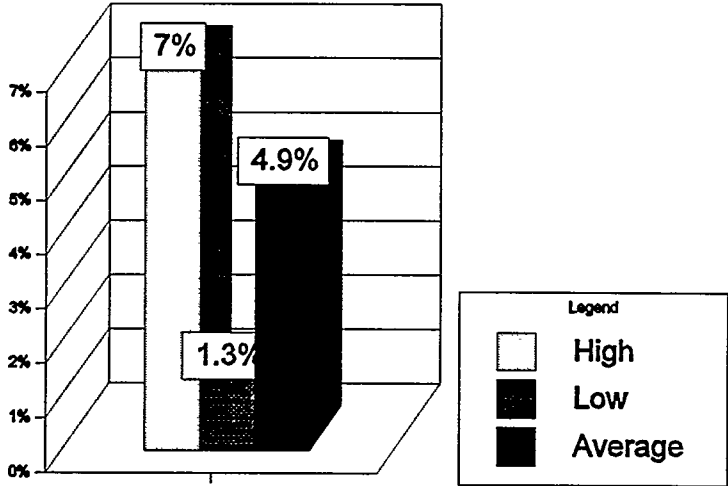


Permanent Disability

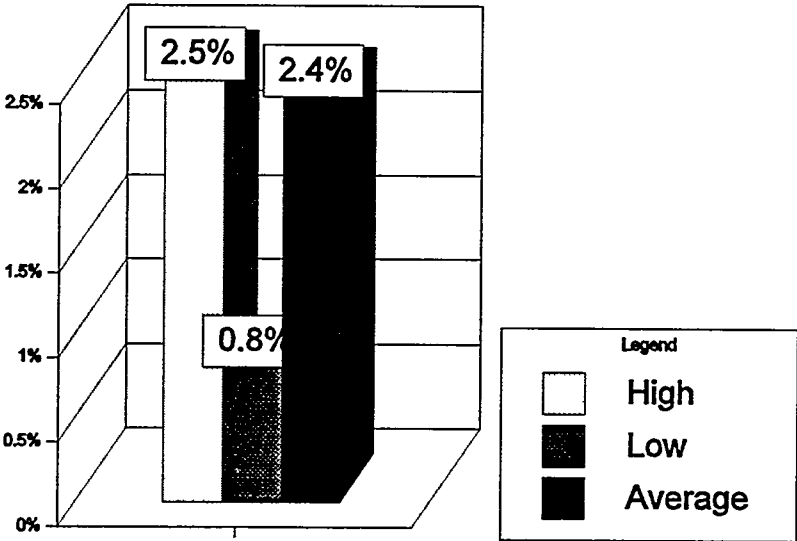

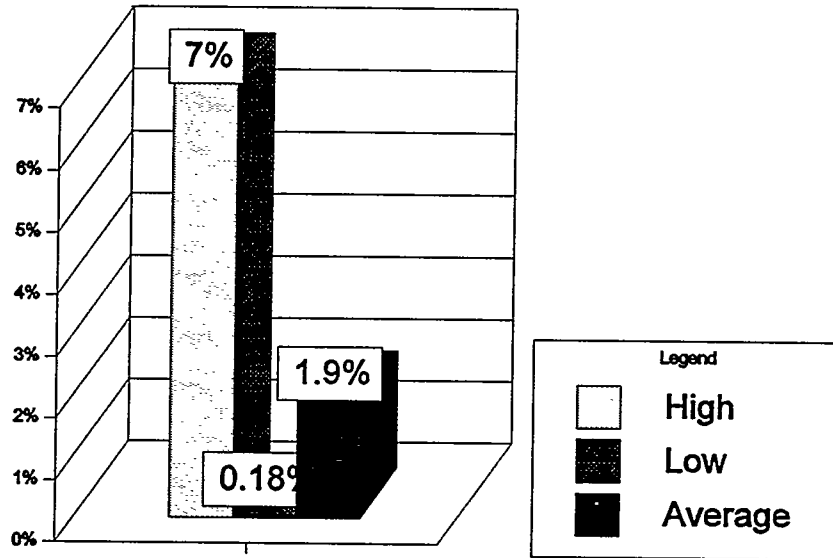

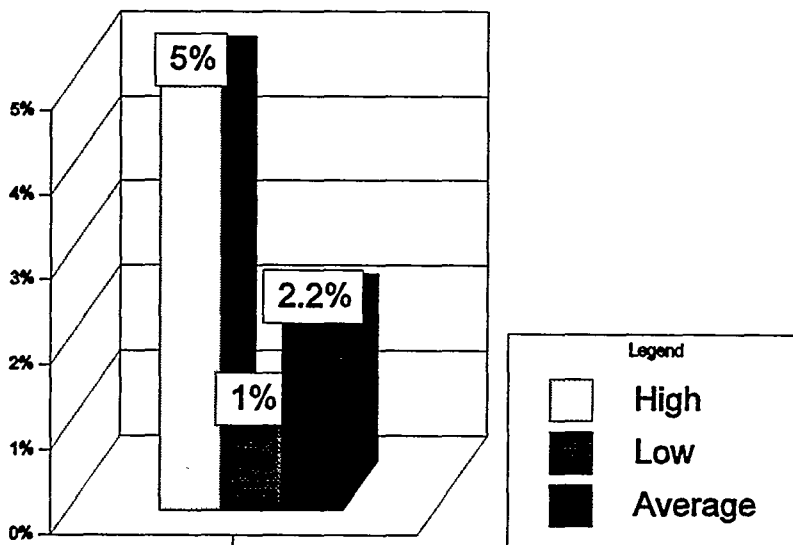

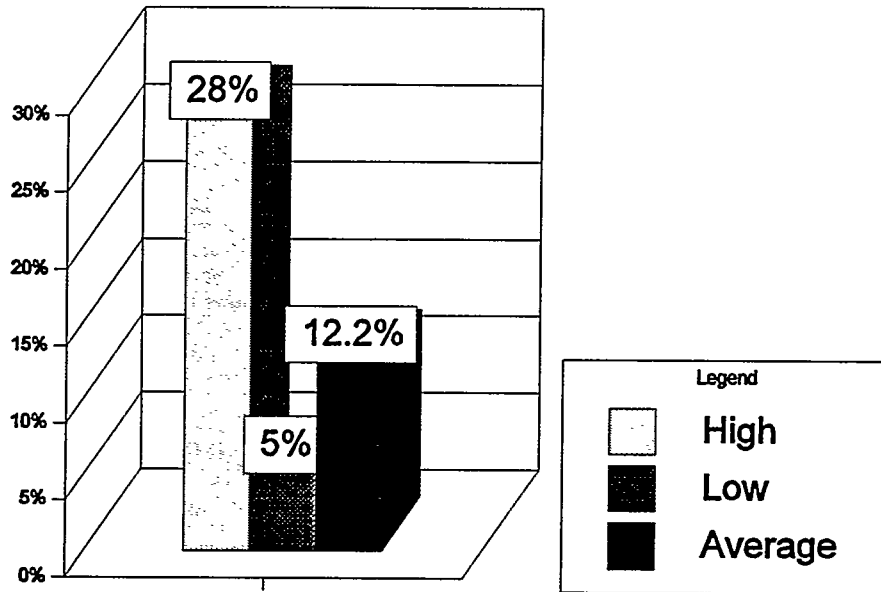

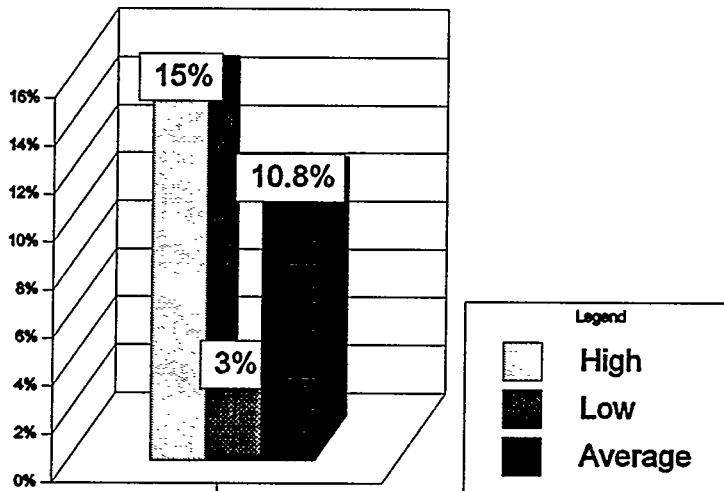

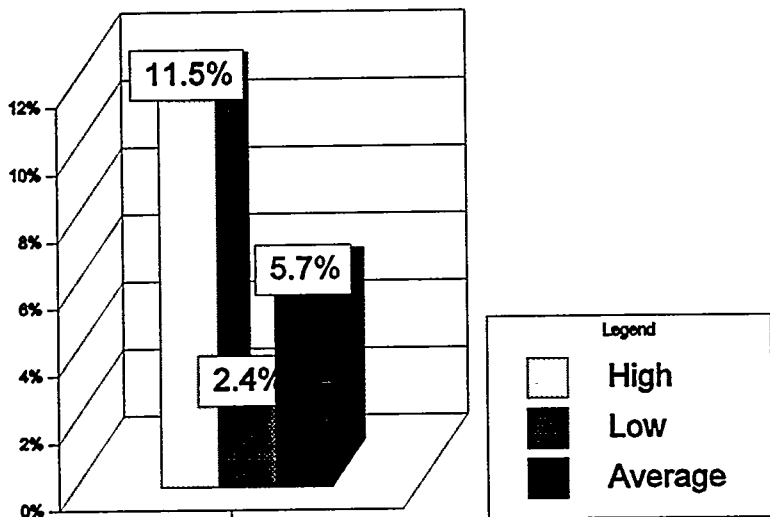


Physical Therapy

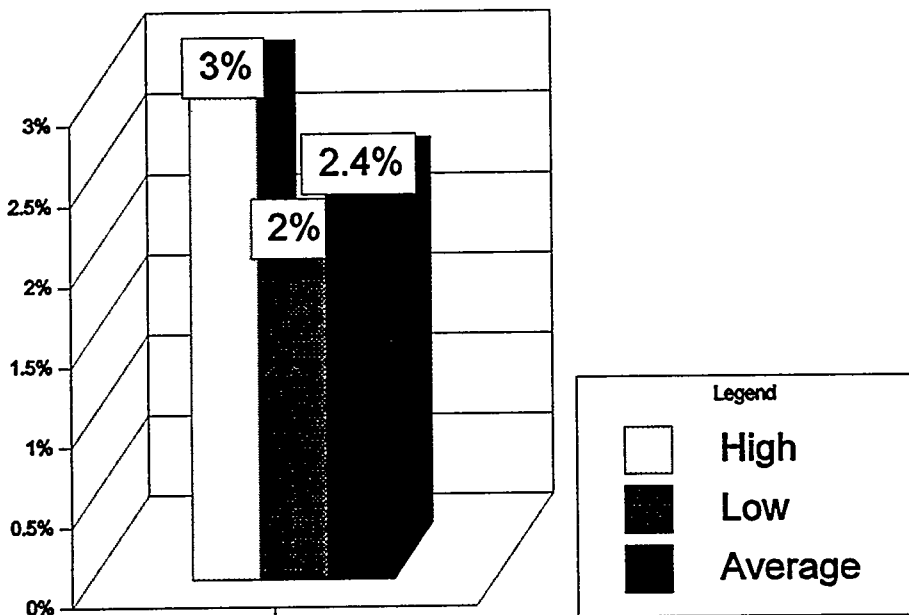

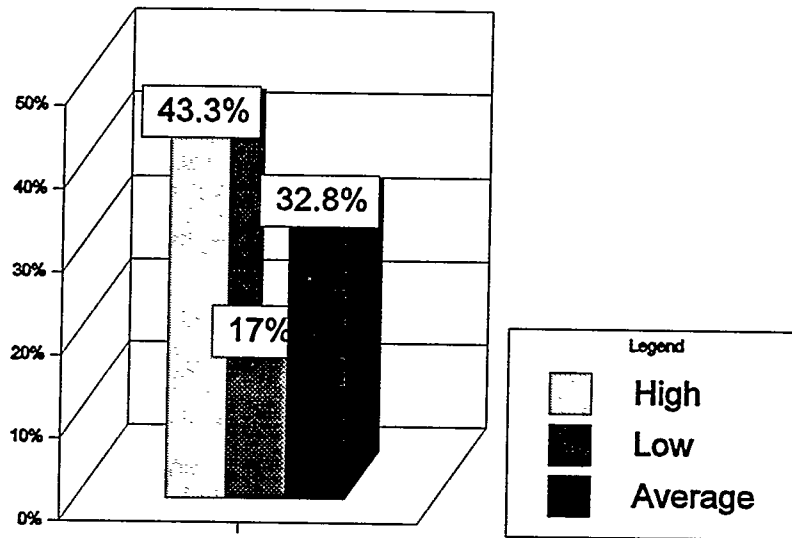


Prescription Drugs

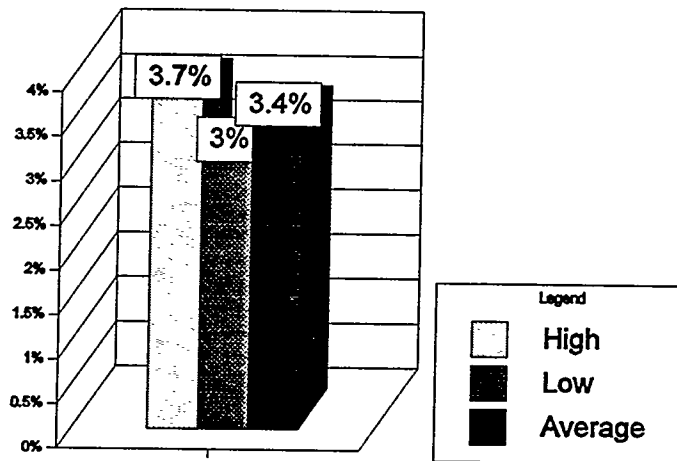

This resolution system involves the hiring of retired administrative law judges to act as arbitrators in voluntary settlement negotiations. The agreement reached would be submitted to the local Department of Labor office for approval. This reduced the litigation period for one yard by 40%.

Competing and Unbundling Auxiliary Medical Services

A number of yards put out for bid physical therapy, diagnostic studies and prescriptions on a biannual basis which has resulted in a significant cost reduction.

Use of Surgery Centers in Lieu of Hospitals

