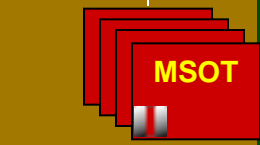
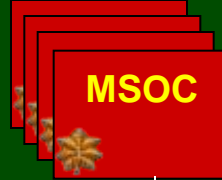

# (U)Special Operations Core Activities

## **(U)Direct Action**

To seize, destroy, capture, recover, or inflict damage on designated personnel or material

## **(U)Counterterrorism**

Antiterrorism, recovery of hostages or sensitive material , attack of terrorist infrastructure, and reduction of vulnerability to terrorism

## **(U)Unconventional Warfare**

Paramilitary operations conducted by indigenous or surrogate forces

## **(U)Special Reconnaissance**

Gathering activities of strategic or operational significance

## **(U)Information and Psychological Operations**

Involves actions to affect adversary information and information systems

## **(U)Counter proliferation of Weapons of Mass Destruction**

Seize, destroy, render, safe, capture, or recover weapons of mass destruction

## **(U)Civil Affairs Operations**

Enhance the relationship between military forces and civil authorities in localities where military forces are present

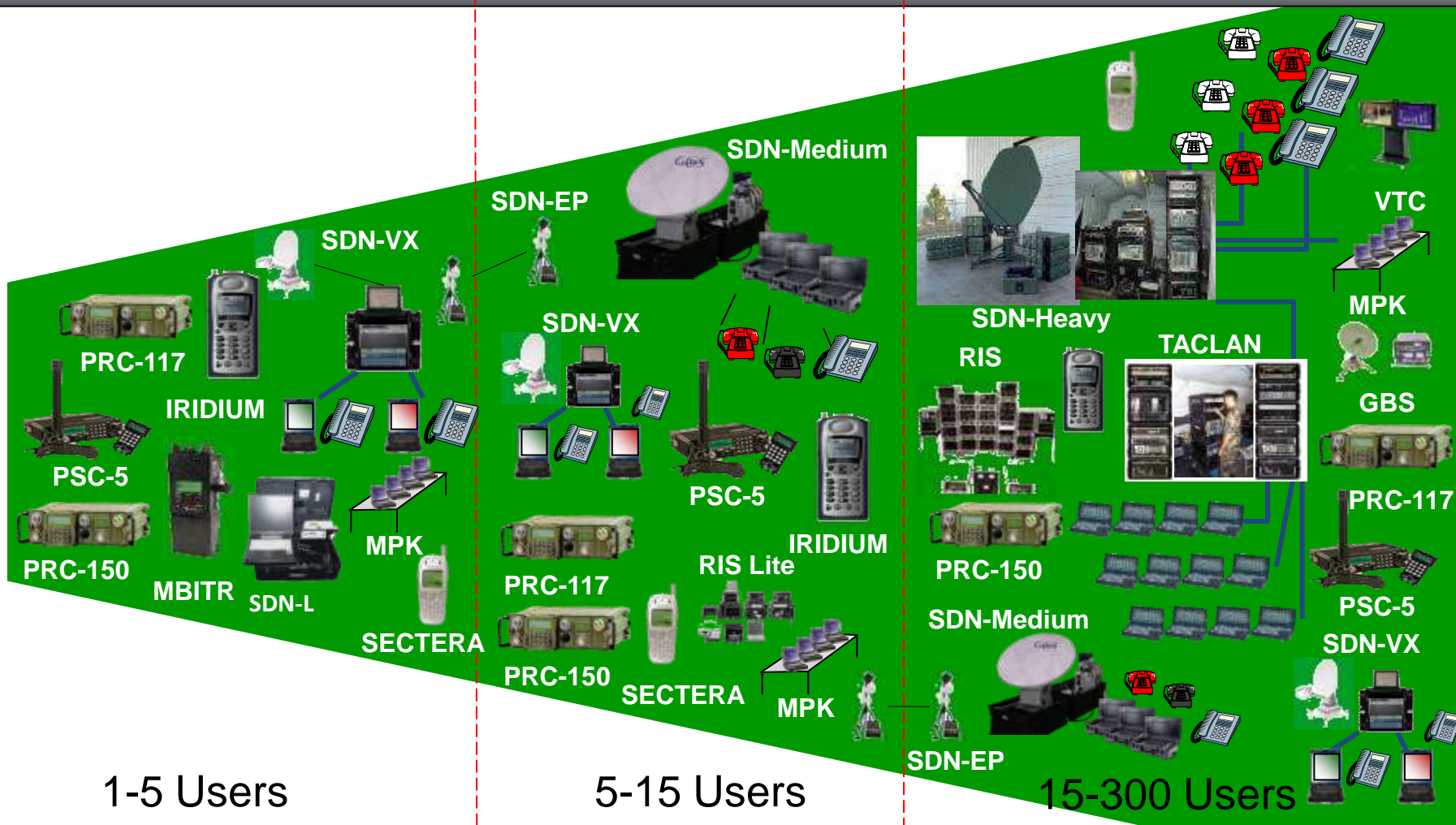
