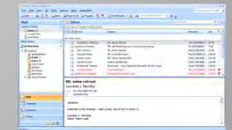

 - Programmatic/Specialized accreditation agencies have a more limited scope and only accredit specific programs or departments within a school .

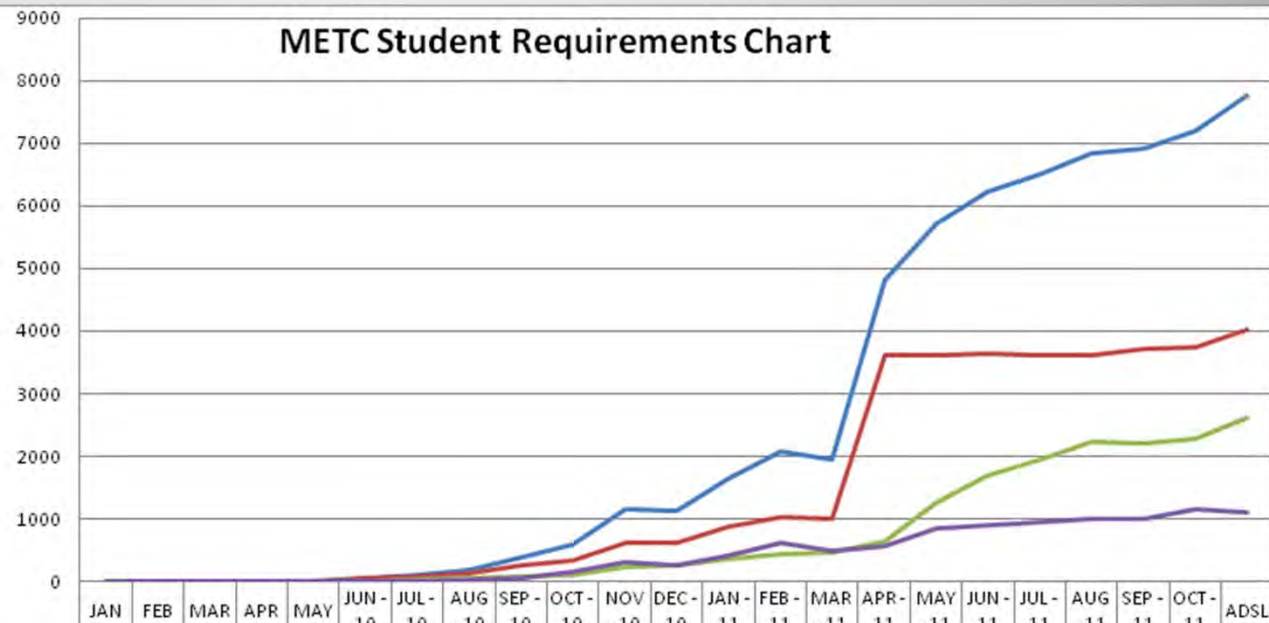

IAW Program Schedules



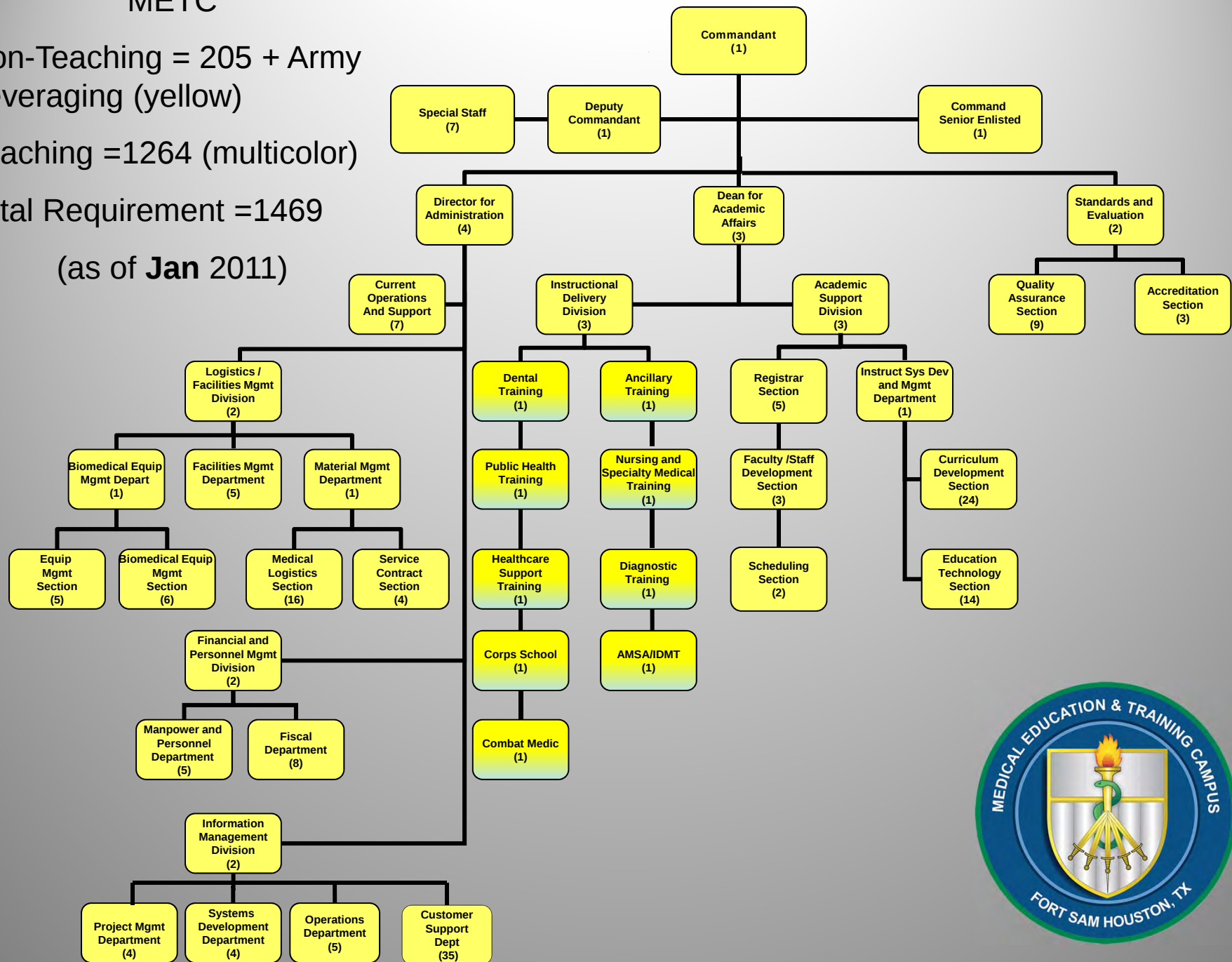