Shipyards that were in rural areas made exceptional use of surgery centers for wrist, elbow, shoulder and knee surgeries. Their hospital cost was reduced by 40%.

Litigation Control Measures

Several yards set up a formalized program that would require defense firms to set budgets and estimates as to litigation cost. The program also involved a process review aimed at reducing cost on any new litigating case from lessons learned.

Claims Load Per Examiner

In general, yards that maintain a case load of less than 100 claims per Examiner obtained better than average financial results. However, there was one yard which was an exception.

Medical Fee Schedule

A number of yards used the Medicare fee schedule with substantial savings. During the period that this survey was occurring, the Department of Labor came out with a new fee schedule specifically aimed at claims under the Longshore and Harbor Workers' Act.

Medical Case Management

A number of private and Naval shipyards use the case management system. This system uses a nurse or equally qualified medical practitioner to manage the medical treatment of the injured employee. This program has a number of benefits in that the nurse is seen in a non-adversarial light by the employee since she is not a part of the claims procedure. The nurse relates well with the treating physician because of his/her medical training. When issues that arise over the extent and nature of the medical treatment, he/she is in a better position to resolve them with the treating physician than the claim examiner. The amount of time involved in medical disputes are reduced with a significant saving in claims costs.

SUMMARY

In summary the medical management of cost and duration of treatment produced a synergic effect on total claims costs. This process not only reduced the medical bills but also had the effect of reducing disability costs. The claims load of the examiner could be directly related to effectiveness of reducing total claim costs.

SECTION IV

COST CONTAINMENT THROUGH REGULATORY AND STATUTORY CHANGES

Even though the survey did not address the issue of regulatory and statutory change, the issue was discussed at each site, and all parties felt there was a need for some statutory change. In general, suggestions were aimed at improving the delivery system without affecting the benefits of the injured worker. The four suggestions discussed were the following:

Medical Conflict of Interest

There was a general concern that treating physicians would over-prescribe auxiliary medical services if they had a financial interest. A conflict of interest provision in the law would require the payor to be notified whenever the treating physician had an ownership interest in auxiliary services. The payor had the right to object to such treatment. It is the belief that the statutory change would result in reduced medical and disability cost.

Medical Dispute Resolution System

Currently, medical disputes are resolved by obtaining a minimum of three medical exams from different doctors. The dispute resolution system would allow the parties to use only one medical opinion to determine the extent of disability. If the claim were litigated, a list of three doctors would be provided by the Department of Labor to the disputing parties, and each party would have the right to remove one doctor. The remaining doctor would resolve the dispute.

