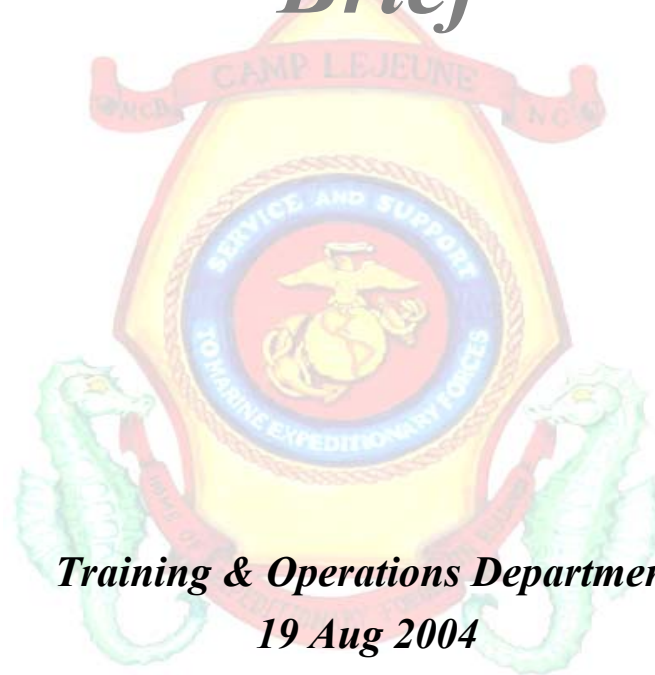

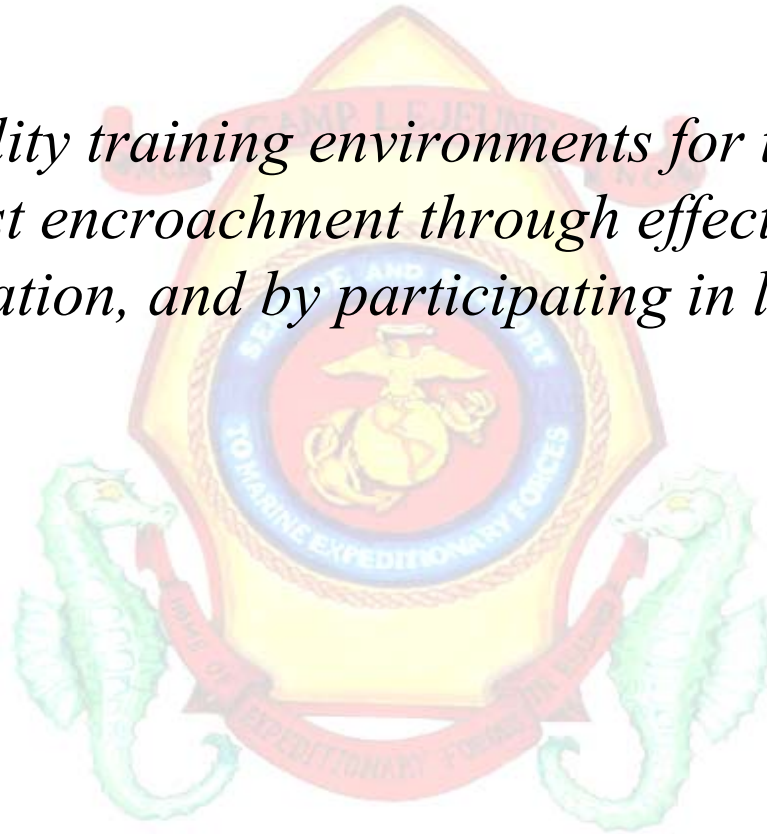
Introduction

Objective #2

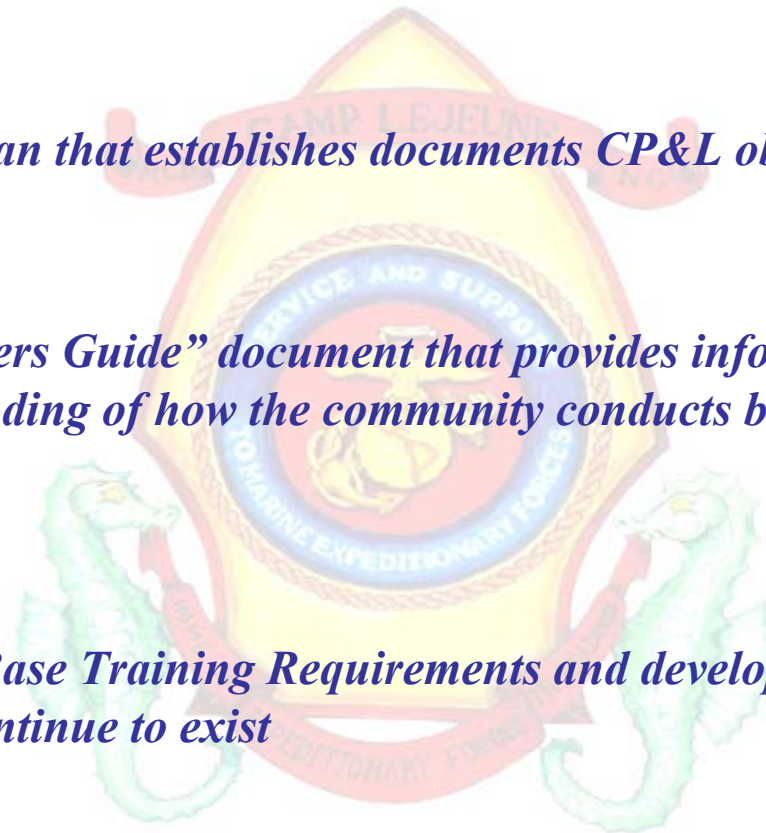
- Develop a “Commanders Guide” document that provides information key to a commanders understanding of how the community conducts business and identifies key points of contact.*

State and Regional Initiatives

- *State of North Carolina Military Affairs Committee: “Friend Of The Marine Corps” works special interest encroachment issues*
- *Senate Bill 1161: Uses of land located five miles or less from the perimeter boundary of a military base, the Board Of Commissioners shall provide written notice of proposed land use changes*
- *House Bill 1264: \$20M to acquire land near military Bases*
- *House Bill 1414: \$2M to assist Base/Stations to prepare BRAC cases*
- *Senate Bill 1058: In-State tuition for military personnel and their dependents*
- *Small Business Centers (SBCs) established near all military installations*
- *\$50-200K discussed to establish regional “All Service” CP&L capabilities*
