REDESIGNATION OF THE UNITED STATES ARMY TRAINING AND DOCTRINE COMMAND FUTURES CENTER AS THE ARMY CAPABILITIES INTEGRATION CENTER

1. Effective 15 February 2006, the United States Army Training and Doctrine Command's (TRADOC) Futures Center, to include all missions, functions, personnel, equipment, and resources, is redesignated as the Army Capabilities Integration Center (ARCIC). The ARCIC supports the Commanding General, TRADOC in the design, development, and integration of force capability requirements for the Army. The ARCIC uses wargaming, experimentation, and concepts to develop and integrate capability requirements from a comprehensive perspective of doctrine, organization, training, materiel, leadership and education, personnel, and facilities (DOTMLPF).

2. The ARCIC is responsible to the Secretary of the Army and Chief of Staff, Army for determining and integrating force requirements and the development of DOTMLPF solutions across the Army. The ARCIC provides analytical support for key Army needs, and the development and validation of integrated operational architectures depicting Warfighting capabilities.

3. The ARCIC will be the lead Army agency for coordination with Joint agencies and Services for identification and integration of joint required capabilities. This responsibility includes joint wargaming, concept development, and experimentation.

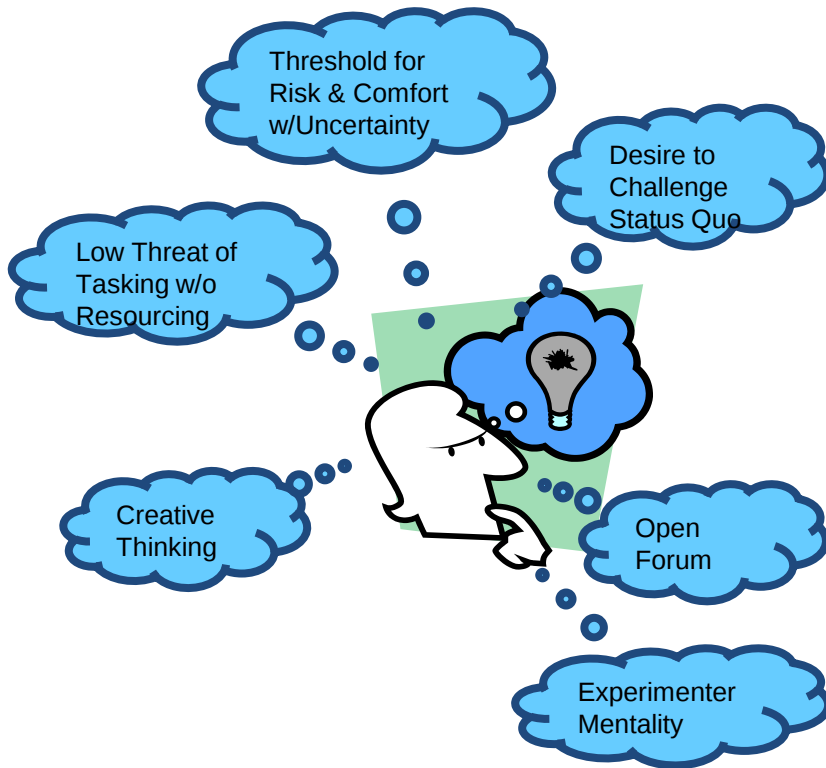
4. Additionally, the Director, ARCIC has integration coordination authority across the Army in matters pertaining to identification of required capabilities and DOTMLPF integration. The scope of responsibilities includes current developments in support of the Global War on Terrorism and the full range of developments and transformational efforts in support of the future combat force strategy. This strategy involves the continual evolution of the Current Modular Force into the Future Modular Force through the insertion of capabilities from the Future Combat Systems Program.

*This General Order supersedes Department of the Army General Order 2003-10, dated 4 November 2003.

2. The ARCIC is responsible to the Secretary of the Army and Chief of Staff, Army for **determining and integrating force requirements** and **synchronizing** the development of Doctrine, Organization, Training, Materiel, Leadership & Education, Personnel, and Facilities (DOTMLPF) solutions across the Army. The ARCIC provides the management structure for **identifying capability gaps** and **directing analytical support** of DOTMLPF developments. This includes **validation of research and development priorities** for key Army science and technology needs, and the development and validation of integrated operational architectures depicting Warfighting capabilities.