Alternate Legal Dispute Resolution System

This suggested statutory change would legalize the use of retired administrative law judges in the litigation system of the Longshore Act. The judge would have the same authority as if he/she were still active on the bench. This procedure would substantially reduce the waiting period for trials and have a positive cost effect.

Labor Management Compensation System

This statutory procedure has been used by a number of states to allow the employers to opt out of the compensation system if they provided a system which provided benefits that were equal with those provided by the Longshore Act. The procedures for dispute resolution would be addressed in the labor agreement. Those companies that have utilized this new procedure have experienced a significant reduction in cost.

SECTION V

RECOMMENDATIONS

Safety

Each employer should strive to increase the number of employees in participation in Safety supervision.

Medical

Move from the fee-for-service concept of paying medical cost to the prepaid programs. These programs will be discussed at length in the workshop that will be held in 1996.

Maximize the use of your on-site medical facility

Claims

Shipyards should monitor on a routine basis the double digit expenses that make up medical and indemnity payments.

Litigation control program should be part of your claims administration package.

Reduce the claims load per examiner.

Statutory Change

Labor and management should pursue legislative improvements to the Longshore Act that speed up dispute resolution.

They should also discuss the conflict of interest issues that arise from medical treatment.

Recommendation Continued

Naval Shipyards

Naval Shipyards have a different set of problems as compared to their private counterparts. The key differences are that they are a public agency and work under a different workers' compensation act. The Federal Employees' Compensation Act controls the benefits paid to an injured worker in a Naval yard. The Department of Labor did provide some benchmarking percentages of their total claims costs that apply in aggregate to all Naval Shipyards; They are as follows:

- **Claims Costs..... 97%**
- **Administration..... 03%**

- **Medical..... 26%**
- **Temp. Disability.....13%**
- **Permanent Disability.....53%**
- **Death Benefits..... 6%**
- **Legal Defense..... .2%**
- **Rehabilitation..... .8%**

Naval Shipyards have very low litigation and administrative costs associated with their workers' compensation injuries. The Naval Shipyards make excellent use of government provided medical facilities in reducing their medical cost. They have high Permanent Disability and Death Benefits percentages.

Recommendations

Claims

Change the regulations to require the free choice physician to utilize government facilities for his/her prescription of physical therapy and diagnostic Tests.

Reduce the claim inventory of the federal claims examiner.

Increase the effectiveness and use of rehabilitation.

In a report dated January 1, 1995, the Department of Labor announced that workers' compensation payments made by the maritime industry had increased by 9.5% over the previous year's report. This increase was three times the rate of inflation. The shipbuilding and repair industry has reported annual payments of more than \$105,000,000 for Longshore and Harbor Workers' benefits. These payments did not include an additional \$35,000,000 paid annually for the assessment to the Special Fund. Therefore the shipbuilding and repair industry is paying out over \$140,000,000 yearly for federal workers' compensation. The rate of increase of workers' compensation costs is a serious drain on shipyard productivity and leads to non-competitive overhead rates. Your workers compensation's carrier can confirm some of this information from data provided by the Department of Labor in their billing for the Special Fund assessment.

To help lower these costs for our industry, the National Shipbuilding Research Program, Human Resource Innovation: Panel 5 project has been initiated(See attached booklet on NSRP) which, with your help, will collect a significant amount of detail information concerning the principle elements of workers' compensation cost containment programs currently in effect in American shipyards. From this data the project would distinguish the central elements of the cost containment programs. The data that is collected could then be used to provide baseline information so that the participating yards can make comparisons and evaluations of their own current policies. An additional goal of this project is to increase the awareness of new initiatives that have been tried and found successful in shipyards through changes in technology and procedures. The ultimate objective of the project is to reduce industrial accidents and their attendant costs.

For this project to be successful, it needs the cooperation of shipyard management. The information will be treated in a confidential manner. To increase the participation and reduce the time associated with the completion of the questionnaire, the project investigator, who is E. Paul Goyette, will make site visits and help in the completion of the questionnaire.

The data will be summarized and evaluated. A report with detailed recommendations will be produced. Based upon the interest of the participants, a workshop may be established. I request your support of this project. Please have your cognizant workers' compensation representative review the attached questionnaire and contact Mr. Goyette at (619) 544-8859 to initiate the required action.
