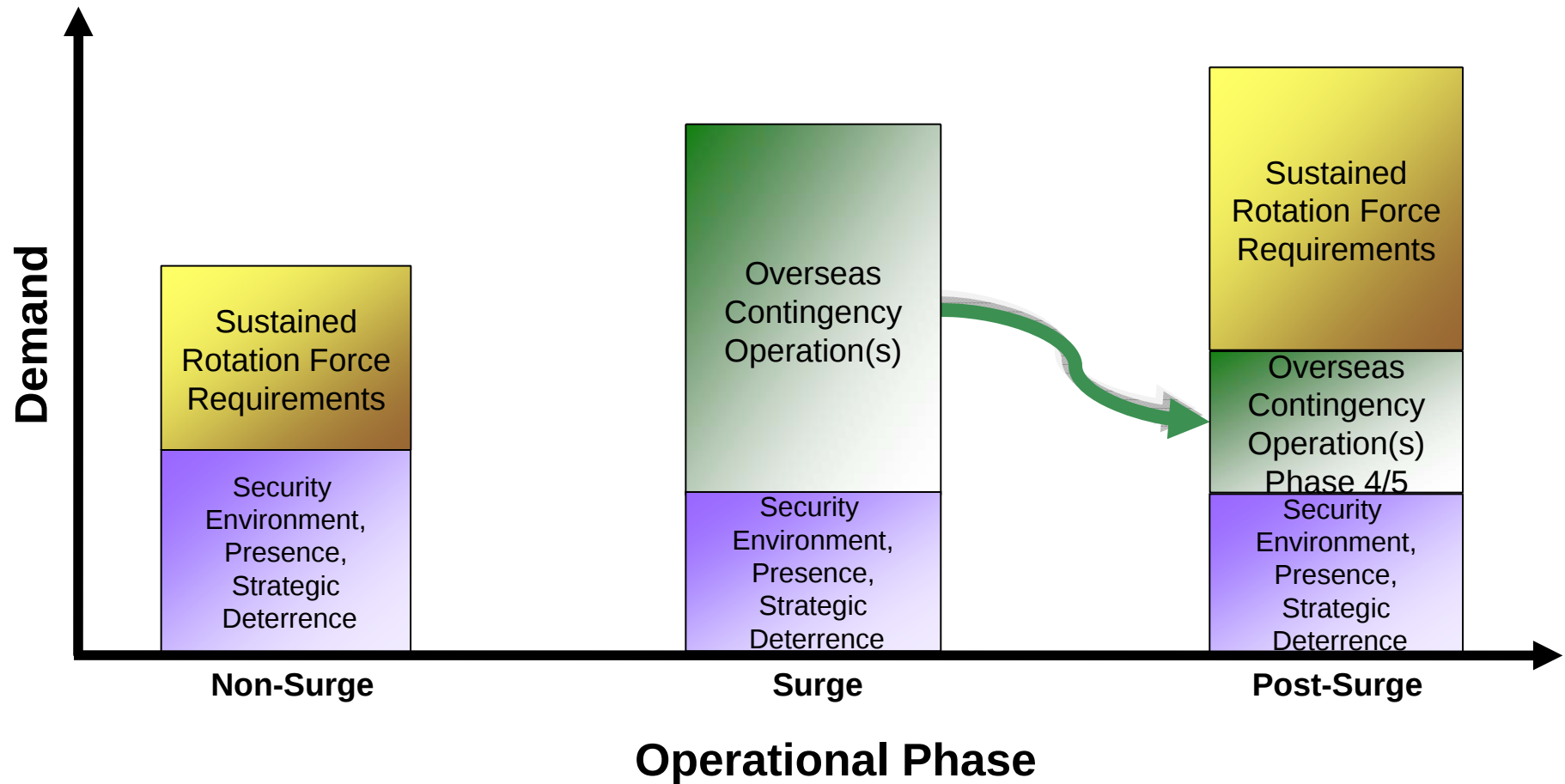

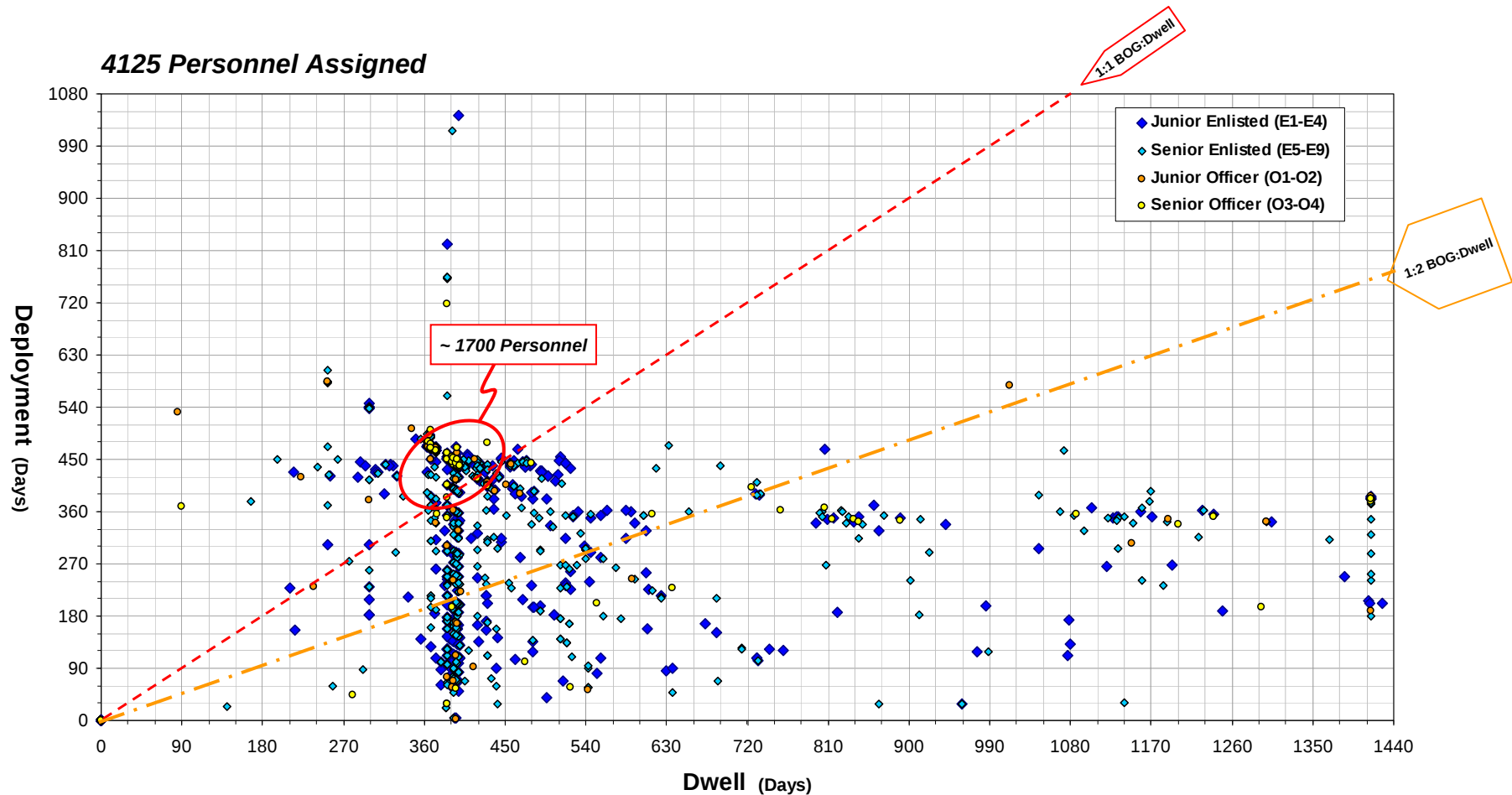

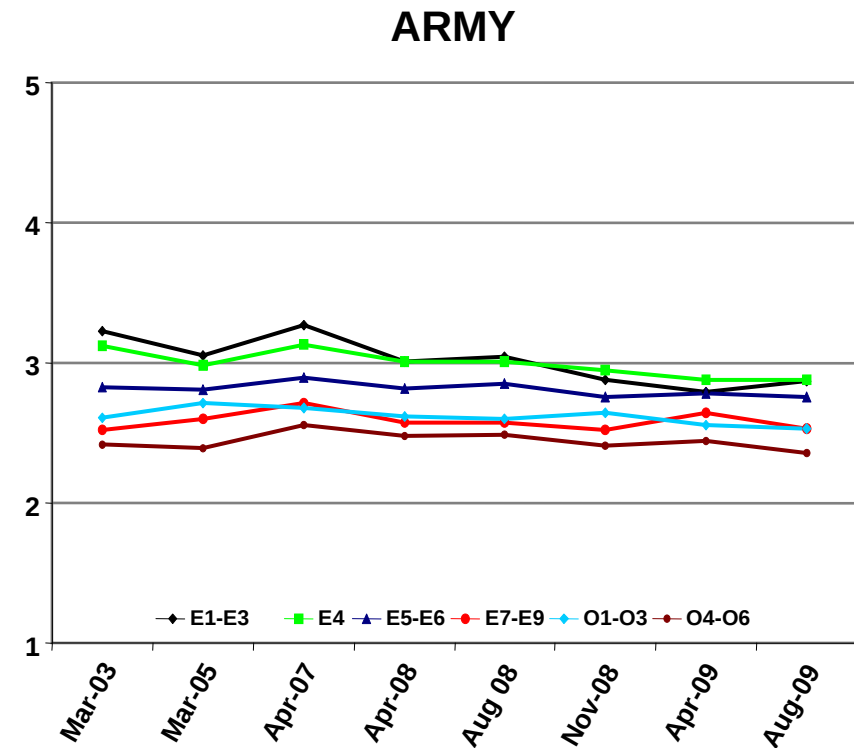
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Average of Self-Reported Stress

- In the past month, how often have you...