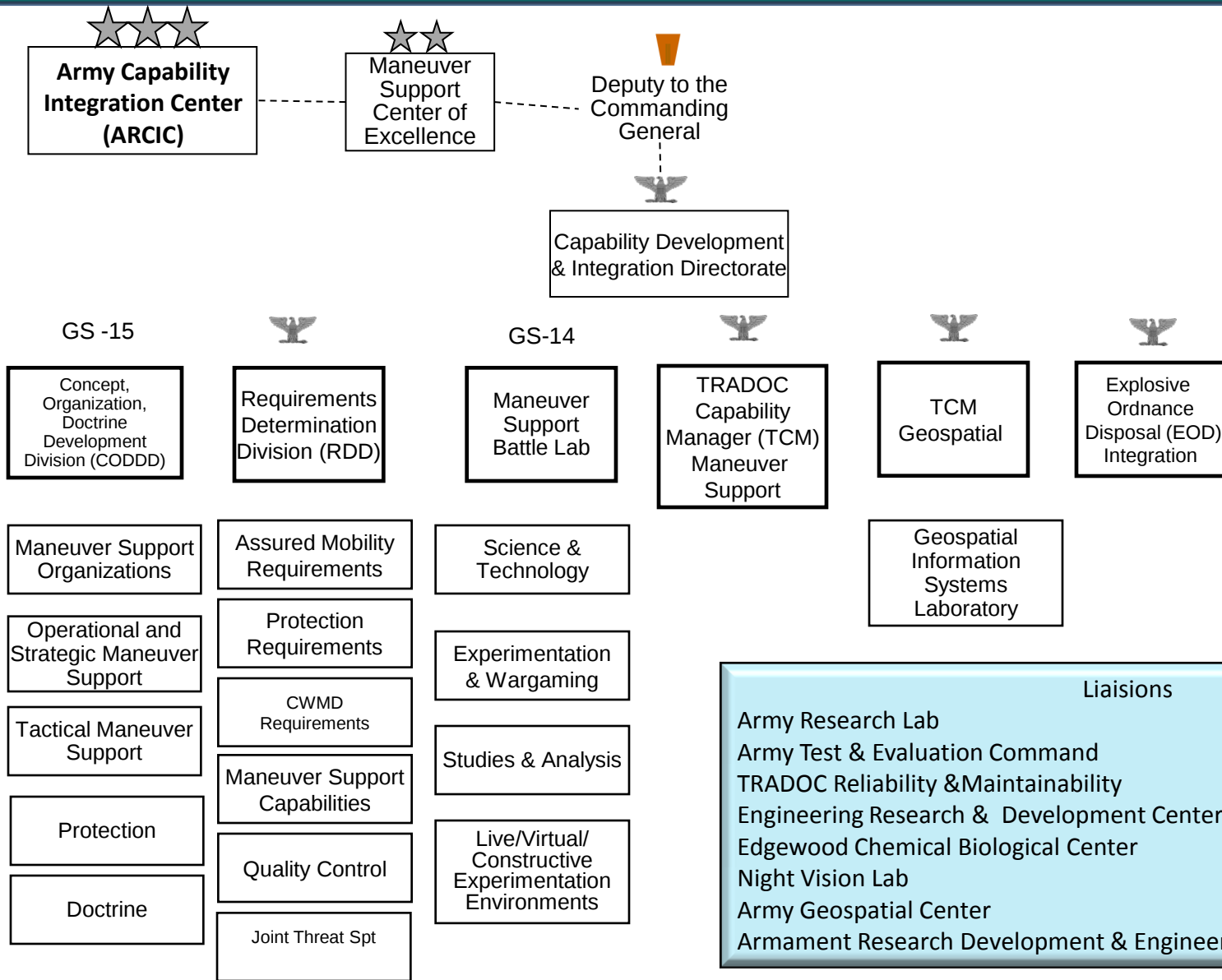

Force Modernization Proponent. Per AR 5-22 will:

- (1) Execute force management responsibilities (requirements definition, force development, combat developments, doctrine developments, training developments, materiel developments, leadership development, and education, personnel developments, and facilities developments) relative to DOTMLPF for their particular function or branch.
- (2) Ensure DOTMLPF actions are coordinated with ACOMs, ASCCs, DRUs, FOAs, the HQDA staff, and others, as required

CDID Operational Challenge



“Force Modernization Activities” four key distinct *SYSTEMS* with interdependent process relationships

1. **Joint Capabilities Integration and Development System (JCIDS)**
2. Army Science & Technology (AS&T)
3. Defense Acquisition System (DAS)
4. Planning, Programming, Budgeting & Execution System (PPBES)

Four processes that focus on *programs/systems*, intersect infrequently, operate on their own calendars, and do not report to or fall under an overarching “system”
