Army Re-Look of Common Tasks



What is a “Common/Critical Task”?

Common Soldier Task: An individual task performed by all Soldiers regardless of skill level or rank. An enlisted common skill level 1 task.

Critical Task: An individual task that a Soldier must perform to accomplish their mission and duties and survive in the full range of Army operations. Critical tasks must be trained.

Occupational Analysis Common Task Background

Officers: In the early 1980's as part of the Review of Training and Education for Officers (RETO) the Army Occupational Survey Program (AOSP) included common tasks in Branch level (e.g., Infantry Officer) surveys.

Warrant Officers: In the mid-late 1980's as part of the occupational analysis done to support the Warrant Officer Training System (TWOS) effort the AOSP included a limited number of common tasks in MOS level surveys.

Enlisted: In 1998 -1999 ARI supported by the Institute for Job and Occupational Analysis conducted a large scale survey of enlisted common tasks for the U.S. Army Sergeants Major Academy.

Project Background

In January 2003, ARI anticipating the conflict with Iraq, submitted a proposal to the Army's Deputy Chief of Staff G-1 (Personnel) to measure Common Task (CT) performance in Iraq/Afghanistan.

The G-1 approved the project in April 2003 and provided initial funding in late June of that year.

The Army's Training and Doctrine Command (TRADOC) was briefed on the project in August 2003 and agreed to sponsor the project.

In December 03 TRADOC tasked the CT Executive Agents to support the work and provide officer, warrant officer and enlisted CT lists.



Army Re-Look of Common Tasks



Project Objectives

Develop comprehensive officer, warrant officer and enlisted CT lists by skill level/rank.

Construct an automated survey to collect CT data using an E-Mail distribution system and ensure sufficient samples by skill level/rank were obtained.

Include Soldiers in Iraq/Afghanistan as well as recently returned veterans of Operation Enduring Freedom/Iraqi Freedom in the data collection as well as an identifiable group in the database and reporting system.

Project Objectives (Continued)

Include the Active Army, Army National Guard and U.S. Army Reserve in the data collection process.

Ensure the data collected supports the Critical Task selection process as specified in TRADOC Regulation 350-70.

Generate basic data summary reports for the task proponents.

Provide TRADOC and the Executive Agents with a CT database coupled with automated report generation system tailored for their use.

Task Development Process

The TRADOC Executive Agents for officers (Center for Army Leadership – CAL and Army Accessions Command - AAC), warrant officers (Warrant Officer Career Center - WOCC) and enlisted Soldiers (Sergeants Major Academy – USASMA) independently developed task lists in their areas of responsibility Dec 03 – Feb 04.

Representatives from HQ TRADOC, CAL, WOCC and USASMA met at Ft Bliss, TX in late Feb 04 to review and merge (as needed) the three tasks lists – ARI was an observer and AAC was not represented.

In Feb – Apr 04 ARI and HQ TRADOC revised and organized the three task lists. In Jun 04 HQ TRADOC approved the final lists for use after coordination with CAL, WOCC and USASMA.

Task Development Results

Survey Task Lists:

Officer ---- 1113 tasks

Warrant Officer ---- 1284 tasks

Enlisted ---- 1119 tasks

Tasks organized in functions/duties (e.g., First Aid, Risk Management, Leadership).

Each task assigned a unique number that identified the source (officer, warrant officer, enlisted) and skill level/rank.



Army Re-Look of Common Tasks



Questionnaire Development

Questionnaire Development done concurrent with Task Development.

Used INTERFORM, the Raosoft, Inc automated survey software in conjunction with features from the Army's Automated Survey Generator System (AUTOGEN).

Initial goal was one survey instrument but testing with Raosoft's SurveyTaker indicated a need to sub-divide.

Separate sections for incumbent, training emphasis, task performance to standard and additional common tasks (write-in).

Employed random selection within the survey to reduce respondent "burden time".

Used authorized rank of position to branch respondents through the survey.

Extensive use of "If then show" page/text capability.