 - Felt nervous and stressed?
 - Felt that you were unable to control the important things in your life?
 - Been upset because of something that happened unexpectedly?
 - Been angered because of things that were outside of your control?
 - Felt difficulties were piling up so high that you could not overcome them?
 - Found that you could not cope with all the things you had to do?
- Responses range from 1 (Never) to 5 (Very Often).

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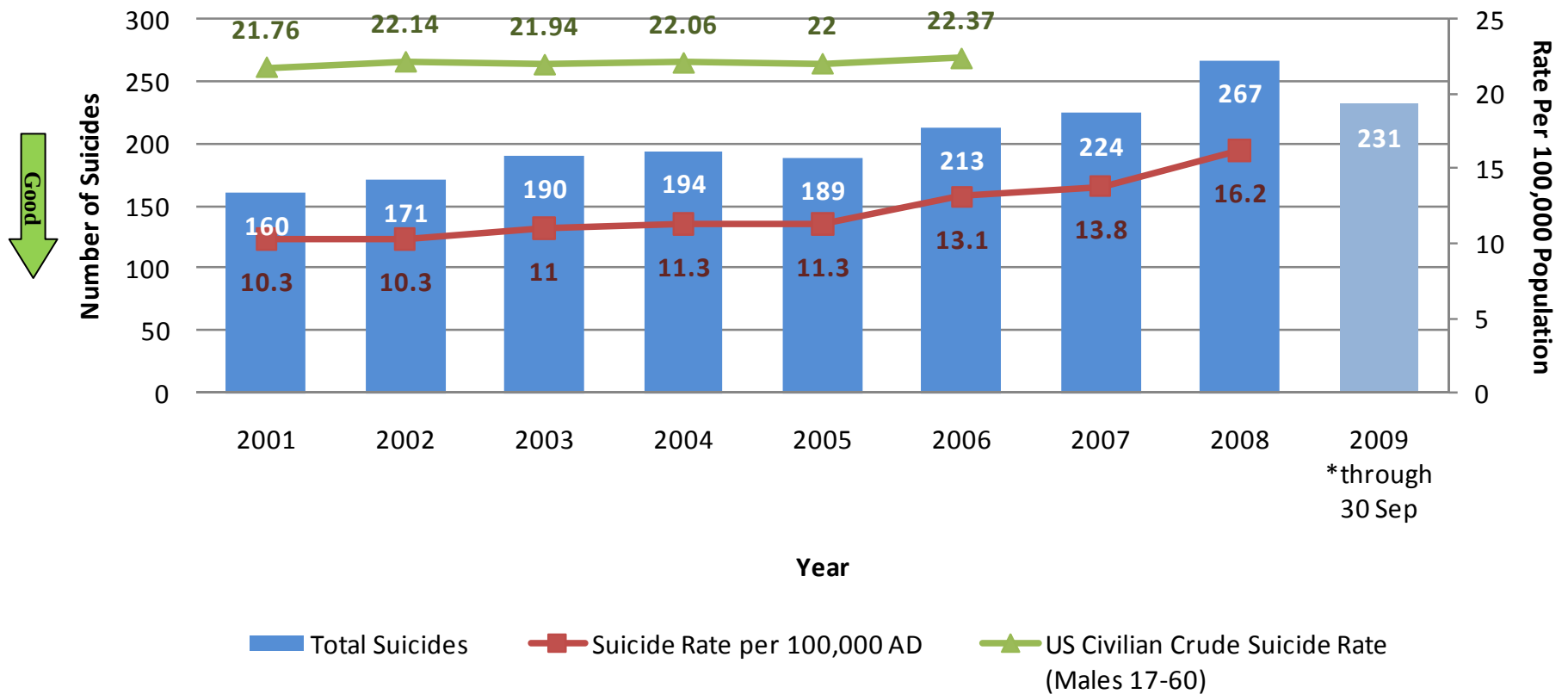
