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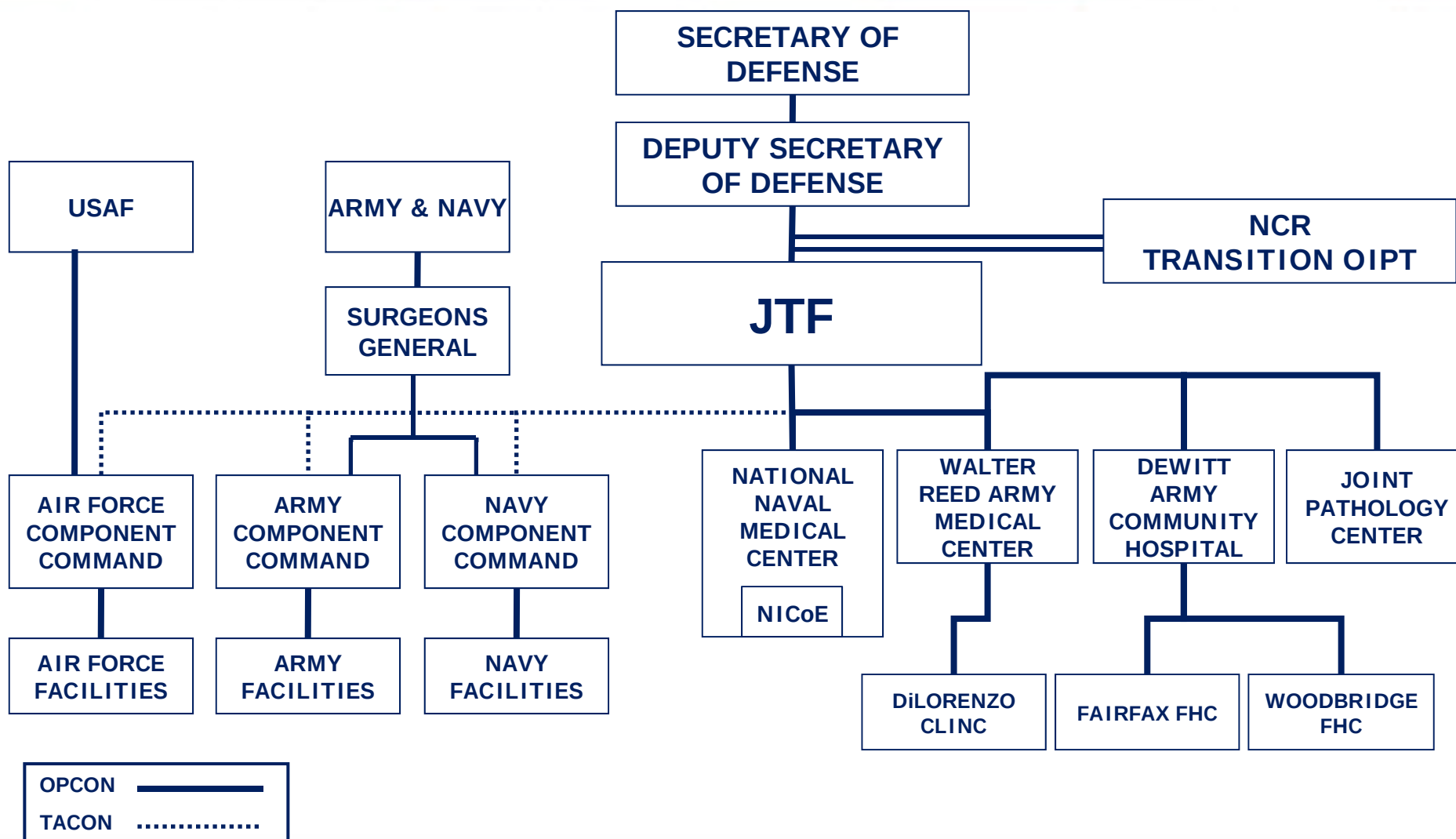
Joint Task Force National Capital Region Medical

- Commanded by a three-star medical officer
- Missions
 - Oversee execution of NCR Medical BRAC