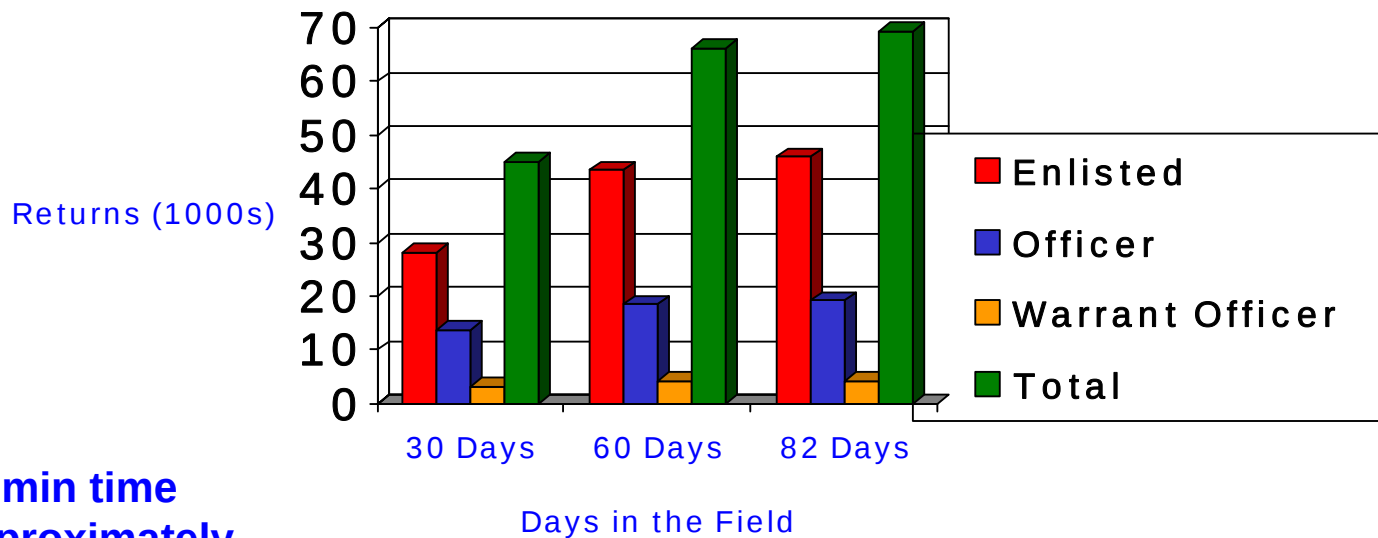


Survey Administration

Common Task Survey Useable Survey Returns



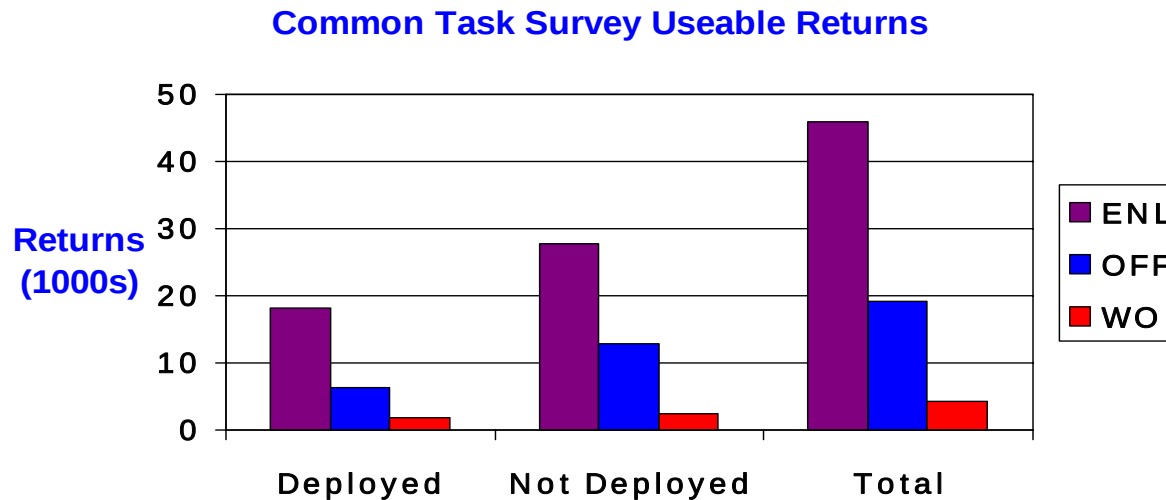

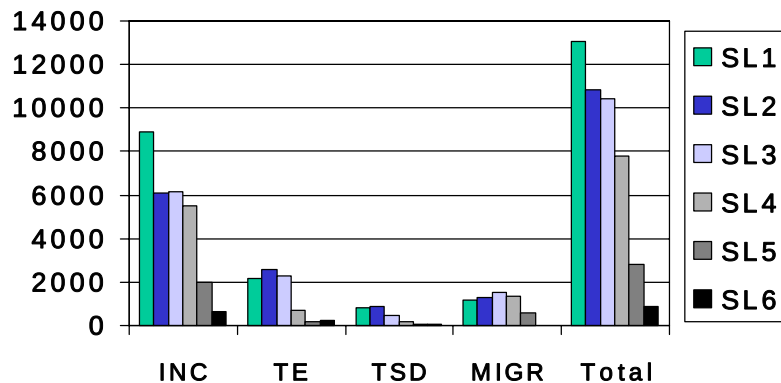

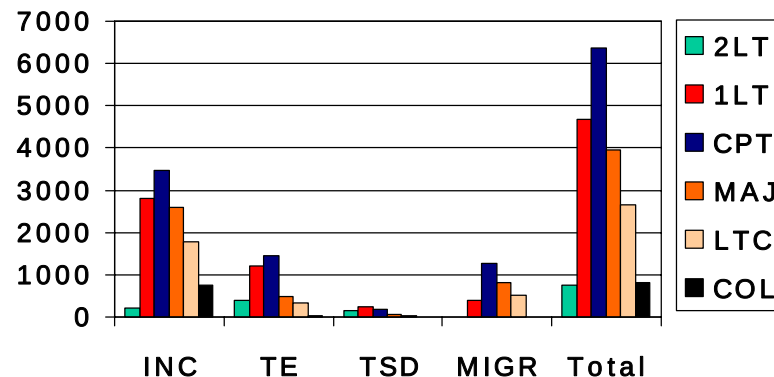


Survey Returns by Scale Type and Skill Level/Rank

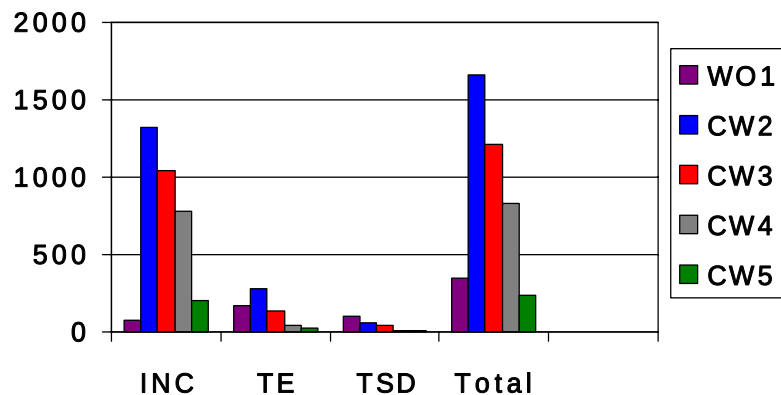

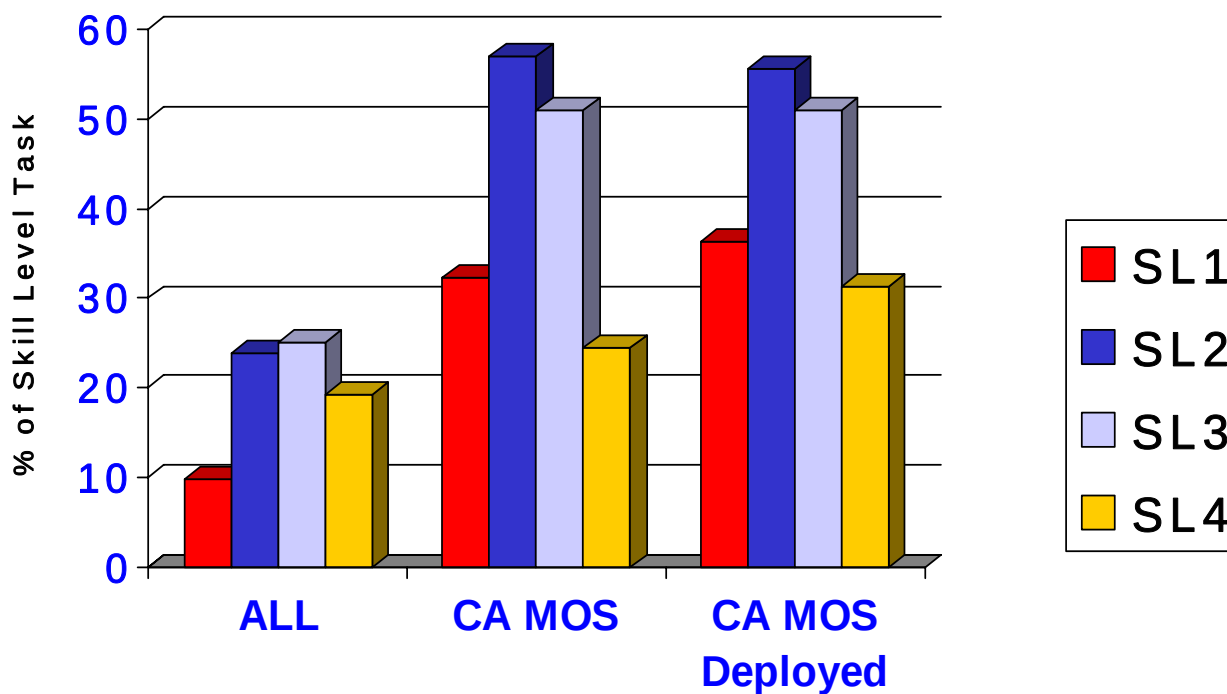

Common Task Evaluation

Summary

ARI has established Common Task databases for officer, warrant officer and enlisted tasks together with a user oriented report generation system.

Comparisons between the task performance of individuals deployed to Iraq/Afghanistan and those who have not deployed reveal significant differences in BOTH directions. These differences are even greater when controlled for Type MOS equal to Combat Arms.

Comparisons between the task Training Emphasis ratings from individuals deployed to Iraq/Afghanistan and those who have not deployed reveal some differences but are much more similar than task performance. Type MOS equal to Combat Arms contributes to greater differences in the ratings.