 - Establish WRNMMC/FBCH as Joint hospitals to anchor NCR integrated delivery system
 - Oversee implementation of ~\$800M facility projects identified in the Comprehensive Master Plan

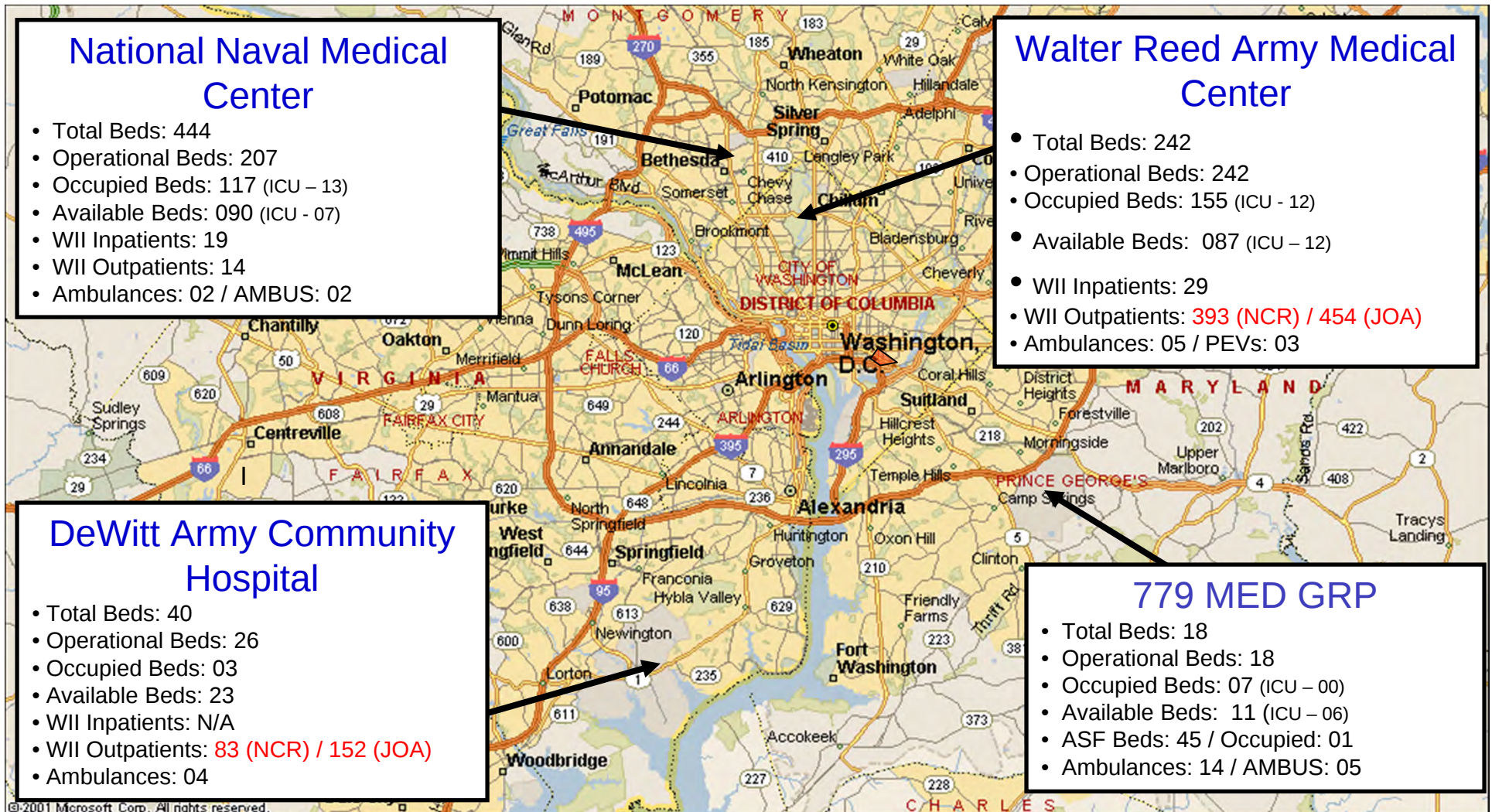

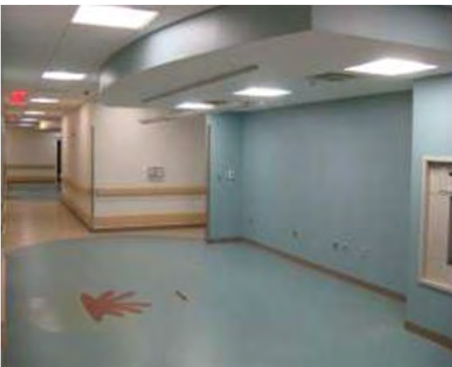

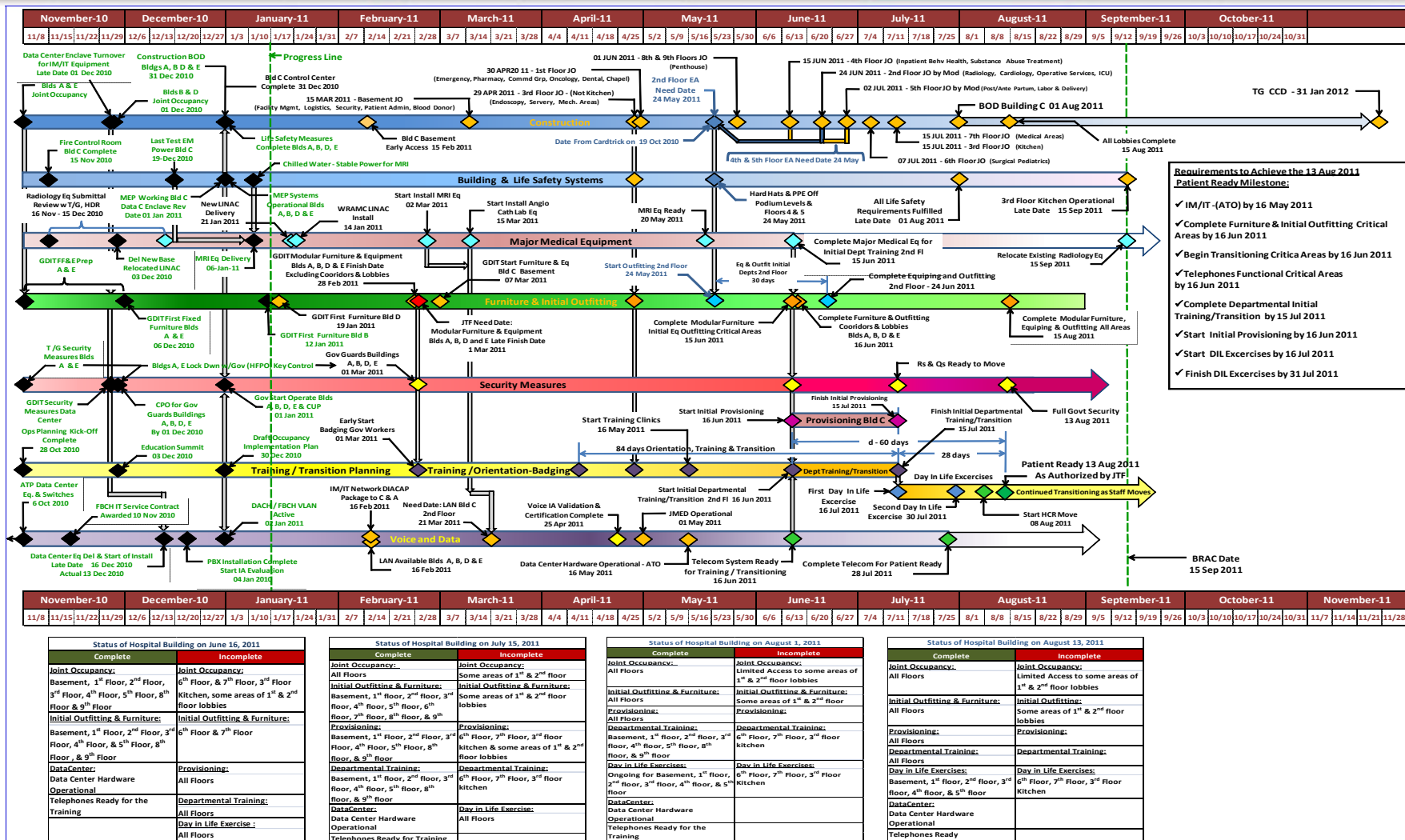


FBCH WII Lodging and Admin Complex

Fort Belvoir Community Hospital - Integrated Schedule Timeline

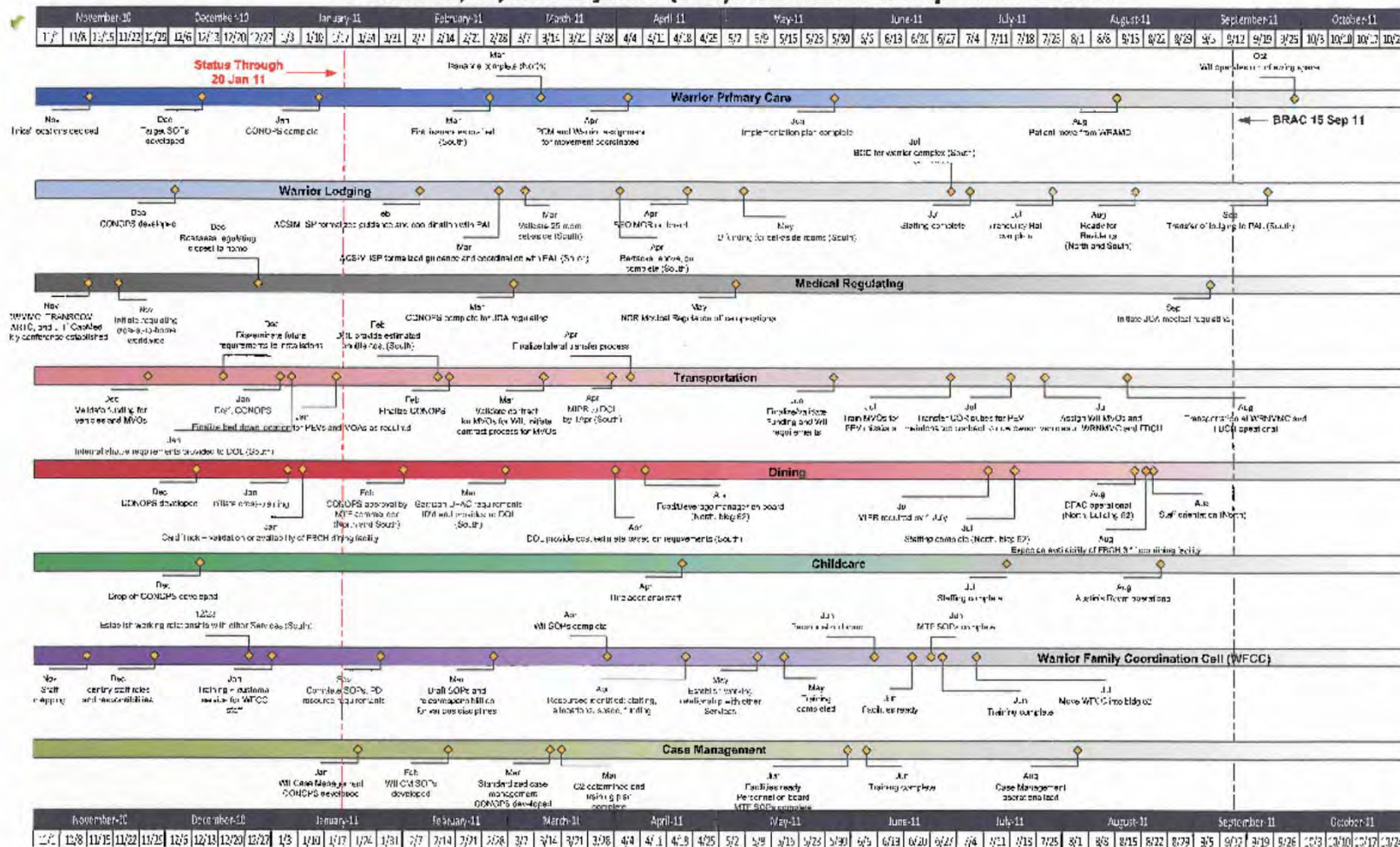

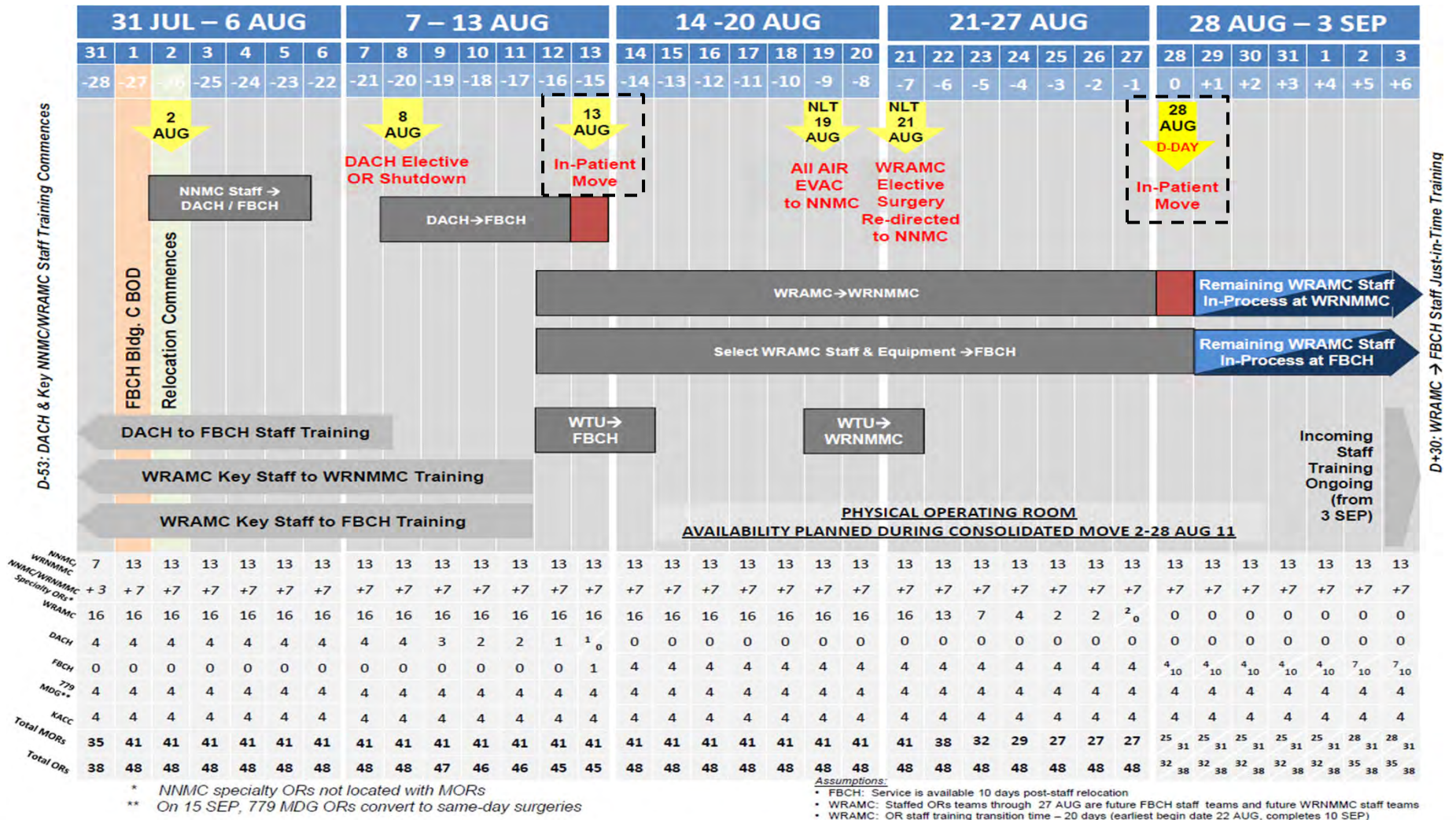


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Wounded, Ill, and Injured (WII) Milestone Completion Calendar



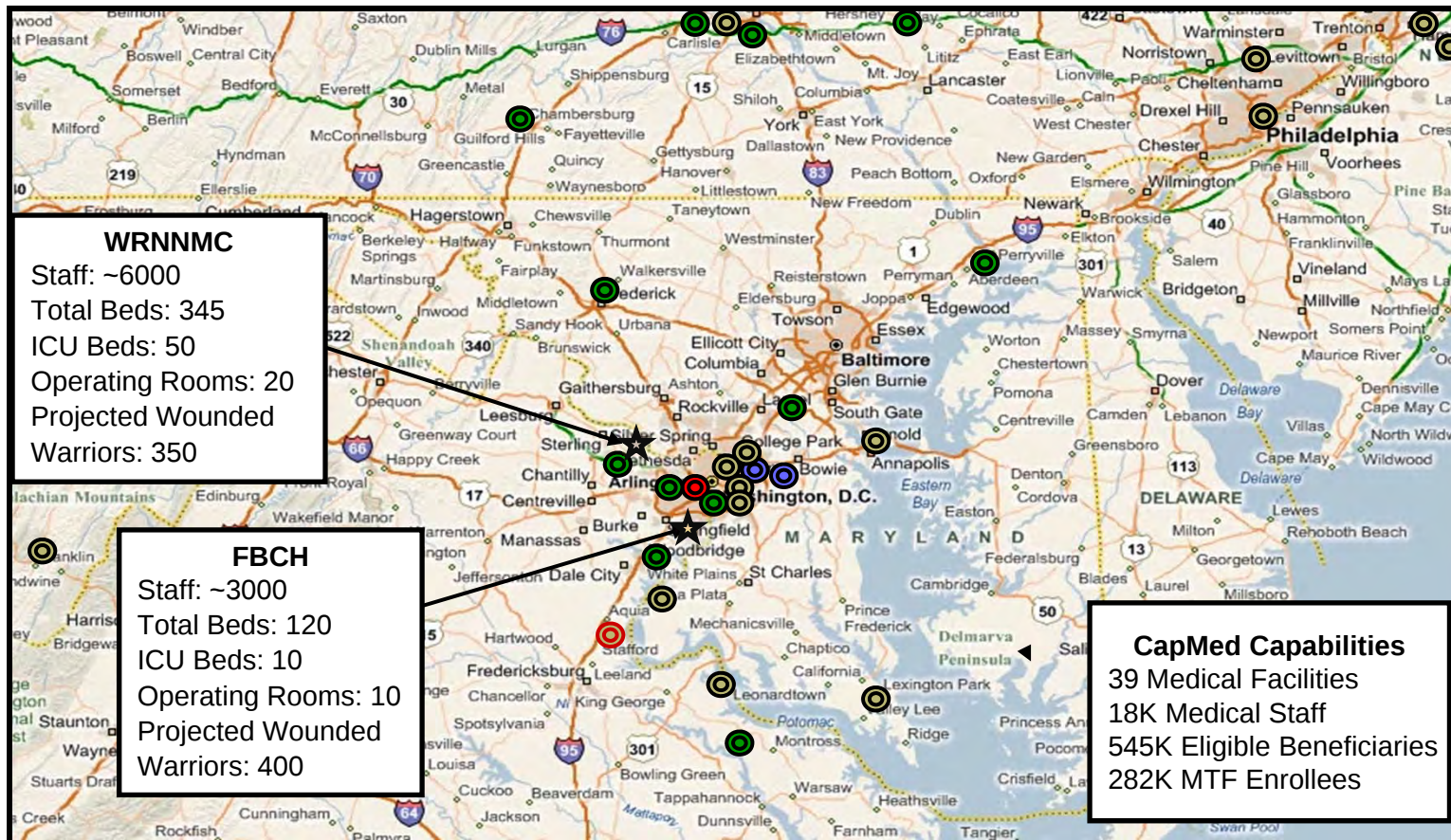
